  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

#### **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Biennial Budgeting5 and Appropriations Act".

all regular biennial appropriations bills, and all reconciliation bills.

#### 4 SEC. 9. REPORT ON TWO-YEAR FISCAL PERIOD.

8 (1) determine the impact and feasibility of 9 changing the definition of a fiscal year and the 10 budget process based on that definition to a 2-year 11 fiscal period with a biennial budget process based on 12 the 2-year period; and

#### 16 SEC. 10. EFFECTIVE DATE.

Except as provided in sections 7 and 9, this Act and

appropriations for the biennium beginning with fiscal year
2022.
