A BILL

To state the policy of the United States with respect to the expansion of cooperation with allies and partners in the Indo-Pacific region and Europe regarding the People's Republic of China.

- 4 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.

- 6 (1) Congress supports the finding on the Peo7 ple's Republic of China articulated in the 2018 Na8 tional Defense Strategy and the 2017 National Se9 curity Strategy.
 - (2) The People's Republic of China is leveraging military modernization, influence operations, and predatory economics to coerce neighboring countries to reorder the Indo-Pacific region to the advantage of the People's Republic of China.
 - (3) As the People's Republic of China continues its economic and military ascendance, asserting power through a whole of government long-term strategy, the People's Republic of China will continue to pursue a military modernization program that seeks Indo-Pacific regional hegemony in the near-term and displacement of the United States to achieve global preeminence in the future.
 - (4) The most far-reaching objective of the defense strategy of the United States is to set the military relationship between the United States and the

- People's Republic of China on a path toward transparency and nonaggression.

1 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.

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- (1) Congress supports the finding on the People's Republic of China articulated in the 2018 National Defense Strategy and the 2017 National Security Strategy.
- (2) The Asia Reassurance Initiative Act of 2018 (Public Law 115–409) established the policy of the United States "to develop and commit to a long-term strategic vision and a comprehensive, multifaceted, and principled United States policy for the Indo-Pa-cific region" so as to advance United States national security, economic, human rights, and other regional interests, and for such purposes, Congress has author-ized appropriate funding.
 - (3) The People's Republic of China is leveraging military modernization, influence operations, and predatory economics to coerce neighboring countries to reorder the Indo-Pacific region to the advantage of the People's Republic of China.
 - (4) As the People's Republic of China continues its economic and military ascendance, asserting power through a whole of government long-term strategy, the People's Republic of China will continue to pursue a military modernization program that seeks Indo-Pacific regional hegemony in the near-term and

- displacement of the United States to achieve global 1 2 preeminence in the future.
- (5) The most far-reaching objective of the defense 3 strategy of the United States is to set the military re-5 lationship between the United States and the People's 6 Republic of China on a path toward transparency 7 and nonaggression.
