## AS PASSED SENATE

## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Code Section 20-2-159.1 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 focused programs of study, so as to provide for submission of additional pathways to the
- 3 State Board of Education for consideration; to provide for related matters; to repeal
- 4 conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

## 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

- 6 SECTION 1.
- 7 Code Section 20-2-159.1 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to focused
- 8 programs of study, is amended as follows:
- 9 "20-2-159.1.
- 10 (a) The No later than July 1, 2013, the Department of Education shall develop, and the
- 11 State Board of Education shall approve, state models and content standards for the
- 12 following focused programs of study, as defined in Code Section 20-2-326, including, but
- 13 not limited to:
- 14 (1) Agriculture, food, and natural resources;
- 15 (2) Architecture and construction;
- 16 (3) Arts, audio-video technology, and communications;
- 17 (4) Business, management, and administration;
- 18 (5) Education and training;
- 19 (6) Finance;
- 20 (7) Health science;
- 21 (8) Hospitality and tourism;
- 22 (9) Human services;
- 23 (10) Information technology;
- 24 (11) Law, public safety, and security;
- 25 (12) Manufacturing;
- 26 (13) Government and public administration;

- 27 (14) Marketing, sales, and service;
- 28 (15) Science, technology, engineering, and mathematics; and
- 29 (16) Transportation, distribution, and logistics.
- 30 Such focused programs of study may be combined around these and other related clusters.
- 31 (b) Local school systems, charter schools, and college and career academies shall be
- 32 <u>authorized to develop and submit additional pathways, including recommended content</u>
- 33 standards, for consideration by the State Board of Education. The Department of
- 34 Education shall review and recommend approval or denial of any new pathway to the State
- 35 Board of Education within 90 days of submission of such pathway for consideration."

36 SECTION 2.

37 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
