A BILL

- To amend the Child Nutrition Act of 1966 to support women, infants, and children impacted by substance use disorder, and for other purposes.

 - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Supporting Healthy
 - 5 Mothers and Infants Act of 2019".

 - 7 TION PROGRAM.

6	"(l) ACTIVITIES TO SUPPORT WIC-ELIGIBLE INDI-
7	VIDUALS IMPACTED BY SUBSTANCE USE DISORDER.—
8	"(1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall—
9	"(A) develop and disseminate nutrition
10	education materials for individuals eligible for
11	the program; and
12	"(B) conduct outreach to individuals who
13	are potentially eligible for the program and who
14	are impacted by a substance use disorder.
15	"(2) Purpose.—The purpose of this subsection
16	is to ensure that individuals participating in the pro-
17	gram who are impacted by a substance use disorder
18	receive accurate nutrition education from trained
19	staff in an effective and unbiased manner.
20	"(3) Nutrition education materials.—The
21	Secretary shall collaborate with the Secretary of
22	Health and Human Services to develop appropriate
23	evidence-based nutrition education materials for in-
24	dividuals impacted by a substance use disorder, in-
25	cluding—

1	"(A) nutrition education materials for indi-
2	viduals with substance use disorder during
3	pregnancy and in the postpartum period; and

- "(B) nutrition education materials for infants impacted by prenatal substance exposure and neonatal abstinence syndrome.
- "(4) NUTRITION **EDUCATION** CLEARING-HOUSE.—The Secretary shall make available to all State agencies through an online clearinghouse any nutrition education and training materials related to nutrition for individuals impacted by a substance use disorder or neonatal abstinence syndrome that have been produced by the Secretary or the Secretary of Health and Human Services (or produced by a State agency and approved by the Secretary), including educational materials developed under paragraph (15) of section 515(b) of the Public Health Service Act (42 U.S.C. 290bb–21(b)) and guidance issued under section 1005 of the SUPPORT for Patients and Communities Act (42 U.S.C. 1396a note).
- "(5) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.— There are authorized to be appropriated to carry out this subsection \$1,000,000 for fiscal year 2020, to remain available until expended.".

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(b) Conforming Amendments.—Section 17(q) of 1 the Child Nutrition Act of 1966 (42 U.S.C. 1786(q)), as 3 redesignated by subsection (a) is amended— 4 (1) in paragraph (1), by striking "subsection 5 (o)(1)(A)" and inserting "subsection (p)(1)(A)"; and (2) in paragraph (2)(B), by striking "sub-6 (0)(1)(A)" and inserting "subsection section 7 8 (p)(1)(A)".

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
