7 Under the securities laws (as such term is defined
8 in section 3(a)(47) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934

(15 U.S.C. 78c)), an issuer may not be required to disclose
 or otherwise provide information with respect to the green house-gas emissions or consumption of the value chain of
 such issuer (commonly known as "Scope 3 emissions").
