14	Section 1. Section 28-1-4, Code of Alabama 1975, is

17	"(a) The words and phrases used in this section
18	shall have the meanings ascribed to them in Section 28-3-1 $\frac{1}{2}$
19	any acts amendatory thereof, supplementary thereto or

21	"(b) <del>It</del> <u>Except as provided in subsection (c), it</u>
22	shall be unlawful for <u>any</u> common <del>or permit carriers, operators</del>

11 "(d) Any beer or wine delivered to an individual 12 pursuant to this section shall not exceed, by volume, the 13 equivalent of 48 12-ounce containers of beer and six 14 750-milliliter bottles of wine in any single 24-hour period.

15 "(c) Any (e) A violation of subsection (a) of this 16 section shall be a misdemeanor, punishable as provided in 17 paragraph <u>subdivision</u> (1) of subsection (b) of Section 18 28-3A-25.

19 "(d) All laws or parts of law which conflict or are 20 inconsistent with this section are hereby repealed, provided, 21 however, the provisions of Section 28-1-3 are excluded."

22 Section 2. (a) Any person, limited liability 23 company, or partnership that is registered to do business in 24 this state, regardless of whether the ownership of the 25 business entity is based in the State of Alabama or outside 26 the State of Alabama, may apply for and be issued a delivery 27 service license that authorizes the licensee to deliver beer

and wine from a retail premises licensed to sell beer or wine for off-premises consumption to an individual in this state who is at least 21 years of age for personal use and not for resale.

5 (b) In order to receive a license, an applicant 6 shall do all of the following:

7 (1) File an application with the Alcoholic Beverage8 Control Board.

9 (2) Pay a non-refundable filing fee of one hundred 10 dollars (\$100), and a license fee of one thousand dollars 11 (\$1,000).

12 (3) Provide to the board a sample contract that the 13 applicant intends to enter into with a retailer for the 14 delivery of beer or wine, unless the applicant is the 15 retailer.

16 (4) Provide an attestation that the applicant is 21
17 years of age or older and has not been convicted of a felony
18 or a misdemeanor for a violation of Section 28-3A-25(a)(3),
19 Code of Alabama 1975.

(5) Provide proof of a general liability insurance
 policy in an amount no less than five million dollars per
 occurrence.

(6) Provide an outline for an internal training and
 certification program for delivery personnel that addresses
 topics such as identifying underage individuals, intoxicated
 individuals, and fake or altered identification.

27 (c) A delivery service licensee:

(1) May contract with any retailer licensed to sell
 beer or wine for off-premises consumption for the purpose of
 delivering beer or wine.

4 (2) May use its own employees or independent
5 contractors who are at least 21 years of age to deliver beer
6 and wine under this section, provided all delivery agents are
7 trained and certified consistent with the training program
8 submitted to the board as required by subdivision (6) of
9 subsection (b).

10 (3) May facilitate orders by telephone, Internet, or
11 by other electronic means for the sale and delivery of beer or
12 wine under this section.

13 (4) May deliver only sealed containers of beer or 14 wine .

(5) Shall obtain from the customer a confirmation
that he or she is at least 21 years of age at the time the
order is placed.

18 (6) For any delivery in a sealed package there shall
19 be a stamp, print, or label on the outside of the sealed
20 package to indicate in readily apparent font or type that the
21 package contains alcohol and that the signature of an
22 individual at least 21 years of age is required for delivery.

(7) Shall require the recipient, at the time of
delivery, to provide valid photo identification that conforms
to Alcoholic Beverage Control Board rules and that verifies
that he or she is at least 21 years of age and sign for the
delivery.

(8) Shall possess identification scanning software
 technology or a state-of-the-art alternative available at the
 point of delivery that verifies the recipient is at least 21
 years of age and retains the recipient's name, date of birth,
 and signature.

6 (9) Shall provide each delivery service agent either 7 a printed copy of the delivery service license or an 8 electronic copy indicating the delivery service licensee's 9 name and number which shall be available for inspection, upon 10 request.

(10) Shall return all beer and wine to the retailer 11 12 if the recipient is under the age of 21 years, appears 13 intoxicated, fails to provide proof of identification, fails or refuses to sign for delivery, fails to complete the 14 15 identification scanning software process or state-of-the-art alternative, declines to accept the delivery of beer or wine, 16 17 or if any circumstances in the delivery environment indicate 18 illegal conduct, overconsumption, or an otherwise unsafe environment for the consumption of alcohol. 19

(11) May deliver through a dry county but may not
 deliver to an individual residing in a dry municipality.

(12) May not deliver any alcoholic beverage to any
 residence hall within the boundaries of any institution of
 higher learning, including any college, university, community
 college, technical college, or junior college.

(13) Shall report, at the direction of the board,
 the total amount of beer and wine directly delivered to
 residents in the state during the preceding calendar year.

4 (14) Shall permit the board or the Department of
5 Revenue to perform an audit of the licensee's records upon
6 request.

7 (15) Shall be deemed to have consented to the
8 jurisdiction of the board or any law enforcement agency and
9 the Alabama courts concerning enforcement of this section and
10 any related laws or rules.

(d) A delivery service licensee may renew its license with the board by paying annually a renewal fee of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) and otherwise complying with the renewal process set forth in Section 28-3A-5, Code of Alabama 15 1975.

(e) Nothing in this section shall be construed to
require a technology services company to obtain a delivery
service license if the company does not employ or contract
with delivery agents, but merely provides software or a
digital network application that connects consumers and
licensed retailers for the delivery of alcoholic beverages
from a licensed retailer.

(f) The board may enforce the requirements of this section to suspend or revoke a delivery service license by the same administrative proceedings that apply to alcoholic beverage licenses, and the board may accept payment of a fine in lieu of suspension or revocation, such payments to be
 determined by rule adopted by the board.

3 (g) The board may adopt rules pursuant to the
4 Alabama Administrative Procedure Act to implement this
5 section.

6 Section 3. This act shall become effective on the 7 first day of the third month following its passage and 8 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
