TITLE I—SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATIONS FOR ISRAEL

DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE

OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE

OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE, DEFENSE-WIDE

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6 For an additional amount for "Operation and Maintenance, Defense-wide", \$4,400,000,000, to remain avail-7 8 able until September 30, 2025, to respond to the situation 9 in Israel and for related expenses: *Provided*, That amounts 10 made available under this heading shall be available for 11 transfer to accounts under the headings "Operation and 12 Maintenance", "Procurement", "Research, Development, Test, and Evaluation", and "Revolving and Management 13 14 Funds" for replacement, through new procurement or repair of existing unserviceable equipment, of defense arti-15 cles from the stocks of the Department of Defense, and 16 for reimbursement for defense services of the Department 17 18 of Defense and military education and training, provided 19 to or identified for provision to Israel or to foreign coun-20 tries that have provided support to Israel at the request 21 of the United States: *Provided further*, That amounts 22 made available under this heading may also be transferred 23 to accounts under the heading "Procurement" for expan-24 sion of public and private plants, including the land nec-25 essary therefor, and procurement and installation of

equipment, appliances, and machine tools in such plants, 1 2 for the purpose of increasing production of critical muni-3 tions: *Provided further*, That amounts made available 4 under this heading may also be transferred to accounts 5 under the heading "Procurement" and "Research, Development, Test and Evaluation" for the acquisition of crit-6 7 ical defense articles: *Provided further*, That funds trans-8 ferred pursuant to a transfer authority provided under 9 this heading shall be merged with and available for the 10 same purposes and for the same time period as the appropriations to which the funds are transferred: Provided fur-11 12 ther, That the Secretary of Defense shall notify the con-13 gressional defense committees of the details of such transfers not less than 15 days before any such transfer: Pro-14 15 vided further, That upon a determination that all or part of the funds transferred from this appropriation are not 16 17 necessary for the purposes provided under this heading, such amounts may be transferred back and merged with 18 this appropriation: *Provided further*, That amounts may 19 20 be transferred between appropriations made under this heading: Provided further, That any transfer authority 21 22 provided under this heading is in addition to any other 23 transfer authority provided by law: *Provided further*, That 24 such amount in this paragraph is designated by Congress 25 as an emergency requirement pursuant to section

251(b)(2)(A) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency
 Deficit Control Act of 1985, as amended: *Provided further*,
 That such amounts shall be available only if the President
 designates such amount as an emergency requirement pur suant to section 251(b)(2)(A).

PROCUREMENT OF AMMUNITION, ARMY

8 For an additional amount for "Procurement of Am-9 munition, Army", \$801,400,000, to remain available until 10 September 30, 2026, to respond to the situation in Israel and for related expenses: *Provided*, That such amount is 11 12 designated by the Congress as an emergency requirement 13 pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985, as amended: 14 15 *Provided further*, That such amount shall be available only if the President designates such amount as an emergency 16 17 requirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A).

18 PROCUREMENT, DEFENSE-WIDE

For an additional amount for "Procurement, Defense-wide", \$4,000,000,000, to remain available until September 30, 2027, for the Secretary of Defense to provide to the Government of Israel for the procurement of the Iron Dome and David's Sling defense systems to counter short-range rocket threats: *Provided*, That such funds shall be transferred pursuant to an exchange of let-

ters and are in addition to funds provided pursuant to the 1 2 U.S.-Israel Iron Dome Procurement Agreement, as 3 amended: *Provided further*, That nothing under this head-4 ing shall be construed to apply to amounts made available 5 in prior appropriations Acts for the procurement of the Iron Dome and David's Sling defense systems: Provided 6 7 *further*, That such amount is designated by Congress as 8 being for an emergency requirement pursuant to section 9 251(b)(2)(A) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency 10 Deficit Control Act of 1985, as amended: *Provided further*, 11 That such amounts shall be available only if the President 12 designates such amount as an emergency requirement pur-13 suant to section 251(b)(2)(A).

14 DEFENSE PRODUCTION ACT PURCHASES

15 For an additional amount for "Defense Production Act Purchases", \$198,600,000, to remain available until 16 17 expended, for activities by the Department of Defense pursuant to sections 108, 301, 302, and 303 of the Defense 18 Production Act of 1950 (50 U.S.C. 4518, 4531, 4532, and 19 204533): *Provided*, That such amounts shall be obligated 21 and expended by the Secretary of Defense as if delegated 22 the necessary authorities conferred by the Defense Pro-23 duction Act of 1950: Provided further, That such amount 24 is designated by Congress as an emergency requirement 25 pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985, as amended:
 Provided further, That such amount shall be available only
 if the President designates such amount as an emergency
 requirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A).

9 For an additional amount for "Research, Develop-10 ment. Test and Evaluation, Defense-wide", \$1,200,000,000, to remain available until September 30, 11 2026, for the Secretary of Defense to provide to the Gov-12 13 ernment of Israel for the development of the Iron Beam defense system to counter short-range rocket threats: Pro-14 15 *vided*, That such funds shall be transferred pursuant to an exchange of letters: *Provided further*, That nothing in 16 the preceding proviso shall be construed to apply to 17 amounts made available in prior appropriations Acts for 18 19 the development of the Iron Beam defense system: Pro-20 *vided further*, That such amount is designated by Congress 21 as being for an emergency requirement pursuant to sec-22 tion 251(b)(2)(A) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency 23 Deficit Control Act of 1985, as amended: *Provided further*, 24 That such amounts shall be available only if the President designates such amount as an emergency requirement pur suant to section 251(b)(2)(A).

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6 Administration of Foreign Affairs 7 Diplomatic programs

8 For an additional amount for "Diplomatic pro-9 grams", \$150,000,000, to remain available until Sep-10 tember 30, 2025, of which \$50,000,000 shall be for responding to the situation in Israel and areas impacted by 11 12 the situation in Israel, and of which \$100,000,000 shall be available until expended for Worldwide Security Protec-13 tion to respond to the situation in Israel and areas im-14 15 pacted by the situation in Israel: *Provided*, That such amount is designated by Congress as an emergency re-16 17 quirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A) of the Bal-18 anced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985, 19 as amended: *Provided further*, That such amount shall be 20 available only if the President designates such amount as 21 requirement section an emergency pursuant to 22 251(b)(2)(A).

EMERGENCIES IN THE DIPLOMATIC AND CONSULAR

SERVICE

3 For an additional amount for "Emergencies in the 4 Diplomatic and Consular Service", \$50,000,000, to re-5 main available until September 30, 2025, to meet unforeseen emergencies arising in the diplomatic and consular 6 7 service: *Provided*, That such amount is designated by Con-8 gress as an emergency requirement pursuant to section 9 251(b)(2)(A) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency 10 Deficit Control Act of 1985, as amended: *Provided further*, 11 That such amount shall be available only if the President 12 designates such amount as an emergency requirement pur-13 suant to section 251(b)(2)(A).

14 EXPANDED TRANSFER AUTHORITY FOR CONSULAR AND

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BORDER SECURITY PROGRAMS

16 During fiscal years 2024 and 2025, funds deposited 17 in the consular and border security programs account in 18 any fiscal year that are available for obligation may be 19 transferred to, and merged with, funds appropriated by 20 any Act making appropriations for the Department of 21 State, foreign operations, and related programs under the 22 headings "Diplomatic Programs" (including for worldwide 23 security protection), "Embassy Security, Construction, 24 and Maintenance", and "Emergencies in the Diplomatic 25 and Consular Service", for emergency evacuations or to prevent or respond to security situations and require ments: *Provided*, That any such transfer shall be subject
 to prior consultation with, and the regular notification
 procedures of, the Committee on Appropriations of the
 Senate and the House of Representatives: *Provided fur- ther*, That such transfer authority is in addition to any
 transfer authority otherwise available in this Act and
 under any other provision of law.

9 INTERNATIONAL SECURITY ASSISTANCE

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Funds Appropriated to the President

11 FOREIGN MILITARY FINANCING PROGRAM

12 For an additional amount for "Foreign Military Fi-13 nancing Program", \$3,500,000,000, to remain available until September 30, 2025, which shall be for responding 14 15 to the situation in Israel and related expenses: *Provided*, 16 That funds made available under this heading in this Act 17 and Acts making appropriations for the Department of 18 State, foreign operations, and related programs for fiscal 19 year 2024, and prior fiscal years, in addition to funds oth-20 erwise available for such purposes, may be used by the 21 Department of State for necessary expenses for the gen-22 eral costs of administering military assistance and sales, 23 including management and oversight of such programs 24 and activities: *Provided further*, That direct loans made 25 using amounts described in the preceding proviso may be

made notwithstanding any provision of law limiting the in-1 terest rate charged to borrowers: *Provided further*, That 2 3 loan guarantees made using amounts described in the sec-4 ond proviso under this heading for loans financed by the 5 Federal Financing Bank may be provided notwithstanding any provision of law limiting the percentage of loan prin-6 7 cipal that may be guaranteed: *Provided further*, That, to 8 the extent that the Government of Israel requests that 9 funds be used for such purposes, grants made available 10 for Israel under this heading shall, as agreed by the United States and Israel, be available for advanced weap-11 12 ons systems, of which up to \$3,500,000,000 may be avail-13 able for the procurement in Israel of defense articles and defense services: *Provided further*, That any congressional 14 15 notification requirement applicable to funds made available under this heading for Israel may be waived if a de-16 termination is made that extraordinary circumstances 17 18 exist that impact the national security of the United 19 States: *Provided further*, That such amount is designated 20 by Congress as an emergency requirement pursuant to 21 section 251(b)(2)(A) of the Balanced Budget and Emer-22 gency Deficit Control Act of 1985, as amended: *Provided* 23 *further*, That such amount shall be available only if the 24 President designates such amount as an emergency re-25 quirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A).

1 TITLE II—GENERAL PROVISIONS

2 SEC. 201. DRAWDOWN AUTHORITY.

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 506(a) of the Foreign As4 sistance Act of 1961 (22 U.S.C. 2318(a)) is amended by
5 adding at the end the following new paragraph:

6 "(4) For fiscal year 2024, in addition to 7 amounts otherwise specified in this section, the 8 President may direct the drawdown of defense arti-9 cles from the stocks of the Department of Defense, 10 defense services of the Department of Defense, and 11 military education and training, of an aggregate 12 value not to exceed \$7,000,000,000, to be provided 13 to Israel.".

(b) NATIONAL INTEREST.—Section 506(a)(2) of the
15 Foreign Assistance Act of 1961 (22 U.S.C. 2318(a)(2))
16 is amended by adding at the end the following new sub17 paragraph:

18 "(C) For fiscal year 2024, in addition to 19 amounts otherwise specified in this section, an ag-20 gregate value not to exceed \$200,000,000 of any 21 such articles, services, and military education and 22 training may be provided to Israel pursuant to sub-23 paragraph (A) of this paragraph, not more than 24 \$75,000,000 of which may be provided from the drawdown from the inventory and resources of the
 Department of Defense.".

3 (c) Emergency Transfer of Funds.—Section 4 552(c) of the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961 (22 U.S.C. 5 2348a(c)) is amended by adding at the end the following: 6 "For fiscal year 2024, in addition to the aggregate value 7 of \$25,000,000 authorized in the text in paragraph (1) 8 designated as paragraph (2) of the sentence preceding the 9 immediately preceding sentence, the President may direct the drawdown of commodities and services from the inven-10 tory and resources of any agency of the United States 11 12 Government for the purposes of providing necessary and 13 immediate assistance to Israel of a value not to exceed 14 \$25,000,000.".

(d) SPECIAL AUTHORITIES.—Section 614(a)(4) of
the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961 (22 U.S.C.
2364(a)(4)) is amended by adding at the end the following
new subparagraph:

"(D) Notwithstanding the limitations in this
subsection and in addition to other amounts in this
subsection, in fiscal year 2024, the authority of this
subsection may be used to authorize the use of up
to \$1,000,000,000 of funds made available for use
under this chapter or the Arms Export Control Act
(22 U.S.C. 2751 et seq.), to be provided to Israel.".

(e) TRANSFER OF FUNDS.—During fiscal year 2024,
 section 610(a) of the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961 (22
 U.S.C. 2360) shall be applied by substituting "20 per cen tum" for "10 per centum" and "40 per centum" for "20
 per centum".

6 SEC. 202. DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE STOCKPILES.

7 Section 12001 of the Department of Defense Appro8 priations Act, 2005 (Public Law 108–287), as amended
9 by Public Law 115–141, is amended as follows:

10 (1) in paragraph (2) of subsection (a), by strik-11 ing "armor" and all that follows through the period 12 at the end and inserting "defense articles that are 13 in the inventory of the Department of Defense as of 14 the date of transfer, are intended for use as reserve 15 stocks for Israel, and are located in a stockpile for 16 Israel as of the date of transfer.";

17 (2) in subsection (b), by striking "at least equal
18 to the fair market value of the items transferred"
19 and inserting "in an amount to be determined by
20 the Secretary of Defense"; and

(3) in subsection (c), by inserting after "authority of this section" the following: ", or as far in
advance of such transfer as is practicable as determined by the President on a case-by-case basis dur-

1	ing extraordinary circumstances impacting the na-
2	tional security of the United States".
3	SEC. 203. FISCAL YEAR LIMITS ON NEW STOCKPILES OR AD-
4	DITIONS TO EXISTING STOCKPILES LOCATED
5	IN FOREIGN COUNTRIES.
6	For fiscal year 2024, section 514(b) of the Foreign
7	Assistance Act of 1961 (22 U.S.C. 2321h(b)) shall not
8	apply to defense articles to be set aside, earmarked, re-

9 served, or intended for use as reserve stocks in stockpiles10 in the State of Israel.

11 SEC. 204. GENERAL AUTHORITIES AND CONDITIONS.

12 Unless otherwise provided for by this Act, the addi-13 tional amounts appropriated to appropriations accounts in 14 this Act shall be available under the authorities and condi-15 tions applicable to such appropriations accounts for fiscal 16 year 2024.

17 SEC. 205. LIMITATIONS.

18 None of the amounts appropriated or otherwise made19 available by this Act may be obligated or expended—

- 20 (1) in connection with the war in Ukraine; or
- 21 (2) for assistance to any entity that is—
 - (A) located in the territory of Gaza; or
- 23 (B) is controlled or influenced by Hamas,
 24 Palestinian Islamic Jihad, or any other organi25 zation designated by the Secretary of State as

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a foreign terrorist organization under section
 219 of the Immigration and Nationality Act (8
 U.S.C. 1189).

4 SEC. 206. RULE OF CONSTRUCTION.

5 Nothing in this Act may be construed to constitute 6 a specific statutory authorization for the introduction of 7 United States Armed Forces into hostilities or into situa-8 tions wherein hostilities are clearly indicated by the cir-9 cumstances.

10 SEC. 207. SHORT TITLE.

11 This Act may be cited as the "Israel Supplemental12 Appropriations Act of 2023".
