## Hospitals Health Services Cost Review Commission - Community Benefits Reporting

FOR the purpose of repealing certain provisions governing the identification of community 4 5 health care needs by nonprofit hospitals; repealing certain provisions of law 6 requiring nonprofit hospitals to submit a certain annual community benefits report 7 to the Health Services Cost Review Commission; requiring the Commission to 8 establish a Community Benefit Reporting Workgroup; providing for the composition 9 of the workgroup; requiring the Commission to adopt certain regulations relating to 10 the community health needs of nonprofit hospitals and reporting by nonprofit 11 hospitals regarding community health needs and benefits provided by the hospital; 12 requiring the Commission to establish a method through which State and local 13 governing bodies are made aware of certain meetings; requiring the Commission, on 14 or before a certain date, to issue a certain report, conduct a certain assessment, issue 15 certain recommendations, certain information and submit a copy of a certain report to certain committees of the General Assembly; altering certain definitions; making 16 17 conforming changes; and generally relating to community benefits provided by 18 nonprofit hospitals.


