7	2019, Section 21-102.1), which relates to powers and duties of the Oklahoma Board of Private Vocational
8	Schools; providing for applications for sustained licenses; requiring the Board to develop and present
9	certain training, conduct certain site visits, invoice certain travel fees and require submission of
10	certain data; amending 70 O.S. 2011, Section 21-106, as amended by Section 10, Chapter 276, O.S.L. 2014
11	(70 O.S. Supp. 2019, Section 21-106), which relates to license expiration and renewal; providing criteria
12	for certain sustained license; establishing fees for review of certain catalog or catalog addendums;
13	establishing fee for certain review of certain documentation; allowing certain fee payment to be
14	applied as a credit against certain subsequent fee; establishing fees for certain training, review of
15	certain enrollment agreements and site visits; directing certain base fees to increase by certain
16	percentage in certain fiscal years; prohibiting a site fee from being charged under certain
17	circumstances; updating statutory references; and declaring an emergency.
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20	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
21	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY Section 4, Chapter 276, O.S.L.
22	2014 (70 O.S. Supp. 2019, Section 21-102.1), is amended to read as
23	follows:

The Oklahoma Board of Private Vocational 2 Schools is authorized to: 3 Appoint and fix the compensation of a director who: 1. shall employ and fix the duties and compensation of 4 a. 5 such clerical or other assistants as are reasonably necessary to effectuate the provisions of this act 6 7 Section 21-101 et seq. of this title, and may execute contracts on behalf of the Board; 8 b. 9 2. Promulgate rules to include but not be limited to the 10 implementation of minimum standards for the operation of private schools and the requirements for application of a school, seminar or 11 workshop for a license of state authorization; 12 13 Approve or disapprove: 3. applications for state authorization, 14 a. 15 b. other applications for licensing including 16 applications for sustained licenses, requests for exemption, and 17 с. d. requests for a definition exception; 18 Issue a private school license to document state 19 4. authorization or other licensing upon determination that such school 20 meets the standards fixed by the Board; 21 5. Prescribe, except as is otherwise provided by law and 22 subject to the provisions of the Administrative Procedures Act, such 23 penalties as it may deem proper for the enforcement of this act 24

Fix minimum standards through promulgation of rules for private schools, which shall include standards for: 4 5 courses of instruction and training, a. qualifications of instructors, 6 b. 7 financial stability, с. advertising practices, and 8 d. 9 refund of tuition and fees paid by students for e. 10 courses of instruction or training not completed, and shall promulgate and adopt reasonable rules and 11 12 regulations for the implementation of such minimum standards for the operation of private schools; 13 7. Where possible, to regulate degrees offered by distance 14 education, make use of the State Regents for Higher Education's 15 interstate reciprocity agreements to create a more efficient and 16 17 cost-effective means of the regulation of private schools; 8. Make use of interstate reciprocity agreements that 18 reasonably satisfy the Board's minimum standards to approve state 19 authorization or other license application, if such agreements 20 become available for other programs the Board approves for state 21 authorization or other license; 22

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9. Require an entity to repay any fees charged to the Board by
 a financial institution or the State Treasurer for a returned check
 or other failed form of payment;

10. Develop <u>and present mandatory</u> annual compliance training to
emphasize standards relating to the operation of a school and
relicensing processes, and require attendance by a representative of
each school, seminar, or workshop;

8 11. <u>Develop and present or arrange for the presentation of</u> 9 <u>optional training for schools to emphasize continuing development of</u> 10 school personnel and processes and to address emerging issues;

11 <u>12.</u> Provide all licensing forms free of charge via one or more 12 electronic means, but shall charge for the pick up or mailing of a 13 hard-copy licensing application packet to a person requesting 14 information about private school licensing requirements;

15 <u>12. 13.</u> Certify an electronic record or the printing of an electronically stored record as an original, subject to approval by the Oklahoma Archives and Records Commission and when in accordance with the record retention and destruction policy of the Board;

19 <u>14. Conduct announced or unannounced site visits to an</u> 20 <u>applicant or licensed school or seminar including joint visits with</u> 21 an accrediting organization or federal or state agency;

22 15. Invoice a travel fee to conduct site visits to an

22	SECTION 2	. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 21-106, as
23	amended by Sec	ction 10, Chapter 276, O.S.L. 2014 (70 O.S. Supp. 2019,
24	Section 21-10	6), is amended to read as follows:
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1 Section 21-106. A. A license issued pursuant to this act 2 Section 21-101 et seq. of this title shall expire annually on June 3 Such license shall be renewed annually with the complete 30. renewal application and any and all appropriate fees due prior to 4 5 expiration annually on or before June 1 of each year. Licenses shall be renewed by the Oklahoma Board of Private Vocational Schools 6 if the Board determines that such school remains in compliance with 7 the standards or other requirements set by the Board. The license 8 9 of any school licensed by the Board to provide postsecondary 10 education or other limited offering may be revoked if the school is found to be in violation of the Oklahoma Statutes, the minimum 11 12 standards established by the Board, or if an accreditation organization or other governmental entity's approval, material to 13 the continuity of the school, is revoked. 14

B. <u>If a school is accredited by an accrediting organization</u>
<u>approved by the U.S. Department of Education for multiple years, a</u>
<u>sustained license may be obtained annually during the period of the</u>
<u>multi-year accreditation.</u>

19 <u>C.</u> A license of a school shall not be effective unless the 20 private school has filed with the Board a corporate surety bond or a 21 certificate of deposit in a manner and in an amount as is required 22 by the Board.

23 C. D. Private schools or applicants shall pay the following
24 base fees to the Board:

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One Thousand Two Hundred Dollars (\$1,200.00) per license
 shall be paid to the Board for the issuance of an initial license
 for a school, seminar, or workshop to provide postsecondary
 education or other vocational-technical education or training
 pursuant to the provisions of this act Section 21-101 et seq. of
 this title;

7 2. Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) shall be paid for the
8 initial license of each new branch. A branch's renewal fee shall be
9 based on the tuition it collected;

10 3. For each renewal of a license, a fee based on the tuition 11 collected by a school, workshop or seminar from residents of 12 Oklahoma or other persons present in Oklahoma, as shown in the 13 current financial statement of the school, shall be paid to the If a school, workshop or seminar does not provide adequate 14 Board. details of its Oklahoma tuition, then the renewal fee shall be based 15 on the nationwide tuition reported. For each main and branch 16 17 school, seminar, or workshop, the renewal fees shall be calculated based upon the level of net tuition in the immediate prior calendar 18 year as follows: 19

One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) A review fee of Fifty Dollars 4 (\$50.00) shall also be paid whenever a school, seminar or workshop 5 is required to provide preliminary Board review or approval documentation to be forwarded to an accrediting organization, the 6 7 U.S. Department of Education or another state or federal agency; 8. The payment of the fee required by paragraph 7 of this 8 9 subsection shall be applied as a credit against the subsequent fee 10 for a review of a catalog or catalog addendum(s) that is submitted 11 to include incorporation of the same topic(s) following final 12 approval of the subject matter by an accreditor or the U.S. 13 Department of Education; 9. Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) shall be paid by each school 14 to the Board for attendance at a school workshop or webinar by the 15 school's required personnel, although one person may attend to 16 represent multiple, related schools; 17 10. Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) for a half-day and Three 18 Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) for a full day of optional training; and 19 11. Forty Dollars (\$40.00) by each school, seminar or workshop 20 for review of each revised or replacement enrollment agreement 21 including single enrollment agreements to be used by multiple 22

23 <u>related entities.</u>

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1	E. The base fees authorized by paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 of
2	subsection D of this section shall:
3	1. Increase by five percent (5%) for the fiscal year ending
4	<u>June 30, 2021;</u>
5	2. Increase by an additional five percent (5%) for the fiscal
6	year ending June 30, 2022; and
7	3. Increase by an additional five percent (5%) for the fiscal
8	year ending June 30, 2023.
9	\overline{D} . <u>F.</u> If the annual licensing renewal application is not
10	complete on or before the first day of June each year, the fee for
11	license renewal shall become delinquent and the license shall not be
12	renewed except upon payment of an additional late fee. Late fees
13	shall be determined based upon the school's past history of
14	submitting late filings. The appropriate late fees shall be paid in
15	full prior to the Board's issuance of a renewal license in the
16	following amounts:
17	1. Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00) for a first violation;
18	2. Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for a second violation within
19	ten (10) years of the first late filing, whether consecutive or not;
20	and
21	3. One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) for a third violation
22	within ten (10) years of the first late filing, whether consecutive
23	or not.
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1	Each violation beyond the third shall result in the school,	
2	seminar or workshop being required to seek new or initial licensure	
3	and only after payment of the full fee for a new license.	
4	E. G. Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) for each license application	
5	packet, although packets provided by one or more electronic means	
6	shall be free of charge.	
7	H. In-state site visit fees shall be charged for the purpose of	
8	reviewing compliance with minimum standards or contractual	
9	agreements, facility inspection or complaint investigation. The	
10	fees shall be charged to an applicant, school, seminar or workshop	
11	as follows:	
12	1. Two Hundred Twenty-five Dollars (\$225.00) per day when the	
13	site visit does not require overnight lodging;	
14	2. Four Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$450.00) per day if overnight	
15	lodging is required; and	
16	3. Travel fees to multiple entities on the same day may be	
17	apportioned or prorated when each visit involves on-site time of	
18	less than three (3) hours.	
19	I. An in-state visit fee shall not be charged:	
20	1. When the Board joins an accrediting organization, the U.S.	
21	Department of Education or another state or federal agency with the	
22	organization or agency's site visit to an applicant, school, seminar	
23	or workshop; or	
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<u>2. For a brief visit to an applicant, school, seminar or</u>
 <u>workshop that requires no advance preparation work on the part of</u>
 <u>the Board.</u>

F. J. The Board shall be authorized to require reimbursement 4 5 for any fees charged by a financial institution or the State Treasurer for a returned check or other failed form of payment. 6 The 7 amount to be reimbursed shall be invoiced to an entity within fortyfive (45) days after the Board's first knowledge of the fee. 8 9 G. K. All fees, penalties and fines collected by the Board 10 pursuant to the provisions of this act Section 21-101 et seq. of 11 this title shall be deposited with the State Treasurer for credit to 12 the Oklahoma Board of Private Vocational Schools Revolving Fund. 13 SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby 14 15 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval. 16
