The House Committee on Health and Human Services offers the following substitute to HB 646:

## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 2 of Title 31 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the
- 2 Department of Community Health, so as to reinstate a pilot program to provide coverage for
- 3 bariatric surgical procedures for the treatment and management of obesity and related
- 4 conditions; to provide for automatic repeal; to provide for related matters; to repeal
- 5 conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

## 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 SECTION 1.

- 8 Chapter 2 of Title 31 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the Department
- 9 of Community Health, is amended by revising Code Section 31-2-12, relating to a pilot
- 10 program to provide coverage for bariatric surgical procedures for treatment of obesity and
- related conditions, definitions, eligibility, requirements, and an evaluation report, as follows:
- 12 "31-2-12.
- 13 (a) As used in this Code section, the term 'state health insurance plan' means:
- 14 (1) The state employees' health insurance plan established pursuant to Article 1 of
- 15 Chapter 18 of Title 45;
- 16 (2) The health insurance plan for public school teachers established pursuant to Subpart
- 2 of Part 6 of Article 17 of Chapter 2 of Title 20; and
- 18 (3) The health insurance plan for public school employees established pursuant to
- 19 Subpart 3 of Part 6 of Article 17 of Chapter 2 of Title 20.
- 20 (b) Beginning January 1, 2016, the <u>The</u> department shall conduct a two-year three-year
- 21 pilot program beginning January 1, 2019, to provide coverage for the treatment and
- 22 management of obesity and related conditions under a state health insurance plan. The
- 23 <u>department shall be authorized to enter into an agreement with a postsecondary institution</u>
- 24 <u>in this state for pilot program management, data collection, patient engagement, and other</u>
- 25 <u>activities related to the pilot program.</u> The pilot program will provide benefits for

26 medically necessary bariatric procedures for participants selected for inclusion in the pilot

- program.
- 28 (c) Participation in the pilot program shall be limited to no more than  $\frac{75}{100}$  individuals
- 29 per year, to be selected in a manner determined by the department. Any person who has
- 30 elected coverage under a state health insurance plan shall be eligible to be selected to
- participate in the pilot program in accordance with criteria established by the department
- which shall include, but not be limited to:
- 33 (1) Participation in a state health insurance plan for at least 12 months;
- 34 (2) Completion of a health risk assessment through a state health insurance plan;
- 35 (3) A body mass index of:
- 36 (A) Greater than 40; or
- 37 (B) Greater than 35 with one or more <del>co-morbidities</del> <u>comorbidities</u> such as diabetes,
- 38 hypertension, gastro-esophageal gastroesophageal reflux disease, sleep apnea, or
- 39 asthma;
- 40 (4) Consent to provide personal and medical information to a state health insurance plan;
- 41 (5) Non-tobacco user;
- 42 (6) No other primary group health coverage or primary coverage with Medicare; and
- 43 (7) Must have been covered under a state health insurance plan for two years
- immediately prior to the pilot program and must express an intent to continue coverage
- under such state health insurance plan for two years following the approved surgical
- 46 procedure date.
- 47 (d) Eligible individuals must apply to participate in the pilot program. The individual and
- 48 his or her physician shall complete and submit an obesity treatment program application
- 49 to the department no later than February 1 for each year of the pilot program. The
- department's contracted health insurance carrier shall review the criteria contained in
- subsection (c) of this Code section to determine qualified applicants for the pilot program.
- 52 (e) The selected participants shall be eligible to receive a multi-disciplinary
- 53 <u>multidisciplinary</u> health evaluation at a facility located within the State of Georgia which
- is designated by the American Society for Metabolic and Bariatric Surgery as a Bariatric
- 55 Surgery Center of Excellence. The bariatric surgical procedures covered in the pilot
- 56 program are:
- 57 (1) Gastric band;
- 58 (2) Laparoscopic sleeve gastrectomy; and
- 59 (3) Rouen-Y Roux-en-Y gastric bypass.
- The participants shall use the department's contracted health insurance carrier to enroll in
- a case management program and to receive prior authorization for a surgical procedure
- provided pursuant to the pilot program. The health insurance carrier shall provide case

63 management and patient follow-up services. Benefits for a bariatric surgical procedure

- under the pilot program shall be provided only when the surgical procedure is performed
- at a Center of Excellence within the State of Georgia.
- 66 (f) All health care services provided pursuant to the pilot program shall be subject to the
- health insurance carrier's plan of benefits and policy provisions. Complications that arise
- after the discharge date are subject to the health insurance carrier's plan of benefits and
- 69 policy provisions.
- 70 (g) Participants must agree to comply with any and all terms and conditions of the pilot
- 71 program including, but not limited to, participation and reporting requirements.
- 72 Participation requirements shall include a 12 month postsurgery case management
- program. Each participant must also agree to comply with any and all requests by the
- department for postsurgical medical and productivity information, and such agreement
- shall survive his or her participation in a state health insurance plan.
- 76 (h) A panel shall review the results and outcomes of the pilot program beginning six
- 77 months after program initiation and shall conduct subsequent reviews every six months for
- 78 the remainder of the pilot program. The panel shall be composed of the following
- 79 members, appointed by the Governor:
- 80 (1) A representative of a state health insurance plan;
- 81 (2) A representative of the state contracted health insurance carrier or carriers providing
- coverage under the pilot program; and
- 83 (3) At least two physicians who carry a certification by the American Society for
- 84 Metabolic and Bariatric Surgery.
- 85 (i) The department shall provide a final report by December 15 of the last year of the pilot
- program June 30, 2022, to the chairpersons of the House Committee on Health and Human
- 87 Services, the Senate Health and Human Services Committee, the House Committee on
- Appropriations, and the Senate Appropriations Committee. The report shall include, at a
- 89 minimum:
- 90 (1) Whether patients in the pilot <u>program</u> have experienced:
- 91 (A) A reduction in body mass index, and if so, the average amount of reduction; or
- 92 (B) The reduction or elimination of <del>co-morbidities</del> comorbidities, and if so, which
- 93 <u>co-morbidities</u> comorbidities were reduced or eliminated;
- 94 (2) The total number of individuals who applied to participate in the pilot program;
- 95 (3) The total number of participants who enrolled in the pilot program;
- 96 (4) The average cost of each procedure conducted under the pilot program, including
- gastric band, laparoscopic sleeve gastrectomy, and Rouen-Y Roux-en-Y gastric bypass;

98 (5) The total cost of each participant's annual health care costs prior to the surgical 99 procedure and for each of the subsequent post-procedure years for the three years 100 following the surgical procedure; and

- 101 (6) The percentage of participants still employed by the state 12 months following the surgical procedure and 24 months following the surgical procedure, respectively.
- 103 (j) This Code section shall stand repealed on December 31, 2018 June 30, 2022."

## 104 **SECTION 2.**

All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
