AN ACT

To amend the Homeland Security Act of 2002 to require the Department of Homeland Security to develop an engagement strategy with fusion centers, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "DHS Field Engage-
- 5 ment Accountability Act".

1 SEC. 2. ENGAGEMENT STRATEGY WITH FUSION CENTERS. 2 Section 210A of the Homeland Security Act of 2002 3 (6 U.S.C. 124h) is amended by— 4 (1) redesigning subsections (i) and (k) as sub-5 sections (k) and (l), respectively; and 6 (2) inserting after subsection (i) the following 7 new subsection: 8 **Fusion** CENTER **INFORMATION** SHARING 9 STRATEGY.—Not later than one year after the date of the enactment of this subsection, the Secretary shall develop 10 and update at least once every five years a strategy for 11 Department engagement with fusion centers. Such strategy shall be developed and updated in consultation with the heads of intelligence components of the Department, the Chief Privacy Officer of the Department, the Officer for Civil Rights and Civil Liberties of the Department, officials of fusion centers, officers designated as Homeland Security Advisors, and the heads of other relevant agen-19 cies, as appropriate. Such strategy shall include the fol-20 lowing: 21 "(1) Specific goals and objectives for sharing 22 information and engaging with fusion centers— 23 "(A) through the direct deployment of per-24 sonnel from intelligence components of the De-

partment;

18	sonnel, including field personnel assigned to one cen-
19	ter and field personnel assigned to multiple centers;

21	(2) publish and disseminate performance
22	metrics, taking into account, as appropriate, regional
23	and threat diversity, for—

1	(A) field personnel from the Office of Intel-
2	ligence and Analysis assigned to an individual
3	fusion center;
4	(B) field personnel from the Office of Intel-
5	ligence and Analysis assigned to multiple fusion
6	centers; and
7	(C) Regional Directors of the Office of Intel-
8	ligence and Analysis to ensure accountability for
9	monitoring all field personnel under the super-
10	vision of such Regional Directors.
11	(b) Training.—In consultation with the Chief Infor-
12	mation Officer, the Under Secretary for Intelligence and
13	Analysis shall develop and implement a formalized training
14	module for fusion center personnel regarding the classified
15	Homeland Secure Data Network, or any successor system.
16	(c) Fusion Center Defined.—In this section, the
17	term "fusion center" has the meaning given such term in
18	section 210A(k) of the Homeland Security Act of 2002, as
19	so redesignated by section 2.
20	SEC. 4. DHS COMPONENT USAGE OF THE HOMELAND SECU-
21	RITY INFORMATION NETWORK.
22	(a) In General.—Not later than 180 days after the
23	date of the enactment of this Act, the Chief Information Of-
24	ficer, in consultation with the Under Secretary for Intel-
25	ligence and Analysis, and in accordance with the functions

- 1 and responsibilities assigned to the Under Secretary under
- 2 title II of the Homeland Security Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C.
- 3 121 et seq.), shall—
- 4 (1) develop policies and metrics to ensure effec-
- 5 tive use by components of the Department of the un-
- 6 classified Homeland Security Information Network
- 7 (referred to in this section as "HSIN"), or any suc-
- 8 cessor system; and
- 9 (2) develop policies for posting unclassified prod-
- 10 ucts on HSIN, or any successor system.
- 11 (b) Technical Enhancements.—The Chief Informa-
- 12 tion Officer, in consultation with the Chief Intelligence Offi-
- 13 cer, shall assess and implement, as appropriate, technical
- 14 enhancements to HSIN to improve usability, including
- 15 search functionality, data analysis, and collaboration capa-
- 16 bilities.
- 17 **SEC. 5. REPORT.**
- Not later than 18 months after the date of the enact-
- 19 ment of this Act, the Secretary of Homeland Security shall
- 20 submit a report to the Committee on Homeland Security
- 21 and Governmental Affairs of the Senate, the Select Com-
- 22 mittee on Intelligence of the Senate, the Committee on
- 23 Homeland Security of the House of Representatives, and
- 24 the Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence of the
