A BILL

To increase funding for the 10-Year Pediatric Research Initiative Fund by eliminating taxpayer financing of presidential election campaigns.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Kids First Research
- 5 Act 2.0".

1	SEC. 2. TERMINATION OF TAXPAYER FINANCING OF PRESI-
2	DENTIAL ELECTION CAMPAIGNS.
3	(a) Termination of Designation of Income Tax
4	Payments.—Section 6096 of the Internal Revenue Code
5	of 1986 is amended by adding at the end the following
6	new subsection:
7	"(d) TERMINATION.—This section shall not apply to
8	taxable years beginning after December 31, 2016.".
9	(b) TERMINATION OF FUND AND ACCOUNT.—
10	(1) TERMINATION OF PRESIDENTIAL ELECTION
11	CAMPAIGN FUND.—
12	(A) In General.—Chapter 95 of subtitle
13	H of such Code is amended by adding at the
14	end the following new section:
15	"SEC. 9014. TERMINATION.
16	"The provisions of this chapter shall not apply with
17	respect to any presidential election (or any presidential
18	nominating convention) after the date of the enactment
19	of this section, or to any candidate in such an election.".
20	(B) Transfer of remaining funds.—
21	Section 9006 of such Code is amended by add-
22	ing at the end the following new subsection:
23	"(d) Transfer of Funds Remaining After Ter-
24	MINATION.—The Secretary shall transfer the amounts in
25	the fund as of the date of the enactment of this subsection
26	to the 10-Year Pediatric Research Initiative Fund de-

- 1 scribed in section 9008(i)(2), to be available as described
- 2 in such section and to remain so available until ex-
- 3 pended.".
- 4 (2) TERMINATION OF ACCOUNT.—Chapter 96
- 5 of subtitle H of such Code is amended by adding at
- 6 the end the following new section:

7 "SEC. 9043. TERMINATION.

- 8 "The provisions of this chapter shall not apply to any
- 9 candidate with respect to any presidential election after
- 10 the date of the enactment of this section.".
- 11 (c) CLERICAL AMENDMENTS.—
- 12 (1) The table of sections for chapter 95 of sub-
- title H of such Code is amended by adding at the
- end the following new item:

"Sec. 9014. Termination.".

- 15 (2) The table of sections for chapter 96 of sub-
- title H of such Code is amended by adding at the
- end the following new item:

"Sec. 9043. Termination.".

18 SEC. 3. COORDINATION OF NIH FUNDING FOR PEDIATRIC

- 19 RESEARCH.
- 20 (a) Sense of Congress.—The Congress encourages
- 21 the Director of the National Institutes of Health to over-
- 22 see and coordinate research that is conducted or supported
- 23 by the National Institutes of Health for research on pedi-
- 24 atric cancer and other pediatric diseases and conditions,

- 1 including through the 10-Year Pediatric Research Initia-
- 2 tive Fund.
- 3 (b) Avoiding Replicate.—Clause (ii) of section
- 4 407(b)(7)(B) of the Public Health Service Act (42 U.S.C.
- 5 282(b)(7)(B)) is amended by inserting "and shall
- 6 prioritize such pediatric research that does not replicate
- 7 existing research activities of the National Institutes of
- 8 Health" before "; and".
