#### A BILL

To amend the Homeland Security Act of 2002 to reauthorize the Border Enforcement Security Task Force program within the Department of Homeland Security, and for other purposes.

1	Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2	tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
3	SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
4	This Act may be cited as the "Border Enforcement Se-
5	curity Task Force Reauthorization Act of 2017".
6	SEC. 2. MODIFIED INSTRUCTIONS.
7	(a) Updated Considerations for the Establish-
8	MENT OF UNITS.—Paragraph (2) of section 432(c) of the
9	Homeland Security Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C. 240(c)) is amend-
10	ed—
11	(1) in the matter preceding subparagraph (A),
12	by striking "the Secretary shall consider" and insert-
13	ing "the Secretary shall apply risk-based criteria that
14	takes into consideration"; and
15	(2) in subparagraph (A), by inserting before the
16	semicolon the following: ", including threats posed by
17	$transnational\ criminal\ organizations";$
18	(3) in subparagraph (C), by striking "and" after
19	the semicolon;
20	(4) in subparagraph (D), by striking the period
21	at the end and inserting ";"; and
22	(5) by adding at the end the following new sub-
23	paragraphs:
24	"(E) the extent to which the BEST unit
25	would advance the Department's homeland and

1	border security strategic priorities and related
2	$objectives;\ and$
3	"(F) whether departmental Joint Task
4	Force operations as established pursuant to sec-
5	tion 708 and other joint cross-border initiatives
6	would be enhanced, improved, or otherwise as-
7	sisted by the BEST unit to be established.".
8	(b) Port Security.—Subsection (c) of section 432 of
9	the Homeland Security Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C. 240) is
10	amended by adding at the end the following new paragraph:
11	"(4) Port security best units.—A BEST
12	unit established pursuant to paragraph (2) with a
13	port security nexus shall be composed of at least one
14	member of each of the following:
15	"(A) The Coast Guard Investigative Service.
16	``(B) The geographically-responsible Coast
17	Guard Sector Intelligence Office.".
18	(c) UPDATED REPORT ELEMENTS.—Subsection (e) of
19	section 432 of the Homeland Security Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C.
20	240) is amended to read as follows:
21	"(e) Report.—Not later than 180 days after the date
22	of the enactment of this section and annually thereafter for
23	the following five years, the Secretary shall submit to Con-
24	aress a report that includes the following:

- 1 "(1) A description of the effectiveness of BEST 2 in enhancing border security, disrupting and disman-3 tling transnational criminal organizations, and re-4 ducing drug trafficking, arms smuggling, illegal alien 5 trafficking and smuggling, violence, and kidnapping 6 along and across the international borders of the 7 United States, as measured by crime statistics, in-8 cluding violent deaths, incidents of violence, and 9 drug-related arrests.
  - "(2) An assessment of how BEST enhances information-sharing, including the dissemination of homeland security information, among Federal, State, local, tribal, and foreign law enforcement agencies.
  - "(3) A description of how BEST advances the Department's homeland and border security strategic priorities and effectiveness of BEST in achieving related objectives.
  - "(4) An assessment of BEST's joint operational efforts with departmental Joint Task Force operations established pursuant to section 708 and other joint cross-border initiatives.".

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
