A BILL

- To preserve the Arctic coastal plain of the Arctic National Wildlife Refuge, Alaska, as wilderness in recognition of its extraordinary natural ecosystems and for the permanent good of present and future generations of Americans.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
 - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Udall-Eisenhower Arc-
 - 5 tic Wilderness Act".

1 SEC. 2. DESIGNATION OF ADDITIONAL WILDERNESS, ARC-

- 2 TIC NATIONAL WILDLIFE REFUGE, ALASKA.
- 3 (a) Designation.—Notwithstanding any other pro-
- 4 vision of law, a portion of the Arctic National Wildlife Ref-
- 5 uge in Alaska comprising approximately 1,559,538 acres,
- 6 as generally depicted on the map entitled "Arctic National
- 7 Wildlife Refuge, Coastal Plain Proposed Wilderness",
- 8 dated October 20, 2015, labeled with Map ID 03-0172,
- 9 and available for inspection in the offices of the Secretary
- 10 of the Interior, is designated as a component of the Na-
- 11 tional Wilderness Preservation System under the Wilder-
- 12 ness Act (16 U.S.C. 1131 et seg.).
- 13 (b) Administration.—The Secretary of the Interior
- 14 shall administer the area designated as wilderness by sub-
- 15 section (a) in accordance with the Wilderness Act as part
- 16 of the wilderness area already in existence within the Arc-
- 17 tic National Wildlife Refuge as of the date of the enact-
- 18 ment of this Act.
