A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Workgroup on Establishing a Science and Technology Best Practices and**
3 **Innovation Network**

4 FOR the purpose of establishing the Workgroup on Establishing a Science and Technology
5 Best Practices and Innovation Network; providing for the composition, chair, and
6 staffing of the Workgroup; prohibiting a member of the Workgroup from receiving
7 certain compensation, but authorizing the reimbursement of certain expenses;
8 requiring the Workgroup to study and make recommendations regarding certain
9 matters; requiring the Workgroup to report its findings and recommendations to the
10 Governor and the General Assembly on or before a certain date; providing for the
11 termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Workgroup on Establishing a
12 Science and Technology Best Practices and Innovation Network.

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
14 That:

15 (a) There is a Workgroup on Establishing a Science and Technology Best
16 Practices and Innovation Network.

17 (b) The Workgroup consists of the following members:

18 (1) one member of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the President of
19 the Senate;

20 (2) one member of the House of Delegates, appointed by the Speaker of the
21 House;

22 (3) the Secretary of the Environment, or the Secretary's designee;

23 (4) the Secretary of Transportation, or the Secretary's designee;

(5) the Secretary of Higher Education, or the Secretary's designee;

(6) the Secretary of Energy, or the Secretary's designee;

(7) the Secretary of Commerce, or the Secretary's designee;

(8) the Secretary of Agriculture, or the Secretary's designee;

(9) the Executive Director of the Maryland Health Care Commission, or the Executive Director's designee;

(10) the Executive Director of the Maryland Technology Development Corporation, or the Executive Director's designee;

(11) three representatives of the University System of Maryland, including:

(i) one representative designated by the Chancellor of the University System of Maryland;

(ii) one representative designated by the President of the University of Maryland Baltimore County; and

(iii) one representative designated by the President of the University of Maryland Center for Environmental Science;

(12) one representative of Morgan State University, designated by the President of Morgan State University;

(13) one representative of St. Mary's College of Maryland, designated by the President of St. Mary's College of Maryland;

(14) one representative of the Maryland Independent College and University Association (MICUA), designated by the President of MICUA;

(15) the Executive Director of the Maryland Education Development Collaborative, or the Executive Director's designee;

(16) the Executive Director of the Maryland Association of Community Colleges, or the Executive Director's designee; and

(17) the following members, appointed by the Governor:

(i) two individuals from the private sector with expertise in current developments in science;

(ii) two individuals from the private sector with expertise in current developments in technology; and

(iii) two individuals from the private sector with expertise in current developments in industry.

(c) The Workgroup shall elect a chair from among its members.

(d) The University of Maryland Baltimore County shall provide staff for the Workgroup.

(e) A member of the Workgroup:

(1) may not receive compensation as a member of the Workgroup; but

(2) is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard State Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget.

(f) The Workgroup shall:

(1) identify and analyze options for establishing and maintaining a network of experts in science, technology, and industry to:

(i) facilitate voluntary collaboration;

(ii) facilitate the open exchange of state-of-the-art and evidence-based data and information;

(iii) inform State policy and practices; and

(iv) promote solution development and decision making based on sound science, innovation, and best practices;

(2) identify and evaluate methods for:

(i) establishing a digital or virtual referral network of experts in science, technology, and industry;

(ii) registering expert participants; and

(iii) making network expertise available to the public;

(3) examine the costs of developing and maintaining a network of experts in science, technology, and industry; and

(4) make recommendations regarding the establishment of a science and technology best practices and innovation network.

(g) On or before December 1, 2020, the Workgroup shall report its findings and

1 recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2-1257 of the State
2 Government Article, the General Assembly.

3 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
4 1, 2020. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and, at the end of June 30, 2021, this
5 Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no
6 further force and effect.
