# Office of the Attorney General – Firearm Crime, *Injuries, Fatalities, and Crime Firearms* – Study

FOR the purpose of requiring the Office of the Attorney General to study and identify 4 certain information relating to certain firearm crimes, *injuries*, *fatalities*, and crime  $\mathbf{5}$ 6 firearms; requiring all State and local law enforcement agencies and other 7 governmental units to provide the Office of the Attorney General with certain 8 information; requiring the Office of the Attorney General to report certain findings 9 and conclusions to the Governor and the General Assembly on or before certain dates; defining a certain terms; providing for the termination of this Act; and 10 generally relating to crimes involving firearms, injuries and fatalities caused by 11 12firearms, and crime firearms.

It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and 7 months and, at the end of 10 December 31, 2022, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall 11 be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
