

## 118TH CONGRESS H.R. 7109

## A BILL

To require a citizenship question on the decennial census, to require reporting on certain census statistics, and to modify apportionment of Representatives to be based on United States citizens instead of all persons.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Equal Representation
- 5 Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. CITIZENSHIP STATUS ON DECENNIAL CENSUS.
- 7 (a) In General.—Section 141 of title 13, United
- 8 States Code, is amended—

1 (1) by redesignating subsection (g) as sub-2 section (h); and (2) by inserting after subsection (f) the fol-3 4 lowing: 5 "(g)(1) In conducting the 2030 decennial census and each decennial census thereafter, the Secretary shall include in any questionnaire distributed or otherwise used for the purpose of determining the total population by 8 States a checkbox or other similar option for the respond-10 ent to indicate, for the respondent and for each of the members of the household of the respondent, whether that individual is— 12 "(A) a citizen of the United States; 13 14 "(B) a national of the United States but not a 15 citizen of the United States; "(C) an alien lawfully residing in the United 16 17 States; or 18 "(D) an alien unlawfully residing in the United 19 States. "(2) Not later than 120 days after completion of a 20 21 decennial census of the population under subsection (a), the Secretary shall make publicly available the number of persons per State, disaggregated by each of the 4 categories described in subparagraphs (A) through (D) of

- 1 paragraph (1), as tabulated in accordance with this sec-
- 2 tion.".
- 3 SEC. 3. EXCLUSION OF NONCITIZENS FROM NUMBER OF
- 4 PERSONS USED TO DETERMINE APPORTION-
- 5 MENT OF REPRESENTATIVES AND NUMBER
- 6 OF ELECTORAL VOTES.
- 7 (a) Exclusion.—Section 22(a) of the Act entitled
- 8 "An Act to provide for the fifteenth and subsequent decen-
- 9 nial censuses and to provide for an apportionment of Rep-
- 10 resentatives in Congress", approved June 18, 1929 (2)
- 11 U.S.C. 2a(a)), is amended by inserting after "not taxed"
- 12 the following: "and individuals who are not citizens of the
- 13 United States".
- 14 (b) Effective Date.—The amendment made by
- 15 subsection (a) shall apply with respect to the apportion-
- 16 ment of Representatives carried out pursuant to the de-
- 17 cennial census conducted during 2030 and any succeeding
- 18 decennial census.
- 19 SEC. 4. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE.
- If any provision of this Act or amendment made by
- 21 this Act, or the application thereof to any person or cir-
- 22 cumstance, is held to be unconstitutional, the remainder
- 23 of the provisions of this Act and amendments made by
- 24 this Act, and the application of the provision or amend-

- 1 ment to any other person or circumstance, shall not be
- 2 affected.

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
