13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
14	Section 1. Section 17-4-30, Code of Alabama 1975, is
15	amended to read as follows:
16	"§17-4-30.
17	"(a) Beginning in <del>January 1997</del> February 2021, and in
18	January February of every fourth year thereafter, the boards
19	of registrars shall mail a nonforwardable notice to all
20	registered voters in the county. The notice shall be designed
21	and provided for the boards of registrars by the Secretary of
22	State. The notice shall be sent on a postcard providing
23	general information on elections. The notice shall be mailed
24	to the last known address of the voter appearing on the voter
25	registration list. If the notice is returned to the boards of
26	registrars indicating that the voter may have relocated, the

board shall send a forwardable notice to the registered voter

on which the voter may confirm his or her current address. The forwardable notice shall be mailed no later than 90 days after receipt of the returned nonforwardable notice. Secretary of State shall use change-of-address information supplied by the United States Postal Service or other reliable sources as determined by the Secretary of State to identify registered United States Postal Service, the Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency, the state photo voter identification database, or any other federally approved source to identify registered voters whose addresses may have changed. Not more than 90 days after receiving the information from the Secretary of State a board of registrars shall proceed as follows:

"(1) If it appears information received from the

Secretary of State indicates that a registered voter has moved
to a different residence address in the same board of
registrars' jurisdiction in which the voter is currently
registered, the board of registrars shall change the
registration records to show the new address and the board of
registrars or its agent shall send the voter a notice of the
change by forwardable mail and a postage prepaid pre-addressed
return form by which the registered voter may verify or
correct the address information.

"(2) If it appears a registered voter has moved to a different residence address not in the same board of registrars' jurisdiction, the board of registrars or its agent shall send the voter a notice by forwardable mail that

includes a postage prepaid and pre-addressed return card on

which the voter may verify or correct his or her current

address. The notice shall state the following, depending on

the circumstances:

"a. If the registered voter did not change his or her residence, or changed residence but remained in the registrars' jurisdiction, the voter should return the card not later than the last day to register to vote before an election.

"b. If the card is not returned, the voter shall be required to complete a voter registration update form before the voter is permitted to vote in an election during the period beginning on the date of the notice and ending on the day after the date of the second general election for federal office that occurs after the date of the notice; provided, however, a voter may appear at his or her new polling place on the day of an election, complete an updated voter registration form, and cast a provisional ballot, which shall be counted once the board of registrars verifies the voter's new residence and determines that the voter voted in the correct polling place and is otherwise entitled by law to vote.

"c. If the voter does not update his or her voter registration record and does not vote in an election during the period beginning on the date of the notice and ending on the day after the date of the second general election for federal office that occurs after the date of the notice, the

voter's name shall be removed from the list of eligible
voters.

"d. If the voter has changed residence to a place outside the board of registrars' jurisdiction in which the voter is registered, information concerning how the voter can continue to be eligible to vote.

"(b) The boards of registrars A board of registrars or its agent shall record and maintain in the statewide voter registration database the dates on which the nonforwardable a notice provided for in subsection (a) was mailed to a registered voter and subsequently returned to the board and the date on which the forwardable notice was mailed to by the registered voter.

"(b) (c) The boards of registrars shall update the voter list for the county statewide voter registration database using the information reported to the board by the registered voters on the address confirmation cards notices provided for in subsection (a).

"(d) If the <u>a</u> registered voter does not respond to the forwardable notice on which the registered voter may confirm his or her address <u>a</u> notice provided for in <u>subdivision (2) of subsection (a)</u> within 90 days of the date on which the notice was mailed or if the forwardable notice is returned to the board <u>of registrars</u> as undeliverable, the <u>boards of registrars board of registrars or its agent</u> shall place the name of the registered voter on the inactive list of registered voters and in a suspense file in the office of the

board. The suspense file shall contain all of the following

information: change the voter's status to "confirm" and record

in the statewide voter registration database in a manner

prescribed, by rule, by the Secretary of State that the voter

did not respond to the mailing or that the mailing was

returned as undeliverable, and the date the information was

recorded.

"(1) The name of the registered voter.

- "(2) The last known address of the registered voter.
- "(3) At least the last four digits of the Social
  Security number or other personal identification number of the registered voter.
  - "(4) The date on which the name of the registered voter was placed in the suspense file.
  - "(c) The name of a registered voter who does not vote or appear to vote in one of the next two federal elections held after his or her name is placed in the suspense file shall be removed from the voter list.

"(d) (e) If a voter who receives a notice provided for in subdivision (2) of subsection (a) votes in an election during the period beginning on the date of the notice and ending on the day after the date of the second general election for federal office that occurs after the date of the notice, or updates his or her voter registration record, the voter will be reinstated to a status of "active." If a voter who receives a notice provided for in subdivision (2) of subsection (a) does not update his or her voter registration

1	record and does not vote in an election during the period
2	beginning on the date of the notice and ending on the day
3	after the date of the second general election for federal
4	office that occurs after the date of the notice, the voter's
5	name will be removed from the list of eligible voters. The
6	names of persons to be removed from the list of registered

12	Section 2. This act shall become February 1, 2021,
