A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Housing – Community Development Program Act – Funding**

3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Administrator of a certain abandoned property fund to
4 distribute certain funds to the Community Development Program Fund under
5 certain circumstances; altering the contents of the Community Development
6 Program Fund; repealing certain provisions providing for the construction of the
7 Community Development Program Act; and generally relating to the Community
8 Development Program Act.

25 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
26 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article – Commercial Law

17–317.

(a) (1) All funds received under this title, including the proceeds of the sale of abandoned property under § 17–316 of this subtitle, shall be credited by the Administrator to a special fund. The Administrator shall retain in the special fund at the end of each fiscal year, from the proceeds received, an amount not to exceed \$50,000, from which sum the Administrator shall pay any claim allowed under this title.

(2) After deducting all costs incurred in administering this title from the remaining net funds the Administrator shall distribute:

(I) \$2,000,000 to the Maryland Legal Services Corporation Fund established under § 11–402 of the Human Services Article; AND

(II) **\$5,000,000 TO THE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM FUND ESTABLISHED UNDER § 6–606 OF THE HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT ARTICLE.**

(3) (i) Subject to subparagraph (ii) of this paragraph, the Administrator shall distribute all unclaimed money from judgments of restitution under Title 11, Subtitle 6 of the Criminal Procedure Article to the State Victims of Crime Fund established under § 11–916 of the Criminal Procedure Article to assist victims of crimes and delinquent acts to protect the victims' rights as provided by law.

(ii) If a victim entitled to restitution that has been treated as abandoned property under § 11–614 of the Criminal Procedure Article is located after the money has been distributed under this paragraph, the Administrator shall reduce the next distribution to the State Victims of Crime Fund by the amount recovered by the victim.

(4) After making the distributions required under paragraphs (2) and (3) of this subsection, the Administrator shall distribute the remaining net funds not retained under paragraph (1) of this subsection to the General Fund of the State.

(b) Before making the distribution, the Administrator shall record the name and last known address, if any, of the owners of funds so distributed and the type of property which the funds distributed represent. The record shall be available for public inspection during reasonable business hours by any person who claims a legal interest in any property held by the Administrator, provided that the person gives prior notice to the Administrator.

Article – Housing and Community Development

6–606.

(a) There is a Community Development Fund.

(b) The purpose of the Fund is to provide financial assistance for community development projects and community development organizations around the State.

(c) The Department shall administer the Fund with the assistance of the Board.

(d) (1) The Fund is a special, nonlapsing fund that is not subject to § 7–302 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.

(2) The State Treasurer shall hold the Fund separately, and the Comptroller shall account for the Fund.

(e) The Fund consists of:

(1) money appropriated in the State budget to the Fund;

(2) ANY MONEY DISTRIBUTED TO THE FUND UNDER § 17–317 OF THE COMMERCIAL LAW ARTICLE; and

[(2)] (3) any other money from any other source accepted for the benefit of the Fund.

(f) The Fund may be used only for:

(1) administrative expenses of the Department in administering the Program; and

(2) financial assistance for community development projects and community development organizations as provided under § 6–607 of this subtitle.

(g) (1) The State Treasurer shall invest the money of the Fund in the same manner as other State money may be invested.

(2) Any interest earnings of the Fund shall be credited to the General Fund of the State.

(h) Expenditures from the Fund may be made only in accordance with the State budget.

(i) Money expended from the Fund for the Program is supplemental to and is not intended to take the place of funding that otherwise would be appropriated for the Program.
