## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend various provisions of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated so as to redesignate
- 2 veterinary technicians as veterinary nurses; to amend Chapter 50 of Title 43 of the Official
- 3 Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to veterinarians and veterinary technicians, so as to
- 4 reenact the State Board of Veterinary Medicine, subject to appropriations; to provide for
- 5 related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

## 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 SECTION 1.

- 8 The Official Code of Georgia Annotated is amended by replacing "veterinary technician"
- 9 with "veterinary nurse" wherever the former term occurs in:
- 10 (1) Code Section 4-11-17, relating to filing a report regarding animal cruelty and immunity;
- 11 (2) Code Section 43-50-3, relating to definitions regarding veterinarians and veterinary
- 12 technicians;
- 13 (3) Code Section 43-50-40, relating to renewal of licenses, reinstatement, waiver of fee,
- 14 continuing education, and inactive status;
- 15 (4) Code Section 43-50-41, relating to disciplinary action, subpoenas, judicial review,
- 16 reinstatement, investigatory powers, immunity, failure to appear, and voluntary surrender of
- 17 license;
- 18 (5) Code Section 43-50-44, relating to exemptions from licensing;
- 19 (6) Code Section 43-50-45, relating to unlawful acts, penalties, and injunctions;
- 20 (7) Code Section 43-50-51, relating to practice of veterinary technology by licensed
- 21 veterinary technician;
- 22 (8) Code Section 43-50-52, relating to application for license as veterinary technician,
- 23 qualifications, examination, renewal, applicants registered in other states, and board's
- 24 responsibility;
- 25 (9) Code Section 43-50-53, relating to administration of examinations, reexamination, and
- 26 reactivation;

27 (10) Code Section 43-50-54, relating to supervision required of veterinary technician and

- 28 prohibited activities of technician;
- 29 (11) Code Section 43-50-55, relating to posting notice of use of licensed veterinary
- 30 technicians and proper identification;
- 31 (12) Code Section 43-50-56, relating to veterinarian responsible for licensed veterinary
- 32 technician's violations of limitations on duties; and
- 33 (13) Code Section 43-50-63, relating to posting notice of use of veterinary assistant and
- 34 proper identification required.
- 35 SECTION 2.
- 36 Chapter 50 of Title 43, relating to veterinarians and veterinary technicians, is amended by
- 37 repealing Code Section 43-50-20, relating to creation of State Board of Veterinary Medicine,
- 38 members, qualifications, vacancies, expenses, meetings, and officers, and enacting a new
- 39 Code Section 43-50-20 to read as follows:
- 40 "43-50-20.
- 41 (a) There shall be a State Board of Veterinary Medicine, the members of which shall be
- 42 <u>appointed by the Governor with the approval of the Secretary of State and confirmation by</u>
- 43 the Senate. The board shall consist of seven members, each appointed for a term of no
- 44 more than five years or until his or her successor is appointed. Five members of the board
- 45 <u>shall be duly licensed veterinarians actually engaged in active practice for at least five</u>
- 46 <u>years prior to appointment. The sixth member shall be appointed from the public at large</u>
- 47 and shall in no way be connected with the practice of veterinary medicine. The seventh
- 48 <u>member shall be a registered veterinary nurse who has been registered and actively</u>
- 49 <u>engaged in the practice of veterinary technology or veterinary nursing for at least five years</u>
- 50 prior to appointment. The initial appointment of the veterinary nurse shall expire on June
- 51 <u>30 in the fifth calendar year after this subsection becomes effective; thereafter, successors</u>
- 52 <u>shall be appointed for a term of five years.</u> Those members of the State Board of
- 53 <u>Veterinary Medicine serving on the effective date of this subsection shall continue to serve</u>
- 54 <u>as members of the board until the expiration of the term for which they were appointed.</u>
- 55 Thereafter, successors to such board members shall be appointed in accordance with this
- 56 <u>Code section. A majority of the board shall constitute a quorum.</u>
- 57 (b) Vacancies due to death, resignation, removal, or otherwise shall be filled for the
- 58 remainder of the unexpired term in the same manner as regular appointments. No person
- 59 <u>shall serve two consecutive five-year terms, but a person appointed for a term of less than</u>
- 60 <u>five years may succeed himself or herself.</u>
- 61 (c) Each member of the board shall be reimbursed as provided for in subsection (f) of
- 62 <u>Code Section 43-1-2.</u>

63 (d) Any member of the board may be removed by the Governor after a hearing by the

- 64 <u>board determines cause for removal.</u>
- (e) The board shall meet at least once each year at the time fixed by the board. Other
- 66 necessary meetings may be called by the president of the board by giving such notice as
- 67 <u>shall be established by the board. Meetings shall be open and public except that the board</u>
- 68 may meet in closed session as set forth in Code Section 50-14-3.
- 69 (f) At its annual meeting, the board shall organize by electing a president and such other
- officers as may be required by the board. Officers of the board serve for terms of one year
- and until a successor is elected, without limitation on the number of terms an officer may
- 72 serve. The president shall chair the board meetings.
- 73 (g) This Code section shall be subject to appropriations by the General Assembly."

## 74 SECTION 3.

75 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
