1 AN ACT concerning

Personal Property Tax - Exemption for Business Personal Property

- FOR the purpose of exempting business personal property from the property tax imposed 4 by a county or municipal corporation, subject to certain exceptions; requiring the State Department of Assessments and Taxation to identify certain provisions of law 5 and submit a certain report to the General Assembly; providing for the application of this Act; and generally relating to an exemption from the personal property tax 8 for certain businesses.

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND. 14
- That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 15

- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, on or before December 1, 2020, the State Department of Assessments and Taxation shall identify provisions of the Annotated Code of Maryland or the Code of Public Local Laws that are rendered inaccurate or obsolete as a result of Section 1 of this Act and, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the State Government Article, shall submit a report to the General Assembly on its findings with recommendations for any amendments to the Annotated Code of Maryland or the Code of Public Local Laws.
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 2020, and shall be applicable to all taxable years beginning after June 30, 2020.
