A BILL

To prohibit the provision of foreign assistance to border countries that are not taking adequate measures to stop child pornography from entering the United States.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Stop Exploiting Chil-
- 5 dren Act".

1	SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON FOREIGN ASSISTANCE TO BOR-
2	DER COUNTRIES THAT ARE NOT TAKING ADE
3	QUATE MEASURES TO STOP CHILD PORNOG-
4	RAPHY FROM ENTERING THE UNITED
5	STATES.
6	(a) In General.—Notwithstanding any other provi-
7	sion of law, the President may not provide foreign assist-
8	ance to any country described in subsection (b) that the
9	President determines is not taking adequate measures to
10	stop child pornography from entering the United States.
11	(b) Country Described.—A country described in
12	this subsection is a country that shares an international
13	border with the United States.
14	(c) Definitions.—In this section:
15	(1) CHILD PORNOGRAPHY.—The term "child
16	pornography" has the meaning given the term in
17	section 2256 of title 18, United States Code.
18	(2) Foreign assistance.—The term "foreign
19	assistance" includes grants, loans, guarantees, and
20	other types of financial assistance
