A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Code Section 20-3-519.2 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 eligibility requirements for a HOPE scholarship, so as to extend the period during which a
- 3 student may receive a HOPE scholarship; to provide for requirements for continued
- 4 eligibility for certain students; to amend Code Section 20-3-519.5 of the Official Code of
- 5 Georgia Annotated, relating to eligibility requirements for a HOPE grant, so as to provide
- 6 additional courses of study for an associate's degree eligible for a HOPE grant; to extend the
- 7 period of eligibility for a HOPE grant; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting
- 8 laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

10 SECTION 1.

11 Code Section 20-3-519.2 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to eligibility

12 requirements for a HOPE scholarship, is amended by revising paragraph (3) of subsection

13 (d) as follows:

"(3) Beginning with those students receiving a HOPE scholarship for the first time on or after July 1, 2011, seven 15 years from a student's graduation from high school or the equivalent thereof as determined by the Georgia Student Finance Commission in its rules and regulations; provided, however, that for a student who serves in the military during such seven-year 15 year period, any such active duty military service served as active duty shall not count against the seven-year 15 year period nor constitute a failure to be enrolled. A student that is ineligible to receive a HOPE scholarship pursuant to this paragraph but who received the HOPE scholarship during the 2010-2011 academic year shall continue to be eligible for the HOPE scholarship until June 30, 2015, as long as such student meets all other eligibility requirements, including, but not limited to, paragraphs (1) and (2) of this subsection. Any student enrolled full-time or part-time in a college or university eligible for HOPE scholarship under the provisions of this paragraph as long as

such student meets all other eligibility requirements, including, but not limited to, the requirements provided for in paragraphs (1) and (2) of this subsection."

Code Section 20-3-519.5 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to eligibility requirements for a HOPE grant, is amended by revising subsection (a.1) as follows:

- "(a.1) Notwithstanding subsection (a) of this Code section, a student seeking an associate associate's degree at a branch of the Technical College System of Georgia who received a high school diploma pursuant to Code Section 20-2-149.2 through completion of:
- 35 (1) A technical college diploma program and all postsecondary academic education and 36 technical education and training prerequisites for any state, national, or industry 37 occupational certifications or licenses required to work in the field; or
- 38 (2) At least two technical college certificate of credit programs in one specific career 39 pathway and all postsecondary academic education and technical education and training 40 prerequisites for any state, national, or industry occupational certifications or licenses 41 required to work in the field as determined by the Technical College System of Georgia; 42 or

43 (3) An associate's degree and all postsecondary academic education and technical 44 education and training prerequisites for any state, national, or industry occupational 45 certifications or licenses required to work in the field as determined by the Technical 46 College System of Georgia; provided, however, that at the time of commencement of the 47 student's associate degree program, such associate's degree shall be identified as one 48 expected to lead to a minimum livable wage one year after graduation as reported by the Office of Student Achievement under the provisions of paragraph (3) or (4) of subsection 49 50 (a) of Code Section 20-14-27 unless the associate degree program matriculates to a 51 bachelor degree program in the university system

shall be eligible for a HOPE grant as long as he or she meets the residency requirements set forth in subsection (a) of Code Section 20-3-519.1 and the requirements of paragraphs (1) and (2) of subsection (a) of this Code section. The HOPE grant shall be used to cover the cost of up to 30 60 degree hours to obtain an associate associate's degree."
