## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Code Section 31-7-12.2 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 regulation and licensing of assisted living communities, legislative intent, definitions,
- 3 procedures, and requirements for medication aides, so as to authorize certified medication
- 4 aides to administer medications to residents under hospice care pursuant to a physician's
- 5 written orders; to amend Code Section 43-26-12, relating to exceptions to the licensure of
- 6 registered professional nurses, so as to provide that the administration of medication by
- 7 certified medication aides under specific criteria does not require licensure as a registered
- 8 professional nurse; to provide for related matters; to provide for an effective date; to repeal
- 9 conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

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## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

11 SECTION 1.

- 12 Code Section 31-7-12.2 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to regulation and
- 13 licensing of assisted living communities, legislative intent, definitions, procedures, and
- requirements for medication aides, is amended by revising subsection (g) as follows:
- (g)(1) An assisted living community may employ certified medication aides for the
- purpose of performing the technical aspects of the administration of certain medications
- in accordance with this subsection. An assisted living community that employs one or
- more certified medication aides must have a safe medication and treatment administration
- system that meets all the requirements of this subsection.
- 20 (2) The department shall establish and maintain a medication aide registry containing the
- 21 names of each individual in Georgia who is certified by the department as a medication
- 22 aide. An assisted living community may not employ an individual as a medication aide
- 23 unless the <u>such</u> individual is listed in the medication aide registry in good standing.
- 24 (3) An applicant for certification as a medication aide shall meet the following
- 25 qualifications:

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(A) Be a Georgia certified nurse aide with current certification in good standing;

27 (B) Have successfully completed a state-approved state approved medication aide 28 training program administered by a Georgia licensed registered nurse, pharmacist, or 29 physician;

- (C) Have successfully passed, with a minimum passing score of 80 percent, a written
   competency examination; and
- 32 (D) Have demonstrated the requisite clinical skills to serve as a medication aide in accordance with a standardized checklist developed by the department.
- (4) A record of the successful completion of the written competency examination and
   clinical skills standardized checklist by an applicant for certification as a medication aide
   shall be included in the medication aide registry within 30 business days of evaluation.
- Each candidate for certification as a medication aide shall have the opportunity to take the written competency examination three times before being required to retake and successfully complete the medication aide training program.
- 40 (5) An assisted living community shall annually conduct a comprehensive clinical skills competency review of each medication aide employed by the assisted living community.
- 42 (6) Certificates issued pursuant to this subsection shall be renewed biennially according 43 to schedules and fees approved by the department.
- 44 (7) A medication aide who meets the criteria established in this subsection shall be 45 permitted to perform the following tasks in an assisted living community in accordance 46 with the written instructions of a physician:
- 47 (A) Administer physician ordered oral, ophthalmic, topical, otic, nasal, vaginal, and rectal medications;
- 49 (B) Administer insulin, epinephrine, and B12 pursuant to physician direction and protocol;
- 51 (C) Administer medication via a metered dose inhaler;
- 52 (D) Conduct finger stick blood glucose testing following established protocol;
- 53 (E) Administer a commercially prepared disposable enema as ordered by a physician; 54 and
- (F) Administer any oral, ophthalmic, topical, otic, nasal, vaginal, or rectal medication 55 to the patient of a licensed hospice who is a resident of the assisted living community 56 pursuant to a hospice physician's written order that contains specific instructions for 57 indication, dosage, frequency, and route of administration in a manner that precludes 58 the need for the medication aide to exercise independent clinical judgement prior to, 59 during, and after the administration of such medication, provided that the licensed 60 hospice provider consents to the use and administration of its prepared medication as 61 62 described in this subparagraph. The medication aide shall observe and document the 63 resident's need for all 'as needed' (PRN) medication in such resident's record and such

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indications of need may include verbalizations of pain, groaning, grimacing, or restlessness. The initial dose of any medication administered pursuant to this subparagraph shall be administered and assessed by a licensed hospice nurse to observe and address any adverse reactions to such medication. The department shall designate specific criteria for training of medication aides to implement this subparagraph; and (F)(G) Assist residents in the supervision of self-administration of medication.

- (8) A medication aide shall record in the medication administration record all medications that the such medication aide has personally administered to a resident of an assisted living community and any refusal of a resident to take a medication. A medication aide shall observe a resident to whom medication has been administered and shall report any changes in the condition of such resident to the personal representative or legal surrogate of the such resident.
- 76 (9) All medication administered by a medication aide in accordance with this Code 77 section shall be in unit or multidose packaging.
- 78 (10) An assisted living community that employs one or more medication aides to 79 administer medications in accordance with this subsection shall secure the services of a 80 licensed pharmacist to perform the following duties:
- 81 (A) Perform a quarterly review of the drug regimen of each resident of the assisted 82 living community and report any irregularities to the assisted living community 83 administrator;
  - (B) Remove for proper disposal any drugs that are expired, discontinued, in a deteriorated condition, or where when the resident for whom such drugs were ordered is no longer a resident;
- 87 (C) Establish or review policies and procedures for safe and effective drug therapy, 88 distribution, use, and control; and
- 89 (D) Monitor compliance with established policies and procedures for medication 90 handling and storage.
- 91 (11) An assisted living community that employs one or more medication aides to administer medications in accordance with this subsection shall ensure that each medication aide receives ongoing medication training as prescribed by the department.
- A registered professional nurse or pharmacist shall conduct random medication administration observations on a quarterly basis and report any issues to the assisted living community administrator."

97 **SECTION 2.** 

Code Section 43-26-12, relating to exceptions to the licensure of registered professional nurses, is amended in subsection (a) by striking "and" at the end of paragraph (8), by

100	replacing the period at the end of paragraph (9) with "; and", and by adding a new paragraph
101	to read as follows:
102	"(10) The administration of medications by a certified medication aide pursuant to
103	subparagraph (g)(7)(F) of Code Section 31-7-12.2."
104	SECTION 3.
105	This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law
106	without such approval.
107	SECTION 4.
108	All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
