Election Law – Institutions of Higher Education – Voter Registration and Voting by Students (Student Voter Empowerment Act of 2020)

 $\mathbf{5}$ FOR the purpose of requiring the State Board of Elections to maintain a page on its website 6 that includes certain information about and links regarding voter registration and 7 voting by students enrolled in institutions of higher education; requiring a public 8 institution of higher education to designate a staff member as the student voting 9 coordinator; requiring the student voting coordinator to develop and implement a 10student voting plan to increase student voter registration and voting in collaboration 11 with certain persons at the institution; requiring the student voting plan to cover a 12certain period and be updated at a certain time; requiring the student voting plan to 13 include certain elements relating to dissemination of information about voter 14registration and voting, provision of voter registration materials on campus, 15accommodation of early voting centers and precinct polling places on campus, encouragement of student organizations engaged in voter registration and voting 1617activities, and a policy excusing students from class to vote; requiring a public 18 institution of higher education to make the student voting plan available to the 19public and provide the plan to the Maryland Higher Education Commission and the 20State Board; applying the requirement that a public institution of higher education 21 provide a certain link to the online voter registration system from a certain online 22student portal to private institutions of higher education that receive funding from 23the State; requiring public institutions of higher education and private institutions 24of higher education that receive funding from the State to relocate a certain link to 25the online voter registration system and take certain steps if there are fewer than a 26certain number of clicks on the link in any calendar year; requiring public 27institutions of higher education that receive funding from the State to include certain 28information in a certain report if there were fewer than a certain number of clicks 29on a certain link to the online voter registration system in the preceding calendar 30 year; requiring private institutions of higher education that receive funding from the 31State to submit a certain report to the Maryland Independent Colleges and

1 Universities Association regarding voter registration on or before a certain date each $\mathbf{2}$ year; requiring the Maryland Independent Colleges and Universities Association to 3 submit a certain report summarizing information regarding voter registration at 4 private institutions of higher education to certain committees of the General $\mathbf{5}$ Assembly on or before a certain date each year; requiring a local board of elections 6 to establish a separate precinct on the campus of certain institutions of higher 7 education to specifically serve students, faculty, and staff who reside on or near the 8 campus; requiring certain institutions of higher education to take certain actions to 9 assist the local board with locating and operating a polling place on campus; 10 providing that certain institutions of higher education are not subject to certain 11 provisions of law; defining certain terms; making conforming changes; providing for a delayed effective date for certain provisions of this Act; and generally relating to 1213 voter registration and voting by students enrolled in institutions of higher education.
