## A BILL

To make available the continued use of Pick-Sloan Missouri Basin Program project use power by the Kinsey Irrigation Company and the Sidney Water Users Irrigation District, and for other purposes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 SECTION 1. CONTINUED USE OF PICK-SLOAN MISSOURI
 BASIN PROGRAM PROJECT USE POWER BY
 THE KINSEY IRRIGATION COMPANY AND THE
 SIDNEY WATER USERS IRRIGATION DISTRICT.
 (a) FINDINGS.—Congress finds that—

1	(1) the Act of May 18, 1938 (52 Stat. 403,
2	chapter 250; 16 U.S.C. 833 et seq.), authorized the
3	completion, maintenance, and operation of the Fort
4	Peck project;
5	(2) section 2 of that Act (52 Stat. 404, chapter
6	250; 16 U.S.C. 833a) authorized and directed the
7	Bureau of Reclamation—
8	(A) to transmit and sell electric energy
9	generated by the Fort Peck project; and
10	(B) "to interconnect the Fort Peck project
11	with either private or with other Federal
12	projects and publicly owned power systems now
13	or hereafter constructed.";
14	(3) section 9 of the Act of December 22, 1944
15	(commonly known as the "Flood Control Act of
16	1944") (58 Stat. 891, chapter 665)—
17	(A) authorized the Missouri River Basin
18	Project, now known as the "Pick-Sloan Mis-
19	souri Basin Program" (referred to in this sec-
20	tion as the "Program");
21	(B) approved the comprehensive plan for
22	the Program set forth in Senate Document 191
23	and House Document 475, as revised and co-
24	ordinated by Senate Document 247, 78th Con-
25	gress;

1	(C) established a permanent administra-
2	tion for the development of the Missouri River
3	Basin; and
4	(D) incorporated the Fort Peck project as
5	part of the Program;
6	(4) in 1946, the Bureau of Reclamation entered
7	into project use power contracts to provide the
8	Kinsey Irrigation Company and the predecessor of
9	the Sidney Water Users Irrigation District electrical
10	service under the authority of the Act of May 18,
11	1938 (52 Stat. 403, chapter 250; 16 U.S.C. 833 et
12	seq.);
13	(5) since 1946, the Bureau of Reclamation has
14	approved 9 modifications to the project use power
15	contracts between the Bureau of Reclamation, the
16	Kinsey Irrigation Company, and the Sidney Water
17	Users Irrigation District;
18	(6) the project use power contracts in effect on
19	the date of enactment of this Act provide electric
20	service to the Kinsey Irrigation Company and the
21	Sidney Water Users Irrigation District at the Pro-
22	gram rate of 2.5 mills per kilowatt-hour, including
23	wheeling, through 2020; and
24	(7) the Kinsey Irrigation Company and the Sid-
25	ney Water Users Irrigation District have reasonably

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relied on the authority of the Act of May 18, 1938
(52 Stat. 403, chapter 250; 16 U.S.C. 833 et seq.),
and the fact that the Bureau of Reclamation has
treated the Kinsey Irrigation Company and the Sidney Water Users Irrigation District as irrigation
pumping units of the Program for more than 74
years.

8 (b) AUTHORIZATION.—Notwithstanding any other 9 provision of law and subject to subsection (c), the Sec-10 retary of the Interior (acting through the Commissioner of Reclamation) shall continue to treat the irrigation 11 pumping units known as the "Kinsey Irrigation Com-12 13 pany" in Custer County, Montana, and the "Sidney Water Users Irrigation District" in Richland County, Montana, 14 15 or any successor to the Kinsey Irrigation Company or Sidney Water Users Irrigation District, as irrigation pumping 16 17 units of the Program for the purposes of wheeling, administration, and payment of project use power. 18

(c) LIMITATION.—The quantity of power to be provided to the Kinsey Irrigation Company and the Sidney
Water Users Irrigation District (including any successor
to the Kinsey Irrigation Company or the Sidney Water
Users Irrigation District) under subsection (b) may not
exceed the maximum quantity of power provided to the
Kinsey Irrigation Company and the Sidney Water Users

1 Irrigation District under the applicable contract for elec-

2 tric service in effect on the date of enactment of this Act.
