## Department of Health and Mental Hygiene – Distribution of Tobacco Products to Minors – Prohibition and Enforcement

4 FOR the purpose of prohibiting certain persons from distributing certain tobacco products,  $\mathbf{5}$ certain paraphernalia, or certain coupons to a minor, with certain exceptions; 6 providing that a person who violates a certain provision of this Act is subject to 7 certain civil penalties; establishing a certain defense in a prosecution for a certain 8 violation; providing that a county health officer, or a designee of a county health officer, may issue a certain civil citation for a violation of a certain provision of this 9 10 Act; requiring certain civil citations to include certain information and to be 11 processed in a certain manner; providing for a certain election to stand trial; 12 requiring the District Court to remit certain collected penalties in a certain manner; 13providing that adjudication of a violation of a certain provision of this Act is not a 14 criminal conviction for any purpose; requiring the Comptroller's Office to provide 15certain information to the Prevention and Health Promotion Administration each year; requiring the Comptroller's Office to provide certain information to the General 16Assembly on or before a certain date each year; requiring local health departments 17to report certain violations to the Comptroller's Office; requiring the Department of 18 19Health and Mental Hygiene, in collaboration and consultation with certain agencies, 20to develop certain strategies; requiring the Department to report on the development 21of certain strategies and certain training and assistance on or before a certain date 22each year; defining a certain term; providing for the application of certain provisions 23of this Act; and generally relating to prohibitions on the distribution of tobacco 24products to minors.
