A BILL

To amend title 5, United States Code, to modify the authority for pay and work schedules of border patrol agents, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Border Patrol Agent
- 5 Pay Reform Amendments Act of 2021".
- 6 SEC. 2. AMENDMENTS TO THE BORDER PATROL AGENT PAY
- 7 REFORM ACT OF 2014.
- 8 (a) Border Patrol Agent Pay.—Section 5550 of
- 9 title 5, United States Code, is amended—

1	(1) in subsection (a)(1), by inserting "agent"
2	after "applicable border patrol";
3	(2) in subsection (b)(1)—
4	(A) in subparagraph (A), by striking "Not
5	later than 30 days before the first day of each
6	year beginning after the date of enactment of
7	this section, a border patrol agent shall make
8	an election whether the border patrol agent
9	shall, for that year, be assigned to" and insert-
10	ing "Not later than December 1 of each year,
11	a border patrol agent shall make an election
12	whether the border patrol agent shall, for the
13	next annual period beginning on the first day of
14	the first pay period that commences on or after
15	January 1, be assigned to";
16	(B) in subparagraph (C), by striking "Not
17	later than 60 days before the first day of each
18	year beginning after the date of enactment of
19	this section" and inserting in its place "Not
20	later than November 1 of each year";
21	(C) in subparagraph (D)—
22	(i) by amending clause (iv) to read as
23	follows:
24	"(iv) a border patrol agent shall be
25	assigned a basic border patrol rate of pay

1	during the period of initial training (in-
2	cluding initial orientation sessions, basic
3	training, and other preparatory activities)
4	prior to the agent's first regular work as-
5	signment; and"; and
6	(ii) in clause (v), by striking "or the
7	level 2 border patrol rate of pay";
8	(D) in subparagraph (E)—
9	(i) in clause (i), by striking "or the
10	level 2 border patrol rate of pay";
11	(ii) in clause (ii), by striking "the
12	analysis conducted under section 2(e) of
13	the Border Patrol Agent Pay Reform Act
14	of 2014" and inserting in its place "a writ-
15	ten staffing analysis"; and
16	(iii) by adding at the end the fol-
17	lowing:
18	"(iv) Exclusion of certain em-
19	PLOYEES.—In applying any percentage
20	limit under clause (i) or (ii) to a location
21	population, U.S. Customs and Border Pro-
22	tection shall exclude from such population
23	any border patrol agent who is assigned a
24	basic border patrol rate of pay under sub-
25	paragraph (D)(iii) or (D)(iv) or who would

1	reach the premium pay cap under section
2	5547 if assigned a level 1 border patrol
3	rate of pay.
4	"(v) APPLICATION FREQUENCY.—The
5	10 percent limit under clause (i) or an al-
6	ternative percentage limit under a waiven
7	under clause (ii) shall be applied at the be-
8	ginning of the first pay period beginning
9	on or after January 1 each year."; and
10	(E) by striking subparagraph (G);
11	(3) in subsection $(b)(2)$ —
12	(A) by amending subparagraph (C)(i) to
13	read as follows:
14	"(i) any compensation under this sec-
15	tion or any other provision of law in addi-
16	tion to the compensation provided under
17	subparagraph (B); or';
18	(B) in subparagraph (E)—
19	(i) by striking "paid leave" and in-
20	serting "leave"; and
21	(ii) by striking "absent from work"
22	and inserting "excused from work";
23	(C) in subparagraph (F)(ii), by striking
24	"and";

L	(D)	by	amending	subparagraph	(G)	to
2	read as fo	ollow	VS:			

"(G) if the border patrol agent participates in a full day of advanced training but does not perform the entire required amount of scheduled overtime work under subparagraph (A)(ii) on that day, the border patrol agent shall be deemed to have performed scheduled overtime work during nonwork periods to the extent necessary to reach the required amount, but such deemed credit may be applied to no more than 180 hours in a calendar year; otherwise, the agent shall accrue a debt of hours for scheduled overtime not worked on such a day; and"; and

(E) by adding at the end the following:

"(H) a border patrol agent may choose to reduce any debt of obligated overtime hours that the agent has incurred by applying any accrued compensatory time off for travel pursuant to section 5550b, and such compensatory time off for travel may be applied towards such debt only after other forms of overtime or earned compensatory time credited to the border patrol agent have been exhausted.";

(4) in subsection (b)(3)—

1	(A) by amending subparagraph (C)(i) to
2	read as follows:
3	"(i) any compensation under this sec-
4	tion or any other provision of law in addi-
5	tion to the compensation provided under
6	subparagraph (B); or";
7	(B) in subparagraph (E), by striking "paid
8	leave" and inserting "leave";
9	(C) in subparagraph (F)(ii), by striking
10	"and";
11	(D) by amending subparagraph (G) to
12	read as follows:
13	"(G) if the border patrol agent participates
14	in a full day of advanced training but does not
15	perform the entire required amount of sched-
16	uled overtime work under subparagraph (A)(ii)
17	on that day, the border patrol agent shall be
18	deemed to have performed scheduled overtime
19	work during nonwork periods to the extent nec-
20	essary to reach the required amount, but such
21	deemed credit may be applied to no more than
22	90 hours in a calendar year; otherwise, the
23	agent shall accrue a debt of hours for scheduled
24	overtime not worked on such a day; and"; and
25	(E) by adding at the end the following:

"(H) a border patrol agent may choose to reduce any debt of obligated overtime hours that the agent has incurred by applying any ac-crued compensatory time off for travel pursuant to section 5550b; such compensatory time off for travel may be applied towards such debt only after other forms of overtime or earned compensatory time credited to the border patrol agent have been exhausted.";

(5) by amending subsection (d) to read as follows:

"(d) TREATMENT AS BASIC PAY.—

"(1) IN GENERAL.—Any overtime supplement in addition to the basic border patrol rate of pay for a border patrol agent resulting from application of the level 1 border patrol rate of pay or the level 2 border patrol rate of pay shall be treated as part of basic pay only—

"(A) except as otherwise provided in paragraph (3), for purposes of the definitions in section 8331(3) and 8401(4) and the provisions in chapters 83 and 84 that rely on those definitions (consistent with section 8331(3)(I));

1	"(B) except as otherwise provided in para-
2	graph (3), for purposes of sections 5595(c) and
3	8704(c);
4	"(C) for the purpose of section 8114(e);
5	and
6	"(D) subject to paragraph (2) and any
7	limitation established under paragraph (3), any
8	other purpose that the Director of the Office of
9	Personnel Management may by regulation pre-
10	scribe.
11	"(2) Exclusions.—The overtime supplement
12	described in paragraph (1) shall not be treated as
13	part of basic pay for purposes not covered by that
14	paragraph, including the purposes of calculating—
15	"(A) overtime pay, night pay, Sunday pay,
16	or holiday pay under section 5542, 5545, or
17	5546;
18	"(B) locality-based comparability payments
19	under section 5304 or special rate supplements
20	under section 5305; or
21	"(C) cost-of-living allowances in nonforeign
22	areas under section 5941.
23	"(3) Limitations.—
24	"(A) In general.—During the control pe-
25	riod described in subparagraph (B), the amount

basic pay under paragraphs (1)(A) and (1)(B) may not exceed the amount derived by multiplying the border patrol agent's basic border patrol rate of pay by the percentage representing the agent's career average of assigned overtime supplement percentages (including 0 percent for periods of time during which no overtime supplement was payable). That career average percentage is computed without regard to the effect of the limitation on premium pay under section 5547, but the premium pay limitation remains applicable in determining the dollar amount of any overtime supplement computed using the career average percentage.

"(B) CONTROL PERIOD.—For the purposes of applying subparagraph (A), the control period described in this subparagraph is the period that begins 3 years before the date a border patrol agent will meet age and service requirements associated with entitlement to an immediate annuity and continues throughout the remainder of the individual's career as a border patrol agent.

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"(C) Assigned overtime supplement PERCENTAGES.—For the purpose of applying subparagraph (A), a border patrol agent's initial career average of assigned overtime supplement percentages is the average for the border patrol agent's career (excluding any period of initial training prior to the agent's first regular work assignment) prior to the beginning of the control period described in subparagraph (B). During such control period, the career average shall be recomputed at the end of each annual period (as described in subsection (b)(1)(A)). In computing such career average, any periods of service as a border patrol agent prior to the first day of the first pay period beginning on or after January 1, 2016, shall be included, and the agent's assigned overtime supplement during such periods shall be deemed to be 25 percent.

"(4) Annual leave payment.—For the purpose of computing an agent's lump-sum annual leave payment under section 5551 or 5552, the pay the agent is projected to receive shall include a deemed overtime supplement derived under this paragraph. Such overtime supplement shall be based on the

1 lower of the agent's actual overtime supplement per-2 centage in effect at separation or the average per-3 centage of the agent's overtime supplement over the 4 26 full biweekly pay periods immediately preceding 5 that separation, and shall not exceed the amount 6 that is or would be payable under the premium pay 7 limitation in section 5547.": 8 (6) in subsection (f)— 9 (A) in the heading of such subsection, by 10 striking "AND SUBSTITUTION OF HOURS" and 11 inserting "During Regular Time; Absences 12 DURING SCHEDULED OVERTIME"; and 13 (B) by adding at the end the following: 14 "(5) APPLICATION.— 15 "(A) Limitation on substitution.— 16 Notwithstanding paragraph (1), scheduled over-17 time (as described in paragraph (2)(A)(ii) or 18 (3)(A)(ii) of subsection (b)) may not be sub-19 stituted for leave without pay on a day when a 20 border patrol agent has a full day of leave with-21 out pay. 22 "(B) LEAVE WITHOUT PAY.—As provided 23 in paragraphs (2)(A)(ii) and (3)(A)(ii) of sub-24 section (b), a border patrol agent shall incur no 25 scheduled overtime obligation on a day when

1	the agent has a full day of leave without pay.";
2	and
3	(7) by adding at the end the following:
4	"(h) ALTERNATIVE WORK SCHEDULES.—
5	"(1) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding any other
6	provision in this section or section 6101, U.S. Cus-
7	toms and Border Protection may assign a border pa-
8	trol agent an alternative work schedule as described
9	in this subsection, subject to any regulations pre-
10	scribed by the Director of the Office of Personnel
11	Management. No alternative work schedule may be
12	established under subchapter II of chapter 61.
13	"(2) Level 2 Border Patrol Agent.—A bor-
14	der patrol agent receiving a level 2 border patrol
15	rate of pay may, in lieu of the standard work sched-
16	ule described in subsection (b)(3)(A), be assigned to
17	an alternative work schedule under the following
18	terms and conditions:
19	"(A) The alternative work schedule shall
20	be a regular tour of duty consisting of 9 work-
21	days per biweekly pay period, with—
22	"(i) 8 workdays including 9 hours of
23	regular time per workday and 1 additional
24	hour of scheduled overtime for each day

1	the agent performs work during regular
2	time; and
3	"(ii) 1 workday including 8 hours of
4	regular time per workday and 2 additional
5	hours of scheduled overtime when the
6	agent performs work during such regular
7	time.
8	"(B) Subparagraphs (B) through (H) of
9	subsection (b)(3) shall continue to apply to an
10	agent assigned to an alternative work schedule
11	under this paragraph. References in this section
12	to regular time under subsection $(b)(3)(A)(i)$
13	and scheduled overtime under subsection
14	(b)(3)(A)(ii) shall be deemed to be references to
15	regular time and scheduled overtime described
16	in subparagraph (A), respectively.
17	"(3) Basic Border Patrol agent.—A border
18	patrol agent receiving a basic border patrol rate of
19	pay may, in lieu of the standard work schedule de-
20	scribed in subsection $(b)(4)(A)$, be assigned to an al-
21	ternative work schedule that is a regular tour of
22	duty consisting of 4 workdays per week with 10
23	hours of regular time per workday.
24	"(4) Sunday Pay; premium pay.—A border
25	patrol agent assigned to an alternative work sched-

1	ule under this subsection, may receive, as applica-
2	ble—
3	"(A) Sunday pay for no more than 8 hours
4	of regular time associated with a given Sunday
5	consistent with section 5546(a);
6	"(B) premium pay for work on a holiday
7	for no more than 8 hours of regular time asso-
8	ciated with a given holiday, consistent with sec-
9	tion 5546(b); and
10	"(C) basic pay for all regular time hours
11	that qualify for holiday time off pay when an
12	agent is relieved or prevented from working
13	during such regular time on a day designated
14	as a holiday by Federal statute or Executive
15	order.
16	"(5) Application.—For purposes of admin-
17	istering sections 6303(a), 6304, 6307(a) and (d)
18	6323, 6326, 6327, and 8339(m), in the case of an
19	employee assigned to an alternative work schedule
20	under this subsection, references to a day or work-
21	day (or to multiples or parts thereof) contained in
22	such sections shall be considered to be references to
23	8 hours (or to the respective multiples or parts

thereof).

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1	"(i) REGULATIONS.—The Director of the Office of
2	Personnel Management shall promulgate regulations to
3	carry out this section, including regulations governing—
4	"(1) elections and assignments of a border pa-
5	trol rate of pay for newly hired border patrol agents
6	who complete initial training during an annual pe-
7	riod;
8	"(2) situations in which an agent receives more
9	than one type of border patrol rate of pay in a bi-
10	weekly pay period or is employed as a border patrol
11	agent for only part of a biweekly pay period; and
12	"(3) the treatment of hours that are substituted
13	for nonpay status hours during regular time.".
14	(b) Overtime Rates.—Section 5542(g)(5) of title
15	5, United States Code, is amended—
16	(1) in subparagraph (A), by striking "leave
17	year" and inserting "an annual period, as described
18	in section $5550(b)(1)(A)$ "; and
19	(2) by amending subparagraph (E) to read as
20	follows:
21	"(E) shall not receive credit towards com-
22	putation of the border patrol agent's annuity
23	based on unused compensatory time off; and".
24	(c) Premium Pay Cap.—Section 5547(c) of title 5,
25	United States Code, is amended by inserting after "duty,"

- 1 the following: "or to border patrol agents who receive an
- 2 overtime supplement for overtime hours within their reg-
- 3 ular tour of duty under section 5550,".
- 4 (d) Basic Pay for Retirement.—Section
- 5 8331(3)(I) of title 5, United States Code, is amended by
- 6 adding before the semicolon at the end the following: ",
- 7 subject to the limitation prescribed in section 5550(d)(3)".
- 8 (e) SCHEDULED OVERTIME WORK.—Section 2(c)(2)
- 9 of the Border Patrol Agent Pay Reform Act of 2014 (Pub-
- 10 lie Law 113–277) is amended by inserting after "sched-
- 11 uled overtime work" the following: "(other than scheduled
- 12 overtime work within the regular tour of duty)".
- 13 SEC. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE.
- 14 The amendments made by section 2 shall take effect
- 15 on the first day of the first pay period beginning on or
- 16 after the day that is 90 days after the date of the enact-
- 17 ment of this Act.

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
