A BILL

To amend title 5, United States Code, to prevent fraud by representative payees.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Representative Payee

5 Fraud Prevention Act of 2019".

6 SEC. 2. REPRESENTATIVE PAYEE FRAUD.

7 (a) DEFINITIONS.—

8 (1) CSRS.—Section 8331 of title 5, United

9 States Code, is amended—

1	(A) in paragraph (31), by striking "and"
2	at the end;
3	(B) in paragraph (32), by striking the pe-
4	riod at the end and inserting "; and"; and
5	(C) by adding at the end the following:
6	"(33) "representative payee" means a person
7	(including an organization) designated under section
8	8345(e)(1) to receive payments on behalf of a minor
9	or an individual mentally incompetent or under other
10	legal disability.".
11	(2) FERS.—Section 8401 of title 5, United
12	States Code, is amended—
13	(A) in paragraph (37), by striking "and"
14	at the end;
15	(B) in paragraph (38), by striking the pe-
16	riod at the end and inserting "; and"; and
17	(C) by adding at the end the following:

20	8466(c)(1) to receive payments on behalf of a minor
21	or an individual mentally incompetent or under other
22	legal disability.".
23	(b) Embezzlement or Conversion.—

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1	(1) CSRS.—Subchapter III of chapter 83 of
2	title 5, United States Code, is amended by inserting
3	after section 8345 the following:
4	"§8345a. Embezzlement or conversion of payments
5	"(a) Embezzling and Conversion Generally.—
6	"(1) IN GENERAL.—It shall be unlawful for a
7	representative payee to embezzle or in any manner
8	convert all or any part of the amounts received from
9	payments received as a representative payee to a use
10	other than for the use and benefit of the minor or
11	individual on whose behalf such payments were re-
12	ceived.
13	"(2) REVOCATION.—If the Office determines
14	that a representative payee has embezzled or con-
15	verted payments as described in paragraph (1) , the
16	Office shall promptly—
17	"(A) revoke the certification for payment
18	of benefits to the representative payee; and
19	"(B) certify payment—
20	"(i) to another representative payee;
21	OF
22	"(ii) if the interest of the individual
23	under this title would be served thereby, to
24	the individual.

"(b) PENALTY.—Any person who violates subsection
 (a)(1) shall be fined under title 18, imprisoned for not
 more than 5 years, or both.".

7 "§ 8466a. Embezzlement or conversion of payments

"(a) Embezzling and Conversion Generally.— 8 9 "(1) IN GENERAL.—It shall be unlawful for a 10 representative payee to embezzle or in any manner 11 convert all or any part of the amounts received from 12 payments received as a representative payee to a use 13 other than for the use and benefit of the minor or 14 individual on whose behalf such payments were re-15 ceived.

"(2) REVOCATION.—If the Office determines
that a representative payee has embezzled or converted payments as described in paragraph (1), the
Office shall promptly—

20 "(A) revoke the certification for payment
21 of benefits to the representative payee; and
22 "(B) certify payment—
23 "(i) to another representative payee;

or

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1	"(ii) if the interest of the individual
2	under this title would be served thereby, to
3	the individual.
4	"(b) PENALTY.—Any person who violates subsection
5	(a)(1) shall be fined under title 18, imprisoned for not
6	more than 5 years, or both.".

22	(B) in the first sentence, by inserting "(in-

2	zation)" after "any person"; and
3	(ii) by inserting "and may appro-
4	priately receive such payments on behalf of
5	the claimant" after "claimant" the second
6	place it appears; and
7	(D) by adding at the end the following:

18	ability under subsection (e) if that person has been con-
19	victed of a violation of—
20	"(1) section 8345a or 8466a;
21	((2) section 208 or 1632 of the Social Security
22	Act $(42 \text{ USC} 408 13832)$, or

- 22 Act (42 U.S.C. 408, 1383a); or
- 23 "(3) section 6101 of title 38.".

(2) FERS.—Section 8466 of title 5, United
 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the
 following:

4 "(d) The Office may not authorize a person to receive
5 payments on behalf of a minor or individual of legal dis6 ability under subsection (c) if that person has been con7 victed of a violation of—

8 "(1) section 8345a or 8466a;

9 "(2) section 208 or 1632 of the Social Security
10 Act (42 U.S.C. 408, 1383a); or

11 "(3) section 6101 of title 38.".

12 SEC. 3. IMPLEMENTATION.

(a) AUTHORIZATION OF PAYMENTS.—Section
8348(a)(1)(B) of title 5, United States Code, is amended
by inserting "in administering fraud prevention under sections 8345, 8345a, 8466, and 8466a of this title," after
"8465(b) of this title,".

(b) REGULATIONS.—Not later than 1 year after the
19 date of enactment of this Act, the Office of Personnel
20 Management—

(1) shall promulgate regulations to carry outthe amendments made by section 2; and

(2) may promulgate additional regulations relating to the administration of the representative
payee program.

1 SEC. 4. EFFECTIVE DATE.

2	The amendments made by section 2—
3	(1) shall take effect on the date of the enact-
4	ment of this Act; and
5	(2) apply on and after the effective date of the
6	regulations promulgated under section $3(b)(1)$.

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
