A BILL

To reauthorize Department of Justice programs that combat violence against women, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Violence Against
5 Women Extension Act of 2019”.

6 **SEC. 2. STOP GRANTS.**

7 Section 1001(a)(18) of the Omnibus Crime Control
8 and Safe Streets Act of 1968 (34 U.S.C. 10261(a)(18)),

1 is amended by inserting after “for each of fiscal years
2 2014 through 2018” the following: “, and \$111,000,000
3 for the period beginning on March 1, 2019, and ending
4 on March 31, 2020”.

5 **SEC. 3. GRANTS TO ENCOURAGE ARREST POLICIES AND**
6 **ENFORCEMENT OF PROTECTION ORDERS.**

7 Section 1001(a)(19) of title I of the Omnibus Crime
8 Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968 (34 U.S.C.
9 10261(a)(19)) is amended by inserting after “for each of
10 fiscal years 2014 through 2018” the following: “, and
11 \$36,500,000 for the period beginning on March 1, 2019,
12 and ending on March 31, 2020”.

13 **SEC. 4. LEGAL ASSISTANCE FOR VICTIMS.**

14 Section 1201(f)(1) of the Violence Against Women
15 Act of 2000 (34 U.S.C. 20121(f)(1)) is amended by insert-
16 ing after “for each of fiscal years 2014 through 2018”
17 the following: “, and \$28,500,000 for the period beginning
18 on March 1, 2019, and ending on March 31, 2020”.

19 **SEC. 5. GRANTS TO SUPPORT FAMILIES IN THE JUSTICE**
20 **SYSTEM.**

21 Section 1301(e) of the Violence Against Women Act
22 of 2000 (34 U.S.C. 12464(e)) is amended by inserting
23 after “for each of fiscal years 2014 through 2018” the
24 following: “, and \$11,000,000 for the period beginning on
25 March 1, 2019, and ending on March 31, 2020”.

1 **SEC. 6. SEX OFFENDER MANAGEMENT.**

2 Section 40152(c) of the Violence Against Women Act
3 of 1994 (34 U.S.C. 12311(c)) is amended by inserting
4 after “for each of fiscal years 2014 through 2018” the
5 following: “, and \$2,500,000 for the period beginning on
6 March 1, 2019, and ending on March 31, 2020”.

7 **SEC. 7. COURT-APPOINTED SPECIAL ADVOCATE PROGRAM.**

8 Section 219(a) the Crime Control Act of 1990 (42
9 U.S.C. 13014(a)) is amended by inserting after “for each
10 of fiscal years 2014 through 2018” the following: “, and
11 \$6,000,000 for the period beginning on March 1, 2019,
12 and ending on March 31, 2020”.

13 **SEC. 8. RURAL DOMESTIC VIOLENCE, DATING VIOLENCE,**
14 **SEXUAL ASSAULT, STALKING, AND CHILD**
15 **ABUSE ENFORCEMENT ASSISTANCE.**

16 Section 40295(e)(1) of the Violence Against Women
17 Act of 1994 (34 U.S.C. 12341(e)(1)) is amended by in-
18 serting after “for each of fiscal years 2014 through 2018”
19 the following: “, and \$25,000,000 for the period beginning
20 on March 1, 2019, and ending on March 31, 2020”.

21 **SEC. 9. GRANTS FOR ENHANCED TRAINING AND SERVICES**
22 **TO END ABUSE LATER IN LIFE.**

23 Section 40801(b)(5) of the Violence Against Women
24 Act of 1994 (34 U.S.C. 12421(b)(5)) is amended by in-
25 serting after “for each of fiscal years 2014 through 2018”

1 the following: “, and \$4,500,000 for the period beginning
2 on March 1, 2019, and ending on March 31, 2020”.

3 **SEC. 10. CREATING HOPE THROUGH OUTREACH, OPTIONS,**
4 **SERVICE, AND EDUCATION FOR CHILDREN**
5 **AND YOUTH GRANTS.**

6 Section 41201(f) of the Violence Against Women Act
7 of 1994 (34 U.S.C. 12451(f)) is amended by inserting
8 after “for each of fiscal years 2014 through 2018” the
9 following: “, and \$7,500,000 for the period beginning on
10 March 1, 2019, and ending on March 31, 2020”.

11 **SEC. 11. GRANTS TO COMBAT VIOLENT CRIMES ON CAM-**
12 **PUSES.**

13 Section 304(e) of the Violence Against Women and
14 Department of Justice Reauthorization Act of 2005 (34
15 U.S.C. 20125(e)) is amended by inserting after “for each
16 of fiscal years 2014 through 2018” the following: “, and
17 \$6,000,000 for the period beginning on March 1, 2019,
18 and ending on March 31, 2020”.

19 **SEC. 12. STUDY CONDUCTED THROUGH THE CENTERS FOR**
20 **DISEASE CONTROL AND PREVENTION.**

21 Section 402(c) of the Violence Against Women and
22 Department of Justice Reauthorization Act of 2005 (42
23 U.S.C. 280b–4(c)) is amended by inserting after “for each
24 of fiscal years 2014 through 2018” the following: “, and

1 \$500,000 for the period beginning on March 1, 2019, and
2 ending on March 31, 2020”.

3 **SEC. 13. SAVING MONEY AND REDUCING TRAGEDIES**
4 **THROUGH PREVENTION.**

5 Section 41303(f) of the Violence Against Women Act
6 of 1994 (34 U.S.C. 12463(f)) is amended by inserting
7 after “for each of fiscal years 2014 through 2018” the
8 following: “, and \$7,500,000 for the period beginning on
9 March 1, 2019, and ending on March 31, 2020”.

10 **SEC. 14. ADDRESSING THE HOUSING NEEDS OF VICTIMS OF**
11 **DOMESTIC VIOLENCE, DATING VIOLENCE,**
12 **SEXUAL ASSAULT, AND STALKING.**

13 (a) **COLLABORATIVE GRANTS TO INCREASE THE**
14 **LONG-TERM STABILITY OF VICTIMS.**—Section 41404(i)
15 of the Violence Against Women Act of 1994 (34 U.S.C.
16 12474(i)) is amended by inserting after “for each of fiscal
17 years 2014 through 2018” the following: “, and
18 \$2,000,000 for the period beginning on March 1, 2019,
19 and ending on March 31, 2020”.

20 (b) **GRANTS TO COMBAT VIOLENCE AGAINST**
21 **WOMEN IN PUBLIC AND ASSISTED HOUSING.**—Section
22 41405(g) of the Violence Against Women Act of 1994 (34
23 U.S.C. 12475(g)) is amended by inserting after “for each
24 of fiscal years 2014 through 2018” the following: “, and

1 \$2,000,000 for the period beginning on March 1, 2019,
2 and ending on March 31, 2020”.

3 **SEC. 15. NATIONAL RESOURCE CENTER ON WORKPLACE**
4 **RESPONSES TO ASSIST VICTIMS OF DOMES-**
5 **TIC AND SEXUAL VIOLENCE.**

6 Section 41501(e) of the Violence Against Women Act
7 of 1994 (34 U.S.C. 12501(e)) is amended by inserting
8 after “for each of fiscal years 2014 through 2018” the
9 following: “, and \$500,000 for the period beginning on
10 March 1, 2019, and ending on March 31, 2020”.

11 **SEC. 16. GRANTS FOR TRIBAL JURISDICTION OVER CRIMES**
12 **OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE.**

13 Section 204 of Public Law 90–284 (25 U.S.C. 1301
14 et seq.) (commonly known as the “Indian Civil Rights Act
15 of 1968”) is amended by inserting after “for each of fiscal
16 years 2014 through 2018” the following: “, and
17 \$2,500,000 for the period beginning on March 1, 2019,
18 and ending on March 31, 2020”.

19 **SEC. 17. ANALYSIS AND RESEARCH ON VIOLENCE AGAINST**
20 **INDIAN WOMEN.**

21 Section 905(b)(2) of the Violence Against Women
22 and Department of Justice Reauthorization Act of 2005
23 (28 U.S.C. 534 note) is amended by inserting after “for
24 each of fiscal years 2014 through 2018” the following: “,

1 and \$500,000 for the period beginning on March 1, 2019,
2 and ending on March 31, 2020”.

3 **SEC. 18. STALKER DATABASE.**

4 Section 40603 of the Violence Against Women Act
5 of 1994 (34 U.S.C. 12402) is amended by inserting after
6 “for fiscal years 2014 through 2018” the following: “, and
7 \$1,500,000 for the period beginning on March 1, 2019,
8 and ending on March 31, 2020”.

9 **SEC. 19. FEDERAL VICTIM ASSISTANCE REAUTHORIZATION.**

10 Section 40114 of the Violence Against Women Act
11 of 1994 (Public Law 103–322; 108 Stat. 1910) is amend-
12 ed by inserting after “for each of fiscal years 2014
13 through 2018” the following: “, and \$500,000 for the pe-
14 riod beginning on March 1, 2019, and ending on March
15 31, 2020”.

16 **SEC. 20. GRANTS FOR STRENGTHENING THE HEALTHCARE**
17 **SYSTEM’S RESPONSE TO DOMESTIC VIO-**
18 **LENCE, DATING VIOLENCE, SEXUAL ASSAULT,**
19 **AND STALKING.**

20 Section 399P(g) of the Public Health Service Act (42
21 U.S.C. 280g–4(g)) is amended by inserting after “for each
22 of fiscal years 2014 through 2018” the following: “, and
23 \$5,000,000 for the period beginning on March 1, 2019,
24 and ending on March 31, 2020”.

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
