3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Commission on Trauma–Informed Care; providing for 4 the composition, chair, and staffing of the Commission; providing that the $\mathbf{5}$ Commission is an independent commission functioning in the Department of Human 6 Services; providing for the purpose of the Commission; requiring the Commission to 7 determine certain procedures; providing for the terms of members of the 8 Commission; requiring the Governor to designate the chair of the Commission; 9 prohibiting a member of the Commission from receiving certain compensation, but 10 authorizing the reimbursement of certain expenses; providing that a majority of 11 members serving on the Commission is a quorum; requiring the Commission to 12 identify certain programs and services; requiring the Commission to assist in the 13development of a certain statewide trauma-responsive strategy; requiring the 14 Commission to establish certain metrics, in collaboration with the Maryland 15Department of Health, related to a certain initiative; requiring the Commission to 16 coordinate and develop, in consultation with the Maryland Department of Health, 17certain training on trauma-informed care; requiring the Commission to disseminate 18 certain information among agencies; requiring the Commission to advise and assist 19 the Governor for a certain purpose; requiring the Commission to report its findings 20and recommendations to the Governor and the General Assembly on or before a 21certain date each year; requiring members of the Commission to participate in a 22certain training each year; requiring certain State agencies to designate certain staff 23members to participate in a certain training each year; requiring certain staff 24members of certain State agencies to perform certain duties in a certain manner each 25year; requiring the Maryland Department of Health to provide certain technical
