A BILL

To establish within the Smithsonian Institution the National Museum of American LGBTQ+ History and Culture, and for other purposes.

1	Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2	tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
3	SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
4	This Act may be cited as the "National Museum of
5	American LGBTQ+ History and Culture Act".
6	SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.
7	In this Act:
8	(1) BOARD OF REGENTS.—The term "Board of
9	Regents" means the Board of Regents of the Smith-
10	sonian Institution.
11	(2) COUNCIL.—The term "Council" means the
12	National Museum of American LGBTQ+ History
13	and Culture Council established by section 4.
14	(3) MUSEUM.—The term "Museum" means the
15	National Museum of American LGBTQ+ History
16	and Culture established by section 3.
17	(4) Secretary.—The term "Secretary" means
18	the Secretary of the Smithsonian Institution.
19	SEC. 3. ESTABLISHMENT OF MUSEUM.
20	(a) ESTABLISHMENT.—There is established within
21	the Smithsonian Institution a museum to be known as the
22	"National Museum of American LGBTQ+ History and
23	Culture".
24	(b) PURPOSE.—The purpose of the Museum shall be
25	to provide for—

1	(1) the collection, study, and establishment of
2	programs relating to American LGBTQ+ life, art,
3	history, and culture;
4	(2) the creation and maintenance of permanent
5	and temporary exhibits documenting the history of
6	American LGBTQ+ life, art, history, and culture;
7	(3) the collection and study of artifacts and
8	documents relating to American LGBTQ+ life, art,
9	history, and culture; and
10	(4) collaboration between the Museum and
11	other museums, LGBTQ+-serving institutions, his-
12	torical societies, educational institutions, and other
13	organizations that promote the study or appreciation
14	of American LGBTQ+ life, art, history, or culture,
15	including collaboration concerning—
16	(A) development of cooperative programs
17	and exhibitions;
18	(B) identification, management, and care
19	of collections; and
20	(C) training of museum professionals.
21	SEC. 4. COUNCIL.
22	(a) ESTABLISHMENT.—There is established within
23	the Smithsonian Institution a council to be known as the
24	"National Museum of American LGBTQ+ History and
25	Culture Council".

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1	(b) DUTIES.—
2	(1) IN GENERAL.—The Council shall—
3	(A) make recommendations to the Board
4	of Regents concerning the planning, design, and
5	construction of the Museum;
6	(B) advise and assist the Board of Regents
7	on all matters relating to the administration,
8	operation, maintenance, and preservation of the
9	Museum;
10	(C) recommend annual operating budgets
11	for the Museum to the Board of Regents;
12	(D) report annually to the Board of Re-
13	gents on the acquisition, disposition, and dis-
14	play of objects relating to American LGBTQ+
15	life, art, history, and culture; and
16	(E) adopt by laws for the operation of the
17	Council.
18	(2) PRINCIPAL RESPONSIBILITIES.—The Coun-
19	cil, subject to the general policies of the Board of
20	Regents, shall have sole authority to—
21	(A) purchase, accept, borrow, and other-
22	wise acquire artifacts for addition to the collec-
23	tions of the Museum;
24	(B) loan, exchange, sell, and otherwise dis-
25	pose of any part of the collections of the Mu-

1	seum, but only if the funds generated by that
2	disposition are used for additions to the collec-
3	tions of the Museum; or
4	(C) specify criteria with respect to the use
5	of the collections and resources of the Museum,
6	including policies on programming, education,
7	exhibitions, and research.
8	(3) Other responsibilities.—The Council,
9	subject to the general policies of the Board of Re-
10	gents, shall have authority—
11	(A) to provide for preservation, restoration,
12	and maintenance of the collections of the Mu-
13	seum; and
14	(B) to solicit, accept, use, and dispose of
15	gifts, bequests, and devises of personal property
16	for the purpose of aiding and facilitating the
17	work of the Museum.
18	(c) Composition and Appointment.—
19	(1) IN GENERAL.—The Council shall be com-
20	posed of 19 voting members as provided under para-
21	graph (2).
22	(2) Voting members.—The Council shall in-
23	clude the following voting members:
24	(A) The Secretary of the Smithsonian In-
25	stitution.

1	(B) One member of the Board of Regents,
2	appointed by the Board of Regents.
3	(C) Seventeen individuals appointed by the
4	Board of Regents—
5	(i) taking into consideration individ-
6	uals recommended by organizations and
7	entities that are committed to the advance-
8	ment of knowledge of American LGBTQ+
9	life, art, history, and culture; and
10	(ii) taking into consideration individ-
11	uals recommended by the members of the
12	Council.
13	(3) INITIAL APPOINTMENTS.—The Board of
14	Regents shall make initial appointments to the
15	Council under paragraph (2) not later than 180
16	days after the date of enactment of this Act.
17	(d) TERMS.—
18	(1) IN GENERAL.—Except as provided in this
19	subsection, each appointed member of the Council
20	shall be appointed for a term of 3 years.
21	(2) INITIAL APPOINTEES.—As designated by
22	the Board of Regents at the time of appointment, of
23	the voting members first appointed under subsection
24	(c)(2)(C)—

1	(A) six members shall be appointed for a
2	term of 1 year;
3	(B) six members shall be appointed for a
4	term of 2 years; and
5	(C) five members shall be appointed for a
6	term of 3 years.
7	(3) REAPPOINTMENT.—A member of the Coun-
8	cil may be reappointed, except that no individual
9	may serve on the Council for a total of more than
10	2 terms. For purposes of this paragraph, the num-
11	ber of terms an individual serves on the Council
12	shall not include any portion of a term for which an
13	individual is appointed to fill a vacancy under para-
14	graph $(4)(B)$.
15	(4) VACANCIES.—
16	(A) IN GENERAL.—A vacancy on the
17	Council—
18	(i) shall not affect the powers of the
19	Council; and
20	(ii) shall be filled in the same manner
21	as the original appointment was made.
22	(B) TERM.—Any member of the Council
23	appointed to fill a vacancy occurring before the
24	expiration of the term for which the member's

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1	predecessor was appointed shall be appointed
2	for the remainder of that term.
3	(e) Compensation.—
4	(1) IN GENERAL.—Except as provided in para-
5	graph (2), a member of the Council shall serve with-
6	out pay.
7	(2) TRAVEL EXPENSES.—A member of the
8	Council shall be allowed travel expenses, including
9	per diem in lieu of subsistence, at rates authorized
10	for an employee of an agency under subchapter I of
11	chapter 57 of title 5, United States Code, while
12	away from the home or regular place of business of
13	the member in the performance of the duties of the
14	Council.
15	(f) CHAIRPERSON.—By a majority vote of its voting
16	members, the Council shall elect a chairperson from its
17	members.
18	(g) MEETINGS.—
19	(1) IN GENERAL.—The Council shall meet at
20	the call of the chairperson or on the written request
21	of a majority of the voting members of the Council,
22	but not fewer than twice each year.
23	(2) INITIAL MEETINGS.—During the 1-year pe-
24	riod beginning on the date of the first meeting of the
25	Council, the Council shall meet not fewer than 4

times for the purpose of carrying out the duties of
 the Council under this Act.

3 (h) QUORUM.—A majority of the voting members of
4 the Council holding office shall constitute a quorum for
5 the purpose of conducting business, but a lesser number
6 may receive information on behalf of the Council.

7 SEC. 5. DIRECTOR AND STAFF OF THE MUSEUM.

8 (a) DIRECTOR.—

9 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Museum shall have a
10 Director who shall be appointed by the Secretary,
11 taking into consideration individuals recommended
12 by the Council.

13 (2) DUTIES.—The Director shall manage the
14 Museum subject to the policies of the Board of Re15 gents.

16 (b) STAFF.—The Secretary may appoint two addi-17 tional employees to serve under the Director, except that 18 such additional employees may be appointed without re-19 gard to the provisions of title 5, United States Code, gov-20 erning appointments in the competitive service.

(c) PAY.—The employees appointed by the Secretary
under subsection (b) may be paid without regard to the
provisions of chapter 51 and subchapter III of chapter 53
of title 5, United States Code, relating to classification
of positions and General Schedule pay rates.

1	SEC. 6. EDUCATIONAL AND LIAISON PROGRAMS.
2	(a) IN GENERAL.—
3	(1) Programs authorized.—The Director of
4	the Museum may carry out educational and liaison
5	programs in support of the goals of the Museum.
6	(2) Specific activities described.—In car-
7	rying out this section, the Director shall—
8	(A) carry out educational programs relat-
9	ing to American LGBTQ+ life, art, history,
10	and culture, including—
11	(i) programs using digital, electronic,
12	and interactive technologies; and
13	(ii) programs carried out in collabora-
14	tion with elementary schools, secondary
15	schools, and postsecondary schools; and
16	(B) consult with the Director of the Insti-
17	tute of Museum and Library Services con-
18	cerning the grant and scholarship programs
19	carried out under subsection (b).
20	(b) GRANT AND SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMS.—In con-
21	sultation with the Council and the Director of the Mu-
22	seum, the Director of the Institute of Museum and Li-
23	brary Services shall establish—
24	(1) a grant program with the purpose of im-
25	proving operations, care of collections, and develop-

1	ment of professional management at American
2	LGBTQ+ museums;
3	(2) a grant program with the purpose of pro-
4	viding internship and fellowship opportunities at
5	American LGBTQ+ museums; and
6	(3) a scholarship program with the purpose of
7	assisting individuals who are pursuing careers or
8	carrying out studies in the arts, humanities, and
9	sciences in the study of American LGBTQ+ life,
10	art, history, and culture.

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
