Impeaching Alejandro Nicholas Mayorkas, Secretary of Homeland Security, for high crimes and misdemeanors.

IN THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

January 9, 2023

Mr. Fallon submitted the following resolution; which was referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

RESOLUTION

Impeaching Alejandro Nicholas Mayorkas, Secretary of Homeland Security, for high crimes and misdemeanors.

- 1 Resolved, That Alejandro Nicholas Mayorkas, Sec-
- 2 retary of Homeland Security, is impeached for high crimes
- 3 and misdemeanors and that the following articles of im-
- 4 peachment be exhibited to the United States Senate:
- 5 Articles of impeachment exhibited by the House of
- 6 Representatives of the United States of America in the
- 7 name of itself and of the people of the United States of
- 8 America, against Alejandro Nicholas Mayorkas, Secretary
- 9 of Homeland Security, in maintenance and support of its

- 1 impeachment against him for high crimes and mis-
- 2 demeanors.
- 3 ARTICLE I.—In his conduct while Secretary of Home-
- 4 land Security of the United States, Alejandro Nicholas
- 5 Mayorkas, in violation of his constitutional oath, engaged
- 6 in a pattern of conduct that is incompatible with his duties
- 7 as an Officer of the United States, as follows:
- 8 Article II of the Constitution tasks the Executive
- 9 branch, which today includes the Secretary of Homeland
- 10 Security, with ensuring the laws passed by Congress and
- 11 signed into law by the President are faithfully executed.
- 12 Specifically, the Secure the Fence Act of 2006 (Public
- 13 Law 109–367) requires the Secretary of Homeland Secu-
- 14 rity to "maintain operational control over the entire inter-
- 15 national land and maritime borders of the United States".
- 16 The term "operational control" is defined as "the
- 17 prevention of all unlawful entries into the United States,
- 18 including entries by terrorists, other unlawful aliens, in-
- 19 struments of terrorism, narcotics, and other contraband".
- Over 5,500,000 illegal aliens have crossed our south-
- 21 ern border under the leadership of Secretary Mayorkas.
- 22 There have now been 20 straight months with over
- 23 150,000 illegal border crossings. Secretary Mayorkas has
- 24 presided over a 180-percent increase in encounters at the
- 25 southern border compared to the previous administration.

- 1 In fiscal year 2022, 98 individuals on the Terrorist
- 2 Screening Database (TSDB) were apprehended at the
- 3 southern border, more than during the previous 5 years
- 4 combined. In total, more than 100 individuals on the
- 5 TSDB have been apprehended under Secretary Mayorkas.
- 6 Under Secretary Mayorkas, more fentanyl has
- 7 crossed the border in the last 2 months than in all of fiscal
- 8 year 2019 under President Trump's leadership. In fiscal
- 9 year 2022, over 14,000 pounds of poisonous fentanyl was
- 10 seized at the southern border. Fentanyl overdoses are the
- 11 number one cause of death for individuals ages 18 to 45
- 12 nationwide.
- 13 Under Secretary Mayorkas, the Department of
- 14 Homeland Security is also in violation the Immigration
- 15 and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1101 et seq.). This Act re-
- 16 quires the Department of Homeland Security to detain in-
- 17 admissible aliens arriving in the United States or aliens
- 18 who are present in the United States without inspection
- 19 until processed. In violation of the law, Secretary
- 20 Mayorkas implemented catch-and-release directives such
- 21 as the Notice to Report process and the parole plus Alter-
- 22 natives to Detention process. Through these misguided
- 23 programs, over 1,000,000 illegal aliens have been reck-
- 24 lessly released into the interior of the United States.

- 1 Secretary Mayorkas has undermined the operational
- 2 control of our southern border and encouraged illegal im-
- 3 migration by doing the following:
- 4 (1) Terminating contracts for additional border
- 5 wall construction, in contradiction of Congressional
- 6 appropriations.
- 7 (2) Ending the Migrant Protection Protocols,
- 8 also known as "Remain in Mexico", which was an
- 9 indispensable tool to address the border crisis and
- restore integrity to the immigration system.
- 11 (3) Attempting to eliminate title 42 authority,
- a critical tool enabling the U.S. Customs and Border
- 13 Protection to quickly expel illegal aliens.
- 14 Secretary Mayorkas has violated the law and gravely
- 15 endangered the national security of the United States
- 16 through these actions.
- 17 Wherefore, Alejandro Nicholas Mayorkas, by such
- 18 conduct, warrants impeachment, trial, removal from of-
- 19 fice, and disqualification to hold and enjoy any office of
- 20 honor, trust, or profit within the United States Federal
- 21 Government.
- 22 Article II.—In his conduct while Secretary of
- 23 Homeland Security of the United States, Alejandro Nich-
- 24 olas Mayorkas, in violation of his constitutional oath, will-

- 1 fully provided perjurious, false, and misleading testimony
- 2 to Congress, as follows:
- 3 On April 28, 2022, during a House Judiciary Com-
- 4 mittee hearing, Congressman Chip Roy of Texas asked
- 5 Secretary Mayorkas, "Will you testify under oath that we
- 6 have operational control of the border?".
- 7 Under oath, Secretary Mayorkas responded, "Yes we
- 8 do".
- 9 On November 15, 2022, during a House Homeland
- 10 Security Committee hearing, Congressman Dan Bishop of
- 11 North Carolina asked, "Secretary Mayorkas, do you con-
- 12 tinue to maintain that the border is secure?".
- 13 Under oath, Secretary Mayorkas responded, "Yes,
- 14 and we are working day in and day out to enhance secu-
- 15 rity, Congressman".
- 16 As previously described, the term "operational con-
- 17 trol" is defined as "the prevention of all unlawful entries
- 18 into the United States, including entries by terrorists,
- 19 other unlawful aliens, instruments of terrorism, narcotics,
- 20 and other contraband".
- 21 Section 1621 of title 18, United States Code, stipu-
- 22 lates that anyone who "willfully and contrary to such oath
- 23 states or subscribes any material matter which he does
- 24 not believe to be true" is guilty of perjury and shall be
- 25 fined or imprisoned up to 5 years, or both.

- 1 The record-breaking number of illegal alien encoun-
- 2 ters, including over 1,000,000 known "gotaways", as well
- 3 as the record seizures of deadly fentanyl and other contra-
- 4 band, prove that Secretary Mayorkas has not ensured
- 5 operational control of the southern border.
- 6 Secretary Mayorkas clearly committed perjury on
- 7 multiple occasions before Congress.
- 8 Wherefore, Alejandro Nicholas Mayorkas, by such
- 9 conduct, warrants impeachment, trial, removal from of-
- 10 fice, and disqualification to hold and enjoy any office of
- 11 honor, trust, or profit under the United States.
- 12 Article III.—In his conduct while Secretary of
- 13 Homeland Security of the United States, Alejandro Nich-
- 14 olas Mayorkas knowingly slandered his own hardworking
- 15 Border Patrol agents and mislead the general public, as
- 16 follows:
- On September 19, 2021, approximately 15,000 Hai-
- 18 tian migrants had crossed the border from Mexico into
- 19 the United States and were concentrated in an encamp-
- 20 ment underneath the international bridge from Mexico to
- 21 the Del Rio, Texas, Port of Entry (POE), and sur-
- 22 rounding areas.
- 23 Mounted Border Patrol agents and troopers with the
- 24 Texas Department of Public Safety (TXDPS) dispersed
- 25 a large group of migrants gathered near a boat ramp lo-

- 1 cated along the side of the United States of the Rio
- 2 Grande River, approximately three-tenths of a mile east
- 3 of the Del Rio POE. They then attempted to stop the flow
- 4 of all migrants illegally crossing the river into the United
- 5 States at that location.
- 6 Within hours of the incident, images and video sur-
- 7 faced on social media that showed multiple Border Patrol
- 8 agents on horseback using their horses to keep several ille-
- 9 gal immigrants from entering the United States after
- 10 crossing the Rio Grande in Del Rio, Texas.
- 11 Extremist liberal activists rushed to judgement and
- 12 falsely accused the agents of "whipping" the illegal immi-
- 13 grants with their horse reins. Some went so far as to make
- 14 the disgusting false equivalency to slavery.
- 15 President Joe Biden publicly repeated the slanderous
- 16 claim saying "To see people treated like they did . . . peo-
- 17 ple being strapped-it's outrageous. I promise you, those
- 18 people will pay".
- 19 Vice President Kamala Harris said "Human beings
- 20 should not be treated that way, and as we all know, it
- 21 also evoked images of some of the worst moments of our
- 22 history where that kind of behavior has been used against
- 23 the indigenous people of our country, has been used
- 24 against African Americans during times of slavery".

- 1 Secretary Mayorkas supported the Biden administra-
- 2 tion's false narrative that Border Patrol agents whipped
- 3 Haitian migrants, even after he had been alerted by subor-
- 4 dinates the narrative was false.
- 5 On September 24, 2021, the Department of Home-
- 6 land Security Assistant Secretary for Public Affairs, Mar-
- 7 sha Espinosa, emailed Secretary Mayorkas a news article
- 8 that said the photographer who took the images did not
- 9 see the agents whipping anyone.
- 10 That same day, Secretary Mayorkas participated in
- 11 a White House press conference during which he publicly
- 12 and falsely slandered these agents. Secretary Mayorkas
- 13 called the images "horrifying" and an example of "sys-
- 14 temic racism".
- 15 A 511-page report by the U.S. Customs and Border
- 16 Protection's Office of Personal Responsibility found "no
- 17 evidence that [Border Patrol agents] involved in this inci-
- 18 dent struck, intentionally or otherwise, any migrant with
- 19 their reins".
- 20 Secretary Mayorkas slandered his own Border Patrol
- 21 agents and TXDPS Troopers involved in this incident,
- 22 contributing to a further decrease in already-low morale
- 23 among agents.
- Wherefore, Alejandro Nicholas Mayorkas, by such
- 25 conduct, warrants impeachment, trial, removal from of-

- 1 fice, and disqualification to hold and enjoy any office of
- $2\,\,$ honor, trust, or profit under the United States.
