- 2 (a) (1) The Secretary shall administer the Maryland Medical Assistance 3 Program.
- 4 (2) The Program:
- 5 (xiii) Beginning on January 1, 2019, may provide, subject to the 6 limitations of the State budget, and as permitted by federal law, dental services for adults 7 whose annual household income is at or below 133 percent of the poverty level; [and]
- 8 (xiv) Shall provide, subject to the limitations of the State budget, 9 medically appropriate drugs that are approved by the United States Food and Drug 10 Administration for the treatment of hepatitis C, regardless of the fibrosis score, and that 11 are determined to be medically necessary; AND
- 12 (XV) SHALL PROVIDE SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGY SERVICES
  13 PROVIDED BY A SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGIST WHO IS CERTIFIED BY THE STATE
  14 DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO PRACTICE SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGY.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2020.
