## H.R.397

## AN ACT

To amend the Homeland Security Act of 2002 to establish chemical, biological, radiological, and nuclear intelligence and information sharing functions of the Office of Intelligence and Analysis of the Department of Homeland Security and to require dissemination of information analyzed by the Department to entities with responsibilities relating to homeland security, and for other purposes.

1	Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2	tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
3	SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
4	This Act may be cited as the "CBRN Intelligence and
5	Information Sharing Act of 2021".
6	SEC. 2. CHEMICAL, BIOLOGICAL, RADIOLOGICAL, AND NU-
7	CLEAR INTELLIGENCE AND INFORMATION
8	SHARING.
9	(a) IN GENERAL.—Subtitle A of title II of the Home-
10	land Security Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C. 121 et seq.) is amend-
11	ed by inserting after section 210G the following new sec-
12	tion:
13	"SEC. 210H. CHEMICAL, BIOLOGICAL, RADIOLOGICAL, AND
14	NUCLEAR INTELLIGENCE AND INFORMATION
15	SHARING.
16	"(a) IN GENERAL.—The Office of Intelligence and
17	Analysis of the Department of Homeland Security shall—
18	"(1) support homeland security-focused intel-
19	ligence analysis of terrorist actors, their claims, and
20	their plans to conduct attacks involving chemical, bi-
21	ological, radiological, or nuclear materials against
22	the United States, including critical infrastructure;
23	"(2) support homeland security-focused intel-
24	ligence analysis of global infectious disease, public
25	health, food, agricultural, and veterinary issues;

"(3) support homeland security-focused risk analysis and risk assessments of the homeland security hazards described in paragraphs (1) and (2), including the transportation of chemical, biological, nuclear, and radiological materials, by providing relevant quantitative and nonquantitative threat information;

- "(4) leverage existing and emerging homeland security intelligence capabilities and structures to enhance early detection, prevention, protection, response, and recovery efforts with respect to a chemical, biological, radiological, or nuclear attack;
- "(5) share information and provide tailored analytical support on such threats to State, local, Tribal, and territorial authorities, and other Federal agencies, as well as relevant national biosecurity and biodefense stakeholders, as appropriate; and
- 18 "(6) perform other responsibilities, as assigned 19 by the Secretary.
- "(b) Coordination.—Where appropriate, the Office of Intelligence and Analysis shall coordinate with other relevant Department components, including the Countering Weapons of Mass Destruction Office and the National Biosurveillance Integration Center, agencies within the intelligence community, including the National

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- 1 Counter Proliferation Center, and other Federal, State,
- 2 local, Tribal, and territorial authorities, including officials
- 3 from high-threat urban areas, State and major urban area
- 4 fusion centers, and local public health departments, as ap-
- 5 propriate, and enable such entities to provide rec-
- 6 ommendations on optimal information sharing mecha-
- 7 nisms, including expeditious sharing of classified informa-
- 8 tion, and on how such entities can provide information to
- 9 the Department.
- 10 "(c) Definitions.—In this section:
- 11 "(1) Intelligence community.—The term
- 12 'intelligence community' has the meaning given such
- term in section 3(4) of the National Security Act of
- 14 1947 (50 U.S.C. 3003(4)).
- 15 "(2) National biosecurity and biodefense
- 16 STAKEHOLDERS.—The term 'national biosecurity
- and biodefense stakeholders' means officials from
- 18 Federal, State, local, Tribal, and territorial authori-
- ties and individuals from the private sector who are
- 20 involved in efforts to prevent, protect against, re-
- spond to, and recover from a biological attack or
- other phenomena that may have serious health con-
- sequences for the United States, including infectious
- 24 disease outbreaks.".

1	(b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of contents
2	in section 1(b) of the Homeland Security Act of 2002 is
3	amended by inserting after the item relating to section
4	201E the following new item:
	"Sec. 210H. Chemical, biological, radiological, and nuclear intelligence and information sharing.".
5	(c) Report.—
6	(1) In general.—Not later than one year
7	after the date of the enactment of this Act and an-
8	nually thereafter for each of the following four years,
9	the Secretary of Homeland Security shall report to
10	the appropriate congressional committees on the fol-
11	lowing:
12	(A) The intelligence and information shar-
13	ing activities under section 210H of the Home-
14	land Security Act of 2002 (as added by sub-
15	section (a) of this section) and of all relevant
16	entities within the Department of Homeland
17	Security to counter the threat from attacks
18	using chemical, biological, radiological, or nu-
19	clear materials.
20	(B) The Department's activities in accord-
21	ance with relevant intelligence strategies.
22	(2) Assessment of implementation.—The
23	reports required under paragraph (1) shall include

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the following:

1 (A) An assessment of the progress of the 2 Office of Intelligence and Analysis of the Department of Homeland Security in imple-3 4 menting such section 210F. (B) A description of the methods estab-6 lished to carry out such assessment. 7 (3) Definition.—In this subsection, the term "appropriate congressional committees" means the 8 9 Committee on Homeland Security of the House of 10 Representatives and the Committee on Homeland 11 Security and Governmental Affairs of the Senate 12 and any committee of the House of Representatives 13 or the Senate having legislative jurisdiction under 14 the rules of the House of Representatives or Senate, 15 respectively, over the matter concerned. 16 SEC. 3. DISSEMINATION OF INFORMATION ANALYZED BY 17 THE DEPARTMENT TO STATE, LOCAL, TRIB-18 AL, TERRITORIAL, AND PRIVATE ENTITIES 19 RESPONSIBILITIES RELATING TO 20 HOMELAND SECURITY. 21 Paragraph (6) of section 201(d) of the Homeland Se-22 curity Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C. 121(d)) is amended by striking "and to agencies of State" and all that follows through the period at the end and inserting "to State, local, tribal,

territorial, and private entities with such responsibilities,

- 1 and, as appropriate, to the public, in order to assist in
- 2 preventing, deterring, or responding to acts of terrorism
- 3 against the United States.".
