$\frac{11}{12}$	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

$15 \\ 16 \\ 17$	(a) A licensed home inspector shall give to each person for whom the licensee performs a home inspection for compensation or to the person's representative, a written report that states:
18	(1) the scope and the exclusions of the inspection;
$\frac{19}{20}$	(2) the conditions observed during the home inspection that are subject to the adopted standards of practice and code of ethics approved by the Commission;
21	(3) the license number of the licensee; and
22	(4) a disclosure in 14-point bold type that includes the following

2 (i) "An inspection is intended to assist in the evaluation of the 3 overall condition of a building. The inspection is based on observation of the visible and 4 apparent condition of the building and its components on the date of the inspection";

5 (ii) "The results of this home inspection are not intended to make 6 any representation regarding latent or concealed defects that may exist, and no warranty 7 or guaranty is expressed or implied";

8 (iii) "If your home inspector is not a licensed structural engineer or 9 other professional whose license authorizes the rendering of an opinion as to structural 10 integrity of a building or the condition of its components or systems, you may wish to seek 11 the professional opinion of a licensed structural engineer or other professional regarding 12 any possible defects or other observations set forth in this report"; and

(iv) "Only home inspections performed by Maryland licensed home
 inspectors will be recognized as a valid home inspection under a real estate contract".

15 (B) IN ADDITION TO THE REPORT REQUIRED UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF 16 THIS SECTION, A LICENSED HOME INSPECTOR MAY GIVE TO EACH PERSON FOR 17 WHOM THE LICENSEE PERFORMS A HOME INSPECTION FOR COMPENSATION OR TO 18 THE PERSON'S REPRESENTATIVE A WRITTEN REPORT THAT STATES THE HOME 19 ENERGY RATING (HERS INDEX), A U.S. DEPARTMENT OF ENERGY HOME ENERGY 20 SCORE, OR AN EQUIVALENT SCORE.

21 [(b)] (C) The licensee shall give the person or the person's representative the 22 report **REQUIRED UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION**:

(1) by the date set in a written agreement by the parties to the homeinspection; or

25 (2) within 7 business days after the home inspection was performed, if no 26 date was set in a written agreement by the parties to the home inspection.

[(c)] (D) Any limitation of the liability of the licensee for any damages resulting from the report on the home inspection **REQUIRED UNDER SUBSECTION** (A) OF THIS SECTION shall be agreed to in writing by the parties to the home inspection prior to the performance of the home inspection.

31 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 32 October 1, 2020.

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
