BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. (A) As used in this section: 7 (1) "Eligible offense" means an offense under any of the 8 following Revised Code sections if the offense, an essential 9 element of the offense, the basis of the charge, or any 10 underlying offense did not involve alcohol, a drug of abuse, 11 combination thereof, or a deadly weapon: 2151.354, 2152.19, 12 2152.21, 2907.24, 2913.02, 4507.20, 4509.101, 4509.17, 4509.24, 13 4509.40, 4510.037, 4510.05, 4510.06, 4510.15, 4510.22, 4510.23, 14 4510.31, 4510.32, 4511.203, 4511.205, 4511.251, 4511.75, 15 4549.02, 4549.021, and 5743.99. 16
