## A BILL

To establish a microplastics pilot program, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- This Act may be cited as the "Making Investments
- 5 in Curbing the Ruinous Output of Plastics Act of 2020"
- 6 or the "MICRO Plastics Act of 2020".
- 7 SEC. 2. MICROPLASTICS PILOT PROGRAM.
- 8 (a) Establishment.—The Administrator of the En-
- 9 vironmental Protection Agency (referred to in this section
- 10 as the "Administrator") shall establish a pilot program

(referred to in this section as the "pilot program") to test the efficacy and cost effectiveness of tools, technologies, 3 and techniques— 4 (1) to remove microplastics from the environ-5 ment; and 6 (2) to prevent the release of microplastics into 7 the environment. 8 (b) REQUIREMENTS.—In carrying out the pilot program, the Administrator shall include the testing of— 10 (1) natural infrastructure; 11 (2) green infrastructure (as defined in section 12 502 of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act (33 13 U.S.C. 1362)); and 14 mechanical removal systems (3)(such as 15 pumps) and filtration technologies. (c) Eligible Pilot Program Locations.—In car-16 rying out the pilot program, the Administrator may carry 17 18 out projects located in— 19 (1) stormwater systems; 20 (2) wastewater treatment facilities; 21 (3) drinking water systems; and 22 (4) ports, harbors, inland waterways, estuaries, 23 and marine environments.

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1	(d) Outreach.—In determining selection criteria
2	and projects to carry out under the pilot program, the Ad-
3	ministrator shall conduct outreach to—
4	(1) the Interagency Marine Debris Coordinating
5	Committee established under section 5(a) of the Ma-
6	rine Debris Act (33 U.S.C. 1954(a)); and
7	(2) stakeholders and experts in the applicable
8	field, as determined by the Administrator.
9	(e) Report.—Not later than 180 days after the date
10	of enactment of this Act, the Administrator shall submit
11	to Congress a report describing the outreach conducted
12	under subsection (d).

13 (f) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There 14 are authorized to be appropriated such sums as are nec-15 essary to carry out this section.

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
