### 1 AN ACT concerning

# Funeral Establishments and Crematories – Unclaimed Cremains of Veterans – Notification, Disposition, and Reporting

4 FOR the purpose of specifying that the purpose for which licensed funeral establishments  $\mathbf{5}$ and holders of a permit for the business of operating a crematory are authorized to 6 transfer certain cremains to a veterans service organization under certain 7 circumstances is for the appropriate disposition of the cremains; requiring a licensed 8 funeral establishment and the holder of a permit for the business of operating a 9 crematory in possession of unclaimed cremated remains of a certain veteran or a 10 certain eligible dependent to make a certain notification to the Department of 11 Veterans Affairs within a certain period of time for the purpose of the appropriate 12disposition of the cremains; requiring a funeral establishment or crematory to 13 transfer certain cremains to the Department for a certain purpose; requiring the State Board of Morticians and Funeral Directors and the Department jointly to 14 15submit a certain report to the Governor and certain committees of the General Assembly on or before certain dates; and generally relating to the appropriate 16 17disposition of unclaimed cremains of veterans.

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SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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## **Article – Health Occupations**

4 7-406.

5 (a) A licensee shall maintain a complete file of a cremation that includes the 6 signature of the next of kin, person identifying the body, or person responsible for 7 disposition, time of death, and the date and time of cremation.

8 (b) (1) (i) In this subsection the following words have the meanings 9 indicated.

10 (ii) "Eligible dependent" means a veteran's spouse, a veteran's 11 unmarried child under the age of 21 years, or a veteran's unmarried adult child who before 12 the age of 21 became permanently incapable of self–support because of physical or mental 13 disability.

(iii) 1. "Identifying information" means data required by a
veterans service organization to verify the eligibility of a veteran or an eligible dependent
for burial in a national or state veterans cemetery.

17 2. "Identifying information" includes name, service number,
18 Social Security number, date of birth, date of death, place of birth, and copy of the death
19 certificate.

20 (iv) "Veteran" has the meaning stated in § 9–901 of the State 21 Government Article.

(v) "Veterans service organization" means an association or other entity organized for the benefit of veterans that has been recognized by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs or chartered by Congress and any employee or representative of the association or entity.

26 (2) If a licensed funeral establishment or a crematory is in possession of 27 cremated human remains that have been unclaimed for 90 days or more, the licensed 28 funeral establishment or holder of the permit for the business of operating a crematory 29 shall provide identifying information of the unclaimed cremains to a veterans service 30 organization in order for the veterans service organization to determine if the unclaimed 31 cremains are those of a veteran or an eligible dependent.

32 (3) Within 45 days after receipt of the information required under 33 paragraph (2) of this subsection, the veterans service organization shall notify the licensed 34 funeral establishment or permit holder:

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1 (i) Whether the cremains are those of a veteran or an eligible 2 dependent; and

3 (ii) If so, whether the veteran or eligible dependent is eligible for 4 burial in a veterans cemetery.

5 (4) If the unclaimed cremains are those of a veteran or an eligible 6 dependent, the licensed funeral establishment or permit holder may transfer the cremains 7 to a veterans service organization for the purpose of <u>THE APPROPRIATE</u> disposition of the 8 cremains.

9 (5) IF A VETERANS SERVICE ORGANIZATION DOES NOT TAKE 10 POSSESSION OF UNCLAIMED CREMAINS THAT QUALIFY FOR A PLOT IN A STATE 11 VETERANS' CEMETERY UNDER § 9–906 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE 12 WITHIN 10 DAYS AFTER THE LICENSED FUNERAL ESTABLISHMENT OR PERMIT 13 HOLDER RECEIVES THE NOTIFICATION REQUIRED UNDER PARAGRAPH (3) OF THIS 14 SUBSECTION, THE LICENSED FUNERAL ESTABLISHMENT OR PERMIT HOLDER 15 SHALL:

16(I) NOTIFY THE DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS OF THE17STATUS OF THE CREMAINS FOR THE PURPOSE OF THE APPROPRIATE DISPOSITION18OF THE CREMAINS; AND

19 (II) TRANSFER THE CREMAINS TO THE DEPARTMENT OF 20 VETERANS AFFAIRS FOR THE PURPOSE OF <u>THE APPROPRIATE</u> DISPOSITION OF THE 21 CREMAINS.

22 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, on or before January 31, 23 2022, 2023, and 2024, the State Board of Morticians and Funeral Directors and the 24 Department of Veterans Affairs jointly shall submit a report to the Governor and, in 25 accordance with § 2–1257 of the State Government Article, the Senate Education, Health, 26 and Environmental Affairs Committee and the House Health and Government Operations 27 Committee on:

- 28 (1) the number of unclaimed cremains of veterans and eligible dependents 29 for whom licensed funeral establishments and permit holders for the business of operating 30 a crematory received notification under § 7–406(b)(3) of the Health Occupations Article 31 during the immediately preceding year:
- 32 (2) the number of unclaimed cremains transferred to the Department of
   33 Veterans Affairs under § 7-406(b)(5) of the Health Occupations Article, as enacted by
   34 Section 1 of this Act, during the immediately preceding year; and
- 35 (3) the costs associated with the transfer of unclaimed cremains to the
   36 Department of Veterans Affairs under § 7-406(b)(5) of the Health Occupations Article, as
   37 enacted by Section 1 of this Act, during the immediately preceding year.

SECTION <del>3.</del> <u>2.</u> AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
 October 1, 2020.
