#### A BILL

To amend the Surface Mining Control and Reclamation Act of 1977 to enhance and support mining and mineral engineering programs in the United States by funding activities at mining schools, and for other purposes. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
 This Act may be cited as the "Mining Schools En hancement Act".
 SEC. 2. SUPPORT FOR MINING SCHOOLS.

7 Section 721 of the Surface Mining Control and Rec8 lamation Act of 1977 (30 U.S.C. 1309b) is amended—

9 (1) by striking "The Office of Surface Mining 10 Reclamation and Enforcement" and inserting the fol-11 lowing:

12 "(a) IN GENERAL.—Subject to subsection (b), the Of13 fice of Surface Mining Reclamation and Enforcement"; and

14 (2) by adding at the end the following:

15 "(b) MINING PROGRAM SUPPORT.—

"(1) Of the amounts made available under subsection (d) for activities authorized under this section,
the Director of the Office of Surface Mining Reclamation and Enforcement shall ensure that at least 70
percent is expended to enhance and support mining
and mineral engineering programs in the United
States by funding activities at mining schools.

23 "(2) In expending funds under this section, the
24 Director shall consult with relevant stakeholders and
25 ensure a significant opportunity for participation by

1	undergraduate and graduate students at mining
2	schools.
3	"(3) The Director shall ensure that the activities
4	conducted under this section relate to resource devel-
5	opment and production, and include—
6	"(A) studies of mining, mineral extraction
7	efficiency, and related processing technology;
8	``(B) mineral economics, reclamation tech-
9	nology, and practices for active mining oper-
10	ations;
11	``(C) the development of remining systems
12	and technologies that facilitate reclamation that
13	fosters the recovery of resources at abandoned
14	mine sites;
15	(D) investigations of mineral resource ex-
16	traction methods that reduce environmental and
17	human impacts;
18	``(E) reducing dependence on foreign energy
19	supplies;
20	``(F) enhancing the competitiveness of
21	United States energy technology exports;
22	``(G) the extraction or processing of coin-
23	ciding mineralization, including rare earth ele-
24	ments, within coal, coal processing byproduct,
25	overburden or coal residue; and

"(H) enhancing technologies and practices
 related to mitigation of acid mine drainage, re forestation, and revegetation in the reclamation
 of land and water resources adversely affected by
 coal mining.

6 "(c) MINING SCHOOL DEFINED.—In this section the 7 term 'mining school' means a mining, metallurgical, or 8 mineral engineering program or department accredited by the Accreditation Board for Engineering and Technology, 9 Inc., that is located at an institution of higher education 10 11 (as that term is defined in section 631(a) of the Higher Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1132(a))) in the United 12 States. 13

14 "(d) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There is
15 authorized to be appropriated to carry out this section
16 \$10,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2018 through 2024.".
