Making supplemental appropriations for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2019, and for other purposes.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

That the following sums are hereby appropriated, out of
 any money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated,
 and out of applicable corporate or other revenues, receipts,
 and funds, for the several departments, agencies, corpora tions, and other organizational units of Government for
 fiscal year 2019, and for other purposes, namely:

7 TITLE I 8 DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE 9 AGRICULTURAL PROGRAMS

10 PROCESSING, RESEARCH AND MARKETING

11 OFFICE OF THE SECRETARY

12 For an additional amount for the "Office of the Sec-13 retary", \$1,105,442,000 (increased by \$1,900,000,000), which shall remain available until December 31, 2020, for 14 15 necessary expenses related to losses of crops (including 16 milk and harvested adulterated wine grapes), trees, 17 bushes, and vines, as a consequence of Hurricanes Michael 18 or Florence, other hurricanes, typhoons, volcanic activity, 19 or wildfires occurring in calendar year 2018 under such 20 terms and conditions as determined by the Secretary: Pro-21 *vided*, That the Secretary may provide assistance for such 22 losses in the form of block grants to eligible states and 23 territories and such assistance may include compensation 24 to producers, as determined by the Secretary, for past or 25 future crop insurance premiums, forest restoration, and

poultry and livestock losses: *Provided further*, That of the 1 2 amounts provided under this heading, tree assistance pay-3 ments may be made under section 1501(e) of the Agricul-4 tural Act of 2014 (7 U.S.C. 9081(e)) to eligible orchard-5 ists or nursery tree growers (as defined in such section) of pecan trees with a tree mortality rate that exceeds 7.5 6 7 percent (adjusted for normal mortality) and is less than 8 15 percent (adjusted for normal mortality), to be available 9 until expended, for losses incurred during the period be-10 ginning January 1, 2018, and ending December 31, 2018: *Provided further*, That in the case of producers impacted 11 12 by volcanic activity that resulted in the loss of crop land, 13 or access to crop land, the Secretary shall consider all measures available, as appropriate, to bring replacement 14 15 land into production: *Provided further*, That the total amount of payments received under this heading and ap-16 17 plicable policies of crop insurance under the Federal Crop Insurance Act (7 U.S.C. 1501 et seq.) or the Noninsured 18 Crop Disaster Assistance Program (NAP) under section 19 20 196 of the Federal Agriculture Improvement and Reform 21 Act of 1996 (7 U.S.C. 7333) shall not exceed 90 percent 22 of the loss as determined by the Secretary: Provided fur-23 ther, That the total amount of payments received under 24 this heading for producers who did not obtain a policy or 25 plan of insurance for an insurable commodity for the ap-

plicable crop year under the Federal Crop Insurance Act 1 2 (7 U.S.C. 1501 et seq.) for the crop incurring the losses 3 or did not file the required paperwork and pay the service 4 fee by the applicable State filing deadline for a noninsur-5 able commodity for the applicable crop year under NAP for the crop incurring the losses shall not exceed 70 per-6 7 cent of the loss as determined by the Secretary: Provided 8 *further*, That producers receiving payments under this 9 heading, as determined by the Secretary, shall be required 10 to purchase crop insurance where crop insurance is available for the next two available crop years, excluding tree 11 insurance policies, and producers receiving payments 12 13 under this heading shall be required to purchase coverage under NAP where crop insurance is not available in the 14 15 next two available crop years, as determined by the Secretary: *Provided further*, That, not later than 120 days 16 after the end of fiscal year 2019, the Secretary shall sub-17 18 mit a report to the Congress specifying the type, amount, 19 and method of such assistance by state and territory: Pro-20 *vided further*, That such amount is designated by the Con-21 gress as being for an emergency requirement pursuant to 22 section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985. 23

FARM SERVICE AGENCY

2 EMERGENCY FOREST RESTORATION PROGRAM

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3 For an additional amount for the "Emergency Forest 4 Restoration Program", for necessary expenses related to 5 the consequences of Hurricanes Michael and Florence and wildfires occurring in calendar year 2018, and other nat-6 7 ural disasters, \$480,000,000, to remain available until ex-8 pended: *Provided*, That such amount is designated by the 9 Congress as being for an emergency requirement pursuant 10 to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985. 11

12 NATURAL RESOURCES CONSERVATION SERVICE

13 WATERSHED AND FLOOD PREVENTION OPERATIONS

14 For an additional amount for "Watershed and Flood 15 Prevention Operations", for necessary expenses for the Emergency Watershed Protection Program related to the 16 consequences of Hurricanes Michael and Florence and 17 wildfires occurring in calendar year 2018, and other nat-18 19 ural disasters, \$125,000,000, to remain available until expended: *Provided*, That such amount is designated by the 20 21 Congress as being for an emergency requirement pursuant 22 to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985. 23

RURAL DEVELOPMENT

2 RURAL COMMUNITY FACILITIES PROGRAM ACCOUNT

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3 For an additional amount for the cost of grants for 4 rural community facilities programs as authorized by sec-5 tion 306 and described in section 381E(d)(1) of the Consolidated Farm and Rural Development Act, for necessary 6 7 expenses related to the consequences of Hurricanes Mi-8 chael and Florence and wildfires occurring in calendar 9 year 2018, and other natural disasters, \$150,000,000, to 10 remain available until expended: *Provided*, That sections 11 381E-H and 381N of the Consolidated Farm and Rural Development Act are not applicable to the funds made 12 13 available under this heading: *Provided further*, That such amount is designated by the Congress as being for an 14 15 emergency requirement section pursuant to 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency 16 Deficit Control Act of 1985. 17

18 GENERAL PROVISIONS—THIS TITLE

19 SEC. 101. In addition to other amounts made avail-20 able by section 309 of Public Law 115–72, there is hereby 21 appropriated \$600,000,000 (increased by \$5,000,000) (in-22 creased by \$5,000,000) for the Secretary of Agriculture 23 to provide a grant to the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico 24 for disaster nutrition assistance in response to Presi-25 dentially declared major disasters and emergencies: *Pro*-

vided, That the funds made available to the Common-1 wealth of Puerto Rico under this section shall remain 2 3 available for obligation by the Commonwealth until Sep-4 tember 30, 2020, and shall be in addition to funds other-5 wise made available: *Provided further*, That such amount is designated by the Congress as being for an emergency 6 7 requirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the 8 Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 9 1985.

10 SEC. 102. In addition to amounts otherwise made 11 available, out of the funds made available under section 18 of Food and Nutrition Act of 2008, \$10,200,000 (in-12 creased by \$15,000,000) shall be available for the Sec-13 retary to provide a grant to the Commonwealth of the 14 15 Northern Mariana Islands for disaster nutrition assistance in response to the Presidentially declared major disasters 16 and emergencies: *Provided*, That funds made available to 17 the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands 18 under this section shall remain available for obligation by 19 the Commonwealth until September 30, 2020: Provided 20 *further*, That such amount is designated by the Congress 21 22 as being for an emergency requirement pursuant to sec-23 tion 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and Emer-24 gency Deficit Control Act of 1985.

SEC. 103. For purposes of administering title I of 1 2 subdivision 1 of division B of the Bipartisan Budget Act 3 of 2018 (Public Law 115–123), losses to agricultural pro-4 ducers resulting from hurricanes shall also include losses 5 of peach and blueberry crops in calendar year 2017 due to extreme cold: *Provided*, That the amounts provided by 6 7 this section are designated by the Congress as being for 8 an emergency requirement pursuant to section 9 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency 10 Deficit Control Act of 1985: Provided further, That amounts repurposed under this heading that were pre-11 12 viously designated by the Congress as an emergency re-13 quirement pursuant to the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985 are designated by the 14 15 Congress as an emergency requirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and Emer-16 17 gency Deficit Control Act of 1985.

18 SEC. 104. (a)(1) Except as provided in paragraph 19 (2), a person or legal entity is not eligible to receive a 20 payment under the Market Facilitation Program estab-21 lished pursuant to the Commodity Credit Corporation 22 Charter Act (15 U.S.C. 714 et seq.) if the average ad-23 justed gross income of such person or legal entity is great-24 er than \$900,000. (2) Paragraph (1) shall not apply to a person or legal
 entity if at least 75 percent of the adjusted gross income
 of such person or legal entity is derived from farming,
 ranching, or forestry related activities.

5 (b) A person or legal entity may not receive a pay6 ment under the Market Facilitation Program described in
7 subsection (a)(1), directly or indirectly, of more than
8 \$125,000.

9 (c) In this section, the term "average adjusted gross 10 income" has the meaning given the term defined in section 11 760.1502 of title 7 Code of Federal Regulations (as in 12 effect July 18, 2018).

(d) The amount provided by this section is designated
by the Congress as being for an emergency requirement
pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985.

4 For an additional amount for "Procurement, Acquisition and Construction", \$25,000,000, to remain available 5 until September 30, 2021, for improvements to oper-6 7 ational and research weather supercomputing infrastruc-8 ture and satellite ground services used for hurricane inten-9 sity and track prediction; flood prediction, forecasting, and 10 mitigation; and wildfire prediction, detection, and forecasting: *Provided*, That such amount is designated by the 11 12 Congress as being for an emergency requirement pursuant 13 to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985: Provided further, 14 15 That the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration shall submit a spending plan to the Committees on 16 17 Appropriations of the House of Representatives and the 18 Senate within 45 days after the date of enactment of this 19 Act.

20 FISHERIES DISASTER ASSISTANCE

For an additional amount for "Fisheries Disaster Assistance" for necessary expenses associated with the mitigation of fishery disasters, \$150,000,000, to remain available until expended: *Provided*, That funds shall be used for mitigating the effects of commercial fishery failures

and fishery resource disasters declared by the Secretary 1 2 of Commerce, including those declared by the Secretary 3 to be a direct result of Hurricanes Florence and Michael 4 and Typhoons Yutu and Mangkhut: Provided further, 5 That such amount is designated by the Congress as being 6 for an emergency requirement pursuant to section 7 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency 8 Deficit Control Act of 1985.

2 For an additional amount for "Construction" for nec-3 \$715,000,000 (increased essary expenses, by 4 \$25,000,000), to remain available until expended, to con-5 struct flood and storm damage reduction, including shore protection, projects which are currently authorized or 6 7 which are authorized after the date of enactment of this 8 Act, and flood and storm damage reduction, including 9 shore protection, projects which have signed Chief's Re-10 ports as of the date of enactment of this Act or which are studied using funds provided under the heading "In-11 12 vestigations" if the Secretary determines such projects to 13 be technically feasible, economically justified, and environmentally acceptable, in States and insular areas that were 14 15 impacted by Hurricanes Florence and Michael, Typhoon Mangkhut, Super Typhoon Yutu, and Tropical Storm 16 17 Gita: *Provided*, That projects receiving funds provided in Public Law 115–123 shall not be eligible for funding pro-18 vided under this heading: *Provided further*, That for 19 20 projects receiving funding under this heading, the provi-21 sions of Section 902 of the Water Resources Act of 1986 22 shall not apply to these funds: Provided further, That the 23 completion of ongoing construction projects receiving 24 funds provided under this heading shall be at full Federal 25 expense with respect to such funds: *Provided further*, That

9 For an additional amount for "Water and Related Resources", \$15,500,000, to remain available until ex-10 pended, for fire remediation and suppression emergency 11 assistance related to wildfires in 2017 and 2018: Provided, 12 13 That such amount is designated by the Congress as being for an emergency requirement pursuant to section 14 15 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985. 16

comment, any environmental review, approval, or permit 1 2 performed by a Federal agency, and such adoption shall 3 satisfy the responsibilities of the recipient with respect to 4 such environmental review, approval or permit: *Provided* 5 *further*, That, notwithstanding section 104(g)(2) of the 6 Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 (42) U.S.C. 5304(g)(2)), the Secretary may, upon receipt of 7 8 a request for release of funds and certification, imme-9 diately approve the release of funds for an activity or 10 project assisted under this heading if the recipient has adopted an environmental review, approval or permit 11 12 under the preceding proviso or the activity or project is 13 categorically excluded from review under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (42 U.S.C. 4321 et seq.): 14 15 *Provided further*, That the Secretary shall publish via notice in the Federal Register any waiver, or alternative re-16 17 quirement, to any statute or regulation that the Secretary 18 administers pursuant to title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 no later than 5 days be-19 20 fore the effective date of such waiver or alternative re-21 quirement: Provided further, That of the amounts made 22 available under this heading, up to \$5,000,000 shall be 23 made available for capacity building and technical assist-24 ance, including assistance on contracting and procurement 25 processes, to support States, units of general local govern-

1 ment, or Indian tribes (and their subrecipients) that re-2 ceive allocations pursuant to this heading, received dis-3 aster recovery allocations under the same heading in Pub-4 lic Law 115–254, or may receive similar allocations for 5 disaster recovery in future appropriations Acts: *Provided further*, That of the amounts made available under this 6 7 heading and under the same heading in Public Law 115– 8 254, up to \$2,500,000 shall be transferred, in aggregate, 9 to "Department of Housing and Urban Development— 10 Program Office Salaries and Expenses—Community Planning and Development" for necessary costs, including in-11 formation technology costs, of administering and over-12 13 seeing the obligation and expenditure of amounts under this heading: *Provided further*. That the amount specified 14 15 in the preceding proviso shall be combined with funds appropriated under the same heading and for the same pur-16 17 pose in Public Law 115–254 and the aggregate of such 18 amounts shall be available for any of the same such purposes specified under this heading or the same heading 19 in Public Law 115–254 without limitation: Provided fur-20 21 ther, That such amount is designated by the Congress as 22 being for an emergency requirement pursuant to section 23 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency 24 Deficit Control Act of 1985.

GENERAL PROVISION—THIS TITLE

2 SEC. 1001. (a) Amounts previously made available 3 for activities authorized under title I of the Housing and 4 Community Development Act of 1974 (42 U.S.C. 5301 et 5 seq.) related to disaster relief, long-term recovery, restoration of infrastructure and housing, economic revitalization, 6 7 and mitigation in the most impacted and distressed areas 8 resulting from a major disaster, including funds provided 9 under section 145 of division C of Public Law 114–223, 10 section 192 of division C of Public Law 114–223 (as added by section 101(3) of division A of Public Law 114– 11 254), section 421 of division K of Public Law 115–31, 12 13 and any mitigation funding provided under the heading 14 "Department of Housing and Urban Development—Com-15 munity Planning and Development—Community Development Fund" of Public Law 115–123, that were allocated 16 17 in response to Hurricane Matthew, may be used interchangeably and without limitation for the same activities 18 19 in the most impacted and distressed areas related to Hur-20 ricane Florence. In addition, any funds provided under the 21 heading "Department of Housing and Urban Develop-22 ment—Community Planning and Development—Commu-23 nity Development Fund" in this Act or in division I of 24 Public Law 115–254 that are allocated in response to 25 Hurricane Florence may be used interchangeably and

1 without limitation for the same activities in the most im-2 pacted and distressed areas related to Hurricane Matthew. 3 Until HUD publishes the Federal Register Notice imple-4 menting this provision, grantees may submit for HUD ap-5 proval revised plans for the use of funds related to Hurricane Matthew that expand the eligible beneficiaries of ex-6 7 isting programs contained in such previously approved 8 plans to include those impacted by Hurricane Florence. 9 Approval of any such revised plans shall include the execu-10 tion of revised grant terms and conditions as necessary. Once the implementing Notice is published, any additional 11 12 action plan revisions shall follow the requirements contained therein. 13

14 (b) Amounts made available for administrative costs 15 for activities authorized under title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 (42 U.S.C. 5301 et 16 17 seq.) related to disaster relief, long-term recovery, restora-18 tion of infrastructure and housing, economic revitalization, 19 and mitigation in the most impacted and distressed areas 20 under this Act or any future Act, and amounts previously 21 provided under section 420 of division L of Public Law 22 114–113, section 145 of division C of Public Law 114– 23 223, section 192 of division C of Public Law 114–223 (as 24 added by section 101(3) of division A of Public Law 114– 25 254), section 421 of division K of Public Law 115–31,

and under the heading "Department of Housing and 1 2 Urban Development—Community Planning and Development—Community Development Fund" of division B of 3 4 Public Law 115–56, Public Law 115–123, and Public 5 Law 115–254, shall be available for eligible administrative costs of the grantee related to any disaster relief funding 6 7 identified in this subsection without regard to the par-8 ticular disaster appropriation from which such funds origi-9 nated.

10 (c) The additional uses pursuant to this section for 11 amounts that were previously designated by the Congress, 12 respectively, as an emergency requirement or as being for 13 disaster relief pursuant to the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act are designated by the Con-14 15 gress as being for an emergency requirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and 16 Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985 or as being for 17 18 disaster relief pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(D) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 19 20 1985.

TITLE XI

GENERAL PROVISION—THIS ACT

SEC. 1101. Each amount designated in this Act by
the Congress as being for an emergency requirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget

and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985 shall be avail able (or rescinded or transferred, if applicable) only if the
 President subsequently so designates all such amounts
 and transmits such designations to the Congress.

5 SEC. 1102. None of the funds made available by this 6 Act for the Department of Homeland Security may be 7 used for the construction or expansion of immigration de-8 tention facilities.

9 SEC. 1103. None of the funds appropriated or other-10 wise made available by this Act for the Army Corps of 11 Engineers or Department of Homeland Security may be 12 obligated or expended to plan, develop, or construct a new 13 physical barrier along the Southwest border.

14 TITLE XII—FURTHER CONTINUING15 APPROPRIATIONS

SEC. 1201. The Continuing Appropriations Act, 2019
(division C of Public Law 115–245) is further amended
by striking the date specified in section 105(3) and inserting "February 8, 2019".

1 This Act may be cited as the "Supplemental Appro-

2 priations Act, 2019".
