AN ACT

To authorize the National Science Foundation to support entrepreneurial programs for women.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2	This Act may be cited as the "Promoting Women in	
3	Entrepreneurship Act".	

- 4 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.
- 5 The Congress finds that—
- (1) women make up almost 50 percent of the
 workforce, but less than 25 percent of the workforce
 in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics
 (STEM) professions;
- 10 (2) women are less likely to focus on the STEM 11 disciplines in undergraduate and graduate study;
- 12 (3) only 26 percent of women who do attain de-13 grees in STEM fields work in STEM jobs;
- 14 (4) there is an increasing demand for individ-15 uals with STEM degrees to extend their focus be-16 yound the laboratory so they can be leaders in dis-17 covery commercialization;
- 18 (5) studies have shown that technology and 19 commercialization ventures are successful when 20 women are in top management positions; and
- (6) the National Science Foundation's mission
 includes supporting women in STEM disciplines.
- 23 SEC. 3. SUPPORTING WOMEN'S ENTREPRENEURIAL PRO-
- GRAMS.
- 25 Section 33 of the Science and Engineering Equal Op-
- 26 portunities Act (42 U.S.C. 1885a) is amended—

1	(1) by striking "and" at the end of paragraph
2	(10);
3	(2) by striking the period at the end of para-
4	graph (11) and inserting "; and; and
5	(3) by adding at the end the following new
6	paragraph:
7	"(12) encourage its entrepreneurial programs to
8	recruit and support women to extend their focus be-
9	yond the laboratory and into the commercial
10	world.".
