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11	WHEREAS, Amyloidosis, a rare disease of which there
12	are several types, one of which is similar to a blood cancer
13	and another that is commonly inherited; this combination of
14	all types of amyloidosis affections approximately 10,000
15	people in the United States, 500 of whom live in Alabama; and
16	WHEREAS, an abnormal protein either produced in the
17	bone marrow or liver travels through the blood stream,
18	depositing as amyloid in various organs, primarily the heart,
19	nervous system, intestines, and kidneys, causing the organs to
20	fail over time; and
21	WHEREAS, the medial length of survival for an
22	amyloidosis patient who does not receive treatment is less
23	than three years; many patients go undiagnosed every year, and
24	special initiatives, such as this resolution can raise public
25	awareness and save lives; and
26	WHEREAS, there have been advances in the treatment
27	of amyloidosis that have extended life expectancy, but

currently there are no drugs approved for the destruction of 1 2 amyloids; and 3 WHEREAS, the early diagnosis of amyloidosis in conjunction with prompt treatments not only improves the 4 5 quality of life, but extends life expectancy; and WHEREAS, there are no amyloidosis treatment centers 6 7 in Alabama that specialize in the diagnosis and treatment of amyloidosis patients; now therefore, 8 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH 9 10 HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That we join with the many special 11 organizations, healthcare professionals and facilities across 12 the country as they commemorate the month of March as

Amyloidosis Awareness Month.

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
