  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

#### **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Protecting Civil Em-

5 ployment for Our National Guard Act".

## 6 SEC. 2. UNPAID LEAVE FOR STATE ACTIVE DUTY SERVICE.

7 Section 6323 of title 5, United States Code, is8 amended by adding at the end the following:

"(e)(1) An employee as defined by section 2105 or
an individual employed by the government of the District
of Columbia, permanent or temporary indefinite, who is
a member of the National Guard, as described in section
101 of title 32, and on State active duty shall be granted
leave without pay for each day of such duty.

7 "(2) Any such employee or individual may substitute
8 any annual or sick leave accrued or accumulated by such
9 employee or individual for any leave provided under para10 graph (1).

- 11 "(3) In this section—
- "(A) the term 'State' means any of the 50
  States, the District of Columbia, the Commonwealth
  of Puerto Rico, and a territory of the United States;
  and
- 16 "(B) the term 'State active duty' means—
- 17 "(i) duty performed by a member of the
  18 National Guard under orders issued by the
  19 chief executive of a State in accordance with
  20 the laws of that State; and
- 21 "(ii) does not include duty performed
  22 under title 10 or 32.".
