3		→SECTION 1. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 164 IS CREATED TO
4	REA	AD AS FOLLOWS:
5	<u>(1)</u>	In order to help prospective students make more informed decisions about their
6		futures and ensure that they are adequately aware of the cost of college and other
7		career paths, the Council on Postsecondary Education shall compile on an
8		annual basis the following information:
9		(a) The most in-demand jobs in the state along with the starting salary and
10		typical education level for those jobs;
11		(b) For the University of Kentucky, the University of Louisville, each
12		comprehensive university, and for each college within the Kentucky
13		Community and Technical College System:
14		<u>1. The average cost;</u>
15		2. The average three (3) year student loan default rate;
16		3. The average student loan debt for students who have attended the
17		institution;
18		4. The average graduation rate;
19		5. The number of students completing apprenticeship programs, high
20		school credential programs, and career and technical education
21		programs; and
22		6. The average starting salary for graduates; and
23		(c) For each college within the Kentucky Community and Technical College
24		System, the rate of students gainfully employed in the recognized
25		occupation for which the student was trained or in a related comparable
26		recognized occupation.
27	<u>(2)</u>	The Council on Postsecondary Education shall maintain and ensure access to the

1		information by prospective students in the state. The council shall work with the
2		Kentucky Center for Statistics, the Kentucky Department of Education, the
3		Education and Workforce Development Cabinet, and the Kentucky Higher
4		Education Assistance Authority and other stakeholders the council determines
5		necessary to develop a delivery method to carry out the objectives of this section.
6	<u>(3)</u>	The council may promulgate administrative regulations necessary to carry out
7		this section.
8		→ Section 2. This Act may be cited as the Students' Right to Know Act.
9		→ Section 3. This Act takes effect July 1, 2021.
