A BILL

To reauthorize and amend the National Sea Grant College Program Act, and for other purposes.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "National Sea Grant

5 College Program Amendments Act of 2017".

6 SEC. 2. REFERENCES TO THE NATIONAL SEA GRANT COL-

7 LEGE PROGRAM ACT.

8 Except as otherwise expressly provided, wherever in 9 this Act an amendment or repeal is expressed in terms 10 of an amendment to, or repeal of, a section or other provision, the reference shall be considered to be made to a
 section or other provision of the National Sea Grant Col lege Program Act (33 U.S.C. 1121 et seq.).

4 SEC. 3. MODIFICATION OF DEAN JOHN A. KNAUSS MARINE 5 POLICY FELLOWSHIP.

6 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 208(b) (33 U.S.C.
7 1127(b)) is amended by striking "may" and inserting
8 "shall".

9 (b) PLACEMENTS IN CONGRESS.—Such section is10 further amended—

(1) in the first sentence, by striking "The Sec-retary" and inserting the following:

13 "(1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary"; and

(2) in paragraph (1), as designated by paragraph (1) of this section, in the second sentence, by
striking "A fellowship" and inserting the following:
"(2) PLACEMENT PRIORITIES.—

"(A) IN GENERAL.—In each year in which
the Secretary awards a legislative fellowship
under this subsection, when considering the
placement of fellows, the Secretary shall
prioritize placement of fellows in the following:
"(i) Positions in offices of committees
of Congress that have jurisdiction over the

2	istration.
3	"(ii) Positions in offices of Members
4	of Congress who are on such committees.
5	"(iii) Positions in offices of Members
6	of Congress that have a demonstrated in-
7	terest in ocean, coastal, or Great Lakes re-
8	sources.
9	"(B) Equitable distribution.—
10	"(i) FINDING AND RECOGNITION.—
11	Congress—
12	"(I) finds that both host offices
13	and fellows benefit when fellows have
14	the opportunity to choose from a
15	range of host offices from different
16	States and regions, both chambers of
17	Congress, and both political parties;
18	and
19	"(II) recognizes the steps taken
20	by the National Sea Grant College
21	Program to facilitate an equitable dis-
22	tribution of fellows among the political
23	parties.
24	"(ii) In general.—The Secretary
25	shall ensure, to the maximum extent prac-

1	ticable, that fellows have the opportunity
2	to choose from offices that are described in
3	clauses (i), (ii), and (iii) of subparagraph
4	(A) and that are equitably distributed
5	among—
6	"(I) the political parties; and
7	"(II) the Senate and the House
8	of Representatives.
9	"(3) DURATION.—A fellowship".
10	(c) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by
11	subsection (b) shall apply with respect to the first calendar
12	year beginning after the date of the enactment of this Act.
13	(d) Sense of Congress Concerning Federal
14	HIRING OF FORMER FELLOWS.—It is the sense of Con-
15	gress that in recognition of the competitive nature of the
16	fellowship under section 208(b) of the National Sea Grant
17	College Program Act (33 U.S.C. 1127(b)), and of the ex-
18	ceptional qualifications of fellowship awardees, the Sec-
19	retary of Commerce, acting through the Under Secretary
20	of Commerce for Oceans and Atmosphere, should encour-
21	age participating Federal agencies to consider opportuni-
22	ties for fellowship awardees at the conclusion of their fel-
23	lowships for workforce positions appropriate for their edu-
24	cation and experience.

(c) REPORT.—Not later than 180 days after the date
of the enactment of this Act, the Director of the National
Sea Grant College Program, in consultation with the National Sea Grant Advisory Board and the Sea Grant Association, shall—

1	(1) develop recommendations for the optimal

3	204(c)(4)(E) of the National Sea Grant College Pro-
4	gram Act (33 U.S.C. 1123(c)(4)(E)); and
5	(2) submit to Congress a report on the rec-

8	construed to limit or otherwise affect any other amounts

12	(1) accepted under section $204(c)(4)(F)$ of that
13	Act $(33 \text{ U.S.C. } 1123(c)(4)(F));$ or
14	(2) appropriated under section 212 of that Act
15	(33 U.S.C. 1131).

16 (a) IN GENERAL.—During fiscal year 2017 and any fiscal year thereafter, the head of any Federal agency may 17 18 appoint, without regard to the provisions of subchapter I 19 of chapter 33 of title 5, United States Code, other than sections 3303 and 3328 of that title, a qualified candidate 20 21 described in subsection (b) directly to a position with the 22 Federal agency for which the candidate meets Office of 23 Personnel Management qualification standards.

24 (b) QUALIFIED CANDIDATE.—Subsection (a) applies25 with respect to a former recipient of a Dean John A.

Knauss Marine Policy Fellowship under section 208(b) of
 the National Sea Grant College Program Act (33 U.S.C.
 1127(b)) who—

4 (1) earned a graduate or post-graduate degree
5 in a field related to ocean, coastal, or Great Lakes
6 resources or policy from an institution of higher edu7 cation accredited by an agency or association recog8 nized by the Secretary of Education pursuant to sec9 tion 496(a) of the Higher Education Act of 1965
10 (20 U.S.C. 1099b(a));

(2) received a Dean John A. Knauss Marine
Policy Fellowship under section 208(b) of the National Sea Grant College Program Act (33 U.S.C.
1127(b)) within 5 years before the date the individual is appointed under this section; and
