A RESOLUTION

- 1 Commending Taiwan for its relations with the United States; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, Taiwan and the United States are longstanding allies who both deeply cherish
- 3 the common values of freedom, democracy, human rights, and the rule of law; and
- 4 WHEREAS, in the year of 2016, Taiwan held its sixth direct presidential election, and Tsai
- 5 Ing-wen was elected as the 14th President of Taiwan, becoming the first female president in
- 6 the country's history, and along with her Vice President Chen Chien-jen, she hopes to
- 7 continue to build the country's already rich tradition of economic vitality, cultural growth and
- 8 innovation, self-sufficiency in national defense and protecting Taiwan's democracy; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Taiwan adopted a "New Southbound Policy" in 2016 to promote Taiwan's
- 10 economic, technological, and cultural connections with Southeast Asia, South Asia,
- 11 Australia, and New Zealand, serving the best interests of the Asia-Pacific region in the
- 12 continuation of stability and growth; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Taiwan and mainland China have signed more than 20 agreements in the past
- 14 decade. U.S. businesses can collaborate with innovative Taiwanese companies in Taiwan's
- 15 comprehensive protection of intellectual property rights, and then use Taiwan as a
- springboard for entering mainland China and other key Asian markets; and
- 17 WHEREAS, since 1984, the State of Georgia and Taiwan have enjoyed long, cordial, and
- mutually beneficial sister-state relations, a friendship that continues to strengthen with each
- 19 passing year; and
- 20 WHEREAS, Taiwan is the United States' ninth-largest trading partner, and the United States
- 21 is Taiwan's second-largest trading partner; and

22 WHEREAS, the designation of Taiwan into the United States' Visa Waiver Program is a

- 23 significant step to draw travelers from Taiwan choosing the United States as their destination
- 24 for trade, investment, and sightseeing; and
- 25 WHEREAS, by working together with Taiwan, Georgia welcomes all opportunities for an
- 26 even closer economic partnership, such as the signing of a United States-Taiwan Bilateral
- 27 Investment Agreement and Bilateral Trade Agreement, in order to enhance the special
- 28 sister-state bond between Georgia and Taiwan and to encourage further cultural, educational,
- 29 and business exchanges between the citizens of both nations; and
- 30 WHEREAS, Taiwan is an active member in the international community with a long history
- 31 of commitment to international health and humanitarian aid as well as environmental
- 32 protection; and
- WHEREAS, it is abundantly fitting and proper that the outstanding relationship between
- 34 these extraordinary sister-states be appropriately recognized.
- 35 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
- 36 commend and support the democratization efforts of Taiwan and the nation's meaningful
- 37 participation in the World Health Organization, the International Civil Aviation
- 38 Organization, and the UN Framework Convention on Climate Change, as well as other
- 39 international organizations, and extend their most sincere best wishes for continued
- 40 cooperation and success.
- 41 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Senate is authorized and directed
