- 1 Recognizing Mr. Jesse C. Long and dedicating an interchange in his honor; and for other
- 2 purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, Mr. Jesse C. Long has long been recognized by the citizens of this state for the
- 4 vital role that he has played in leadership and his deep personal commitment to the welfare
- 5 of the citizens of Georgia; and
- 6 WHEREAS, a native of Tennessee, Mr. Long attended David Lipscomb College in Nashville
- 7 to study to become a minister; and
- 8 WHEREAS, in 1957, Mr. Long moved to Atlanta to serve as minister of the Northwest
- 9 Church of Christ, where he also ministered to students attending the Georgia Institute of
- 10 Technology; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Mr. Long was named president of Greater Atlanta Christian School after his
- instrumental role that led to the purchase of 170 acres on Indian Trail Road in Lilburn for the
- 13 school's campus; and
- 14 WHEREAS, his leadership and guidance were instrumental as chairman of the education
- 15 committee to the Gwinnett Chamber of Commerce and he was honored as the organization's
- 16 Citizen of the Year in 1981; and
- 17 WHEREAS, it is abundantly fitting and proper that the extraordinary accomplishments of
- 18 this distinguished Georgian be appropriately recognized by dedicating an interchange in his
- 19 honor.
- 20 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AND ENACTED BY THE GENERAL
- 21 ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA that the interchange at Interstate 85 and Indian Trail Road in
- 22 Gwinnett County is dedicated as the Jesse C. Long Interchange.
