A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1 To Chapter 7 of Title 45 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to salaries and 2 fees, so as to change provisions relating to the salary for the Governor; to change provisions 3 relating to the State Commission on Compensation; to provide for related matters; to provide 4 for effective dates; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA: 5 6 PART I 7 **SECTION 1-1.** 8 Chapter 7 of Title 45 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to salaries and fees, 9 is amended by revising paragraph (1) of subsection (a) of Code Section 45-7-4, relating to 10 annual salaries of certain state officials and cost-of-living adjustments, as follows: 11 175,000.00 12 An allowance in an amount specified in the appropriations Act shall also be 13 provided for the operation of the Governor's mansion." 14 PART II SECTION 2-1. 15 16 Said chapter is further amended by revising Article 5, relating to the State Commission on 17 Compensation, as follows: "ARTICLE 5. 18 45-7-90. 19

A State Commission on Compensation is established for the purpose of assisting the

General Assembly in setting the compensation of constitutional state officers, including

members of the General Assembly and full-time heads of state agencies, authorities,

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boards, bureaus, commissions, committees, and departments whose compensation is set by

- the Constitution, by law, or by Act of the General Assembly.

- 26 (a) As used in this article, the term 'commission' means the State Commission on
- 27 <u>Compensation.'</u>
- 28 (b) The commission shall be composed of 12 seven members who shall serve for terms of
- 29 four years and until their successors shall have been appointed and qualified. No person
- shall be qualified for appointment to office as a member of the commission if he <u>or she</u> is
- an officer or employee of the state at the time of his <u>or her</u> selection for appointment <u>nor</u>
- 32 <u>shall such officer's or employee's spouse, child, stepchild, parent, stepparent, grandparent,</u>
- grandchild, sibling, or the spouse of such individuals be qualified for such appointment.
- Four Three members shall be appointed by the Governor, at least one of whom shall be
- regularly engaged in the field of business finance or business management. Two members
- 36 shall be appointed by the Lieutenant Governor, at least one of whom shall be experienced
- 37 in labor-management relations. Two members shall be appointed by the Speaker of the
- House of Representatives, at least one of whom shall be experienced in labor-management
- 39 relations. Four members shall be appointed by the Justices of the Supreme Court, at least
- 40 one of whom shall be authorized to practice law in this state.
- 41 (c) Should any vacancy on the commission occur from death, resignation, or otherwise,
- 42 the appointing authority shall appoint a successor member to serve during the unexpired

- 45 Members of the commission shall take an oath to uphold the Constitution and laws of the
- 46 United States and of the State of Georgia and shall receive a salary of \$59.00 per day for
- 47 each day of service and such expenses and allowances while performing their duties of
- 48 office as are refundable to state employees a daily expense allowance and reimbursement
- 49 <u>for transportation costs as provided for in Code Section 45-7-21</u>. All expenses incurred by
- 50 the commission in the performance of its duties shall be paid from funds available to the
- General Assembly. The commission shall meet no more than 30 days during the year it is
- 52 established and no more than 15 days in any year thereafter.

- The commission shall meet immediately after a majority of its members have taken the
- oath of office, shall select from the members one of their number members to serve as
- 56 chairman chairperson, and shall adopt such rules and procedures as may be deemed

necessary for the expeditious accomplishment of the obligations of the commission. The commission shall be authorized to employ staff personnel as necessary to accomplish commission objectives.

- The commission shall make a study of the compensation currently being paid by the state 61 to all constitutional state officers, including members of the General Assembly and all 62 63 full-time heads of state agencies, authorities, boards, bureaus, commissions, committees, 64 and departments whose compensation is set by the Constitution of Georgia, by law, or by an Act of the General Assembly; and the commission shall compare such compensation 65 with that currently being received by officers and employees serving in comparable 66 positions with the federal government, this state, other states, local governments, and in 67 industry, business, and the professions. In making this comparative study, the commission 68 69 shall utilize all available data pertaining to prevailing market rates and relating to the costs 70 and standards of living of persons in comparable positions.

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- 72 (a) The commission shall file a written report based upon its studies in which a 73 recommended compensation shall be stated for each constitutional state officer, including 74 members of the General Assembly and all full-time heads of state agencies, authorities, 75 boards, bureaus, commissions, committees, and departments whose compensation is set by 76 the Constitution of Georgia, by law, or by Act of the General Assembly. A copy of said such report shall be filed with the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Speaker of the House 77 78 of Representatives, Clerk of the House of Representatives, Secretary of the Senate, and 79 legislative counsel, Chief Justice of the Supreme Court, and Chief Judge of the Court of 80 Appeals. The commission shall file the written report at least 30 90 days prior to the 81 convening of the General Assembly in regular session at which the general appropriations 82 bill is first considered. The written report of the commission shall be filed, notwithstanding 83 a determination by the commission that no compensation increase or decrease is 84 recommended. 85 (b) Whenever a written report of the commission's compensation plan is filed, a bill shall
 - be prepared suitable for introduction in either the Senate or House of Representatives containing the compensation recommended by the commission; and such bill shall be introduced at the next session of the General Assembly convening after the filing of said written report. Such bill and the compensation contained therein, in order to become effective, shall receive the same number of readings and go through and be subject to the same procedure as required by the Constitution of Georgia for any other bill; provided,

92	however, that the bill relative to the commission's compensation plan, whether introduced
93	in the House or the Senate, or both, shall be automatically engrossed by both the House and
94	the Senate, and any such bill shall not be changed in either the House or the Senate after
95	its introduction.

97	It is the intention of the General Assembly that this article shall not be construed so as to
98	authorize the commission to reduce the compensation of constitutional state officers below
99	that established by the Constitution of Georgia or so as to deprive the General Assembly
100	of plenary power to enact laws affecting compensation in accordance with the Constitution
101	of Georgia."

103	SECTION 3-1.
104	Part I of this Act shall become effective on January 1, 2019. Part II of this Act shall become
105	effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law without such approval.
106	SECTION 3-2.
107	All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
