FOR AN ACT ENTITLED

1 "An Act relating to the Legislative Ethics Act; and providing for an effective date."

2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

* **Section 1.** AS 24.60.010 is amended by adding a new paragraph to read:

- (9) a fair and open government requires that constituents have unencumbered access to legislators about issues important to the state pursuant to art.

 I, secs. 5 and 6, Constitution of the State of Alaska, which protect the right of a legislator and a constituent to meet and the right of a person to petition the government, and this chapter is not intended to restrict those rights.
 - * **Sec. 2.** AS 24.60.030(e) is amended to read:
- 10 (e) A legislator may not directly, or by authorizing another to act on the legislator's behalf,
 - (1) agree to, threaten to, or state or imply that the legislator will take or withhold a legislative, administrative, or political action, including support for or opposition to a bill, employment, nominations, and appointments, as a result of a person's decision to provide or not provide a political contribution, donate or not

1	donate to a cause favored by the legislator, or provide or not provide a thing of value;
2	(2) state or imply that the legislator will perform or refrain from
3	performing a lawful constituent service as a result of a person's decision to provide or
4	not provide a political contribution, donate or not donate to a cause favored by the
5	legislator, or provide or not provide a thing of value; or
6	(3) unless required by the Uniform Rules of the Alaska State
7	Legislature [EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN (g) OF THIS SECTION OR WHILE
8	PARTICIPATING IN A PUBLIC DISCUSSION OR DEBATE], take or withhold
9	official action or exert official influence that could substantially benefit or harm the

13	(B) BY WHOM THE LEGISLATOR OR A MEMBER OF

25	question before a house of the legislature, if the legislator or the legislator's spouse
